Bombs Blast Tourist Strip In San Juan

The first bomb went off in the Condado Hotel drug store and the second in the gift shop of the same hotel, according to Rivera. The third bomb exploded in the Corner drug store on Ashford avenue.

It ought to be getting close to time to reverse and revolutionizing all our concepts about railroads, which would mean putting the real control where the money comes from, which is from the taxpayers, and which would mean making quality of service arbitrarily the first goal of railroad operation from now on, no matter what the cost. In short, it is about time we began subsidizing the public necessity and convenience instead of allowing further downgrading into shabbier and shabbier bankruptcies.

By his own admission, confirmed by the researchers of reporter Jay Levin, Demmerle represented a radical. In fact, he was so disaffected a figure of political madness that he became known as "Prince Crazy" in the advanced East Village set. His painted makeup, Day-Glo helmet and street prancing evoked the seditious judgment that he was a political exhibitionist.

It has survived both the touch of the scoundrels who have tried to wrap themselves in it, proclaiming their own patriotism, and the attempted defilement of those who desperate formula for preparing for a tomorrow attempt to strike, first, at what may have been best in our yesterday.

In spite of such abuse from two extremes, it continues to unite us. It unites us in our particularly American vision of a merging of separate localities, interests and traditions into one federal sovereignty, a vision which, so long as we can keep it working for ourselves, seems inevitably to present a pattern which the whole world must some day follow.

The soldier whose heart starts marching when he sees it coming down the street, the dreamer who sees in its ripples a bright hope for all mankind, the reformer who sees in it the means to make his full promise come true, the conservative who clings to the promise it has already kept, all belong to it. And it works for it together, ever closer and closer to that equal unity the Stars and Stripes themselves symbolize.

### Wonders of the Universe Water on the Moon

Where does one look for water on the moon? This question has been thrust into prominence during the past year because of the analysis of the rocks returned by Apollo 11 and 12, making it unlikely that in the area scooped by these two spacecraft there are water-bearing rocks.

Another indication of the lack of free water is the selenium-sulfur "ringing" of the moon's surface. The selenium-sulfur stage of the Apollo 11 Lunar Module and the "third stage" of the Saturn 5 booster. If water were present beneath the surface, the ringing should have been dampened out in a relative short period of time.

Some scientists studying the Lunar Orbiter photographs have concluded that vast amounts of water have existed on the moon in the past. They point to the silicate rills coating over the surface as evidence that at one time water flowed through them. In some places it appears that the water has been drawn off into holes in the surface.

Another bit of striking evidence is the great Alpine Valley. On photographs taken by the Lunar Orbiter this valley, some 60 miles long and from three to six miles in width, looks much like the Grand Canyon. There are steep walls with a flat floor and meandering through the floor is a deep rill or furrow that looks very much like the trench of the Colorado River, minus its water. While NASA's Dr. O'Keefe believes we should look for water in the Alphaeus eruption Kogevy took spectrograms on which was discovered the water molecule of carbon. Some evidence indicates that the triatomic carbon molecule may also have been present. In the Ariarachus region Kogevy found spectrographic lines which could only represent the hydrogen molecule.

Scientists agree that the presence of hydrogen almost conclusively indicates the presence of water. Hydrogen is the most plentiful element in the universe and lunar oxygen is quite abundant with fully half the surface material being oxygen in the form of oxides. The elements of water are common in the form of water which may exist in crystallization in the rocks. However, many scientists insist that water is present in the form of ice. Some water would probably derive from rocks heated to high temperatures, perhaps by radioactivity, as in the case of the meteorite which was broken up into hydrogen and oxygen. ## Liza Stays Cool

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — The late Judy Garland knew emotional torment, but her daughter Liza Minnelli remains calm amid show business pressure.

There was last week in a recording studio for example. Thirty musicians rehearsed for Liza's first television special while she listened from the podium to learn the arrangements.

The orchestra couldn't get quite the slurred, comic effect the conductor wanted. The director called suggestions over the intercom. Tension was building.

In tight blue jeans and pullover black sweater, Liza perched on a high stool, chomping gum. She jumped down, leaned her elbows on the conductor's music stand, then embraced him and kissed his cheek-in midpassage.

"Take five," Dick DeBenedictis told his players, and during the break he explained Liza's clowning: "I think she realizes there's so much pressure for everybody she tries to release it."

But Liza herself calls her have-fun quality "wafting."

"Wafting is such a hard thing to describe. It means goin' along and havin' a good time and not really getting uptight about anything."

"Because it's not worth it. You really don't have time."

"I try to observe enough so that I realize this too will pass if I'm going through a bad situation."

Such as her recent separation from Australian composer Peter Allen after three years of marriage? "Oh, I don't want to talk about that."

The all-musical special, "Liza," airing June 29 on NBC, will recall a half-century of show business.

Liza's producer-director, Steve Binder, agreed that she takes things calmly. "but that's part of being professional. Panic I find in people of insecurity and unpreparedness."

"When she gives in a rehearsal it all comes out. A lot of per-

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Later this month, those Americans injected to an outburst of nostalgia as the result of a summer television series saluting the "Happy Days" of the 1930s and 1940s.

Happy Days? In a couple of decades that included the worst depression and biggest war of American history?

Anyway, that's the name of the CBS show that replaces Jim Nabors for the warm months and it will reprise the comedy of the 1930-40 period with such funny men as Louis Nye, Chuck McCann and Bob and Ray.

"Happy Days" will also feature the musical sounds of those years with such figures as Duke Ellington, Harry James, Tex Beneke, Buddy Rich, Lionel Hampton, Bob and Ray Eberle, Helen Forrest and Helen O'Connell.

I met with Miss O'Connell the other day and was reassured to find her just as pertly beautiful as when she was singing her off-boat duets with Bob Eberle in the Jimmy Dorsey band. I asked her about her early life as a band singer. Were they really such happy days?

"Oh, they were exciting—and great experience," she remarked. "When you sang with a band, you did everything—you played ballrooms and theaters, radio and movies; you learned to work from scripts; it was a wonderful lesson in dealing with the public."

"It was hard work, but I was young then and I didn't mind. The Money? My first band job paid \$30 a week. I spent \$10 of it and sent the other half home to my mother in Toledo. "When

I sang with Jimmy, I was getting \$150 a week, and I paid for my gowns, hairdos, hotels, meals, everything but transportation. Sometimes we'd be paid for two jobs, such as when we did six shows a day at the Strand Theater in New York and played each night at a hotel.

"For records I got \$25, including 'Green Eyes,' which sold 3 1/2 million in the first version." Despite the long hours and short pay, Helen enjoyed the Dorsey band and even turned down movie offers to stay with it. After four years she decided it was time to retire and raise a family.

"Jimmy, who was a very shy person, refused to accept my explanation," she recalled. "He kept telling me, 'I don't like your attitude' and couldn't understand why I was leaving—even though I gave him a year's notice."

Helen quit in 1943, and she and her husband, sportsman Clifford Smith Jr., had three daughters. A second marriage to the late novelist, Tom Chalmers, produced a fourth daughter. Helen returned to her career in 1960 and has pursued it most of the time since. "I'm busier now than I have ever been—I'm on the road 9 to 10

months a year," she said. "I enjoy it more now that I have only one daughter left at home; she can join me some of the time."

For today's audiences she sings the necessary "Green Eyes," "Tangerine" and "Amapola," but she likes the recent tunes, too.

"Whatever I sing, I let the audience hear the words," she said. "I've never liked those singers who don't enunciate."
