But then there struck the lightning of rifle fire on the campus at Kent State, with four students dead. The four dead students may not have been involved in anything except spectator curiosity. It made a difference in the national reaction, we are afraid, that they were white students.

The shooting at Kent State was the fateful flash of flame into the flammable condition already created by the decision to invade Cambodia.

By coincidence, the knockout is witnessed by a famous New Parkhurst, who immediately writes a column arguing that Matilda has taken over the middleweight crown. For a while few people take

THE SHATTERED DREAM by Gene Smith. Morrow. \$6.95. This book's subtitle is "Herbert Hoover and the Great Depression." But that is not quite indicative. It is about Hoover's term in the White House the stock market crash of 1929 the beginnings of the Depression and the election campaign of

It is Smith's thesis that Hoo ver was the last example of the long American dream that an ambitious boy from a poor family can rise to the heights of wealth and power, in Horatio Alger style. He postulates the idea that rugged individualism ended with Hoover, but offers no evidence on that point. There is a good bit of material here on the personalities and the atmosphere of the late 1920s and early 1930s, giving the book an aura of historical reality.

The author depicts Hoover as the Great Engineer who made a fortune and then turned public administrator in the major food relief programs in Europe during and after World War I. He also depicts him as an aloof, humoriess man whom the politicians of his own party disliked. and as an inept chief executive incapable of comprehending what was happening when the

Yet Smith's treatment of the Hoover story is basically sym-pathetic, a sort of explanation that Hoover was a well meaning man who became a tragic fig-ure. He is less sympathetic in his delineaton of Franklin D. who lived through the period
