news and the analysis about Japan, and they go together, into an old familiar, historic pattern.

The first thing is that negotiations between the United States and Japan, trying to get Japan to agree to voluntary restrictions on its export of textiles to the United States, have failed, leaving open the probability that our Congress will, sooner or later, resort to either tariffs or import quotas to shut down on Japanese trade here.

What this means is that our long post war orientation otward a possible free trade world is blowing up the moment it comes to its first sharp test, even though this test is with a nation with whom we have developed such friendship and cordiality as can only exist setween two former mortal enemies.

The second thing in the news and analysis about Japan is that, under the terms of the security treaty between the United States and Japan, now that it has passed its first 10 year anniversary, either nation can free itself for its own military destiny by simply giving a 12-months notice to the other.

As this era of free option for Japan arrives, speculation is that Japan, mething fabulous, and therefore finding itself forced to seek areas to become its customers, is beginning to turn both nationalistic and militaristic in its own moods, and may soon be found making the old traditional pairing between economic expansion in the world

and military power preparedness. These two trends together could take Japan, and the United States, and the world, back to the same conditions which existed, once before, when Japan went hunting for markets, and the United States found itself standing in the

. If anything like this happens, who will be to blame? Will we, with clear conscience, assail the totalitarian aggression of the Japanese?

Not, at any rate, with completely clear and easy conscience.

For we have it on the record that when General Douglas MacArthur handed Japan that constitution in which Japan renounced the right to wage war, and the right to maintain an armed esablishment as such, he himself, that famous warrior, said that such a system represented the only true security for Japan, and must come, in future days, to be the true security for other

nations, too. And we have it on the record that, in spite of that, we were the ones who began the first subtle encouragements to Japan to start inching its way back into the military way of life."

Meanwhile, we ourselves were using Japanese soil and resource for those same purposes of war we had once permaded Japan to renounce. Let's, for the moment,

marize things this way: Both we and Japan, against our own best advice to ourselves, are still caught in the same kind of fateful world web we were in when we fought each other.

If defeated totalitarian Japan has not been able to cure itself, or keep itself out of that same power behavior pattern, neither has victorious, democratic America. There have been words and gestures. There have even been actions on the hopeful, different side, as with -the wars the world has succeeded in stopping, or in wars the United States has learned not to try to press toward the "victory" which always kicks the whole cycle off again .But the continuing, unrelenting, and traditional pull on

the policies and decisions of men and nations is toward the mistakes that have been committed over and over and over throughout history, even though we all know, or ought to know, that the next mistake might be the last.
