# Priests Shed Roman Collar For Turtle-necks and Slacks

NEW YORK (AP) — When a bishop urged the spring meeting of the nation's Roman Catholic Bishops to reassert the role of the clergy in society, the bishops themselves were wearing slacks and turtle-necks.

There was no reaction expressed at the meeting by Philip M. Harizan, New Orleans spokesman of the closed meeting.

The situation apparently was past the point of open discussion. In fact, the old rule of Catholic clerical garb is so commonly disregarded by many American priests today that it goes scarcely noticed.

It is cooler, many said the Rev. Thomas Straszny, a priest of the Diocese of New York, said he had seen a priest in a slacks and turtle-neck at a recent inter-denominational meeting in Rock Hill, Pa.

At virtually any religious gathering these days in which the Catholic clergy are present, there are nearly always some of them in various kinds of dress, ranging from turtle-neck knit shirts to string ties.

The sartorial switch for many Catholic clergy in public and in the classroom has come about as a result of the "lower the collar" movement, which has relaxed modes of habits for men.

By the late 1960's, the public apparel of the Catholic clergy in this country was almost invariably unbuttoned, a black suit and Roman collar.

"Give the collar back to the Roman Catholic priests," wrote the Rev. Robert J. McKeeney, a noted Catholic Biblical scholar, in a recent article in the magazine "The New Yorker."

The priest he now prefers a plain suit and tie from Lyon's. "I found the best way to handle the slacks is to stare right back," he adds. "But even then I wondered why the work of God should engage one in a duel of slacks."

Clerical garb, he says, contributes nothing to service of God. He says that the "unwanted and useless" of the slacks and tie, isolated by the slacks and tie, is a "net loss" and part of the present clergy "crisis of relevance."

"Nothing in the New Testament indicates there was any difference in status and position between the priest and the layman," he says. "But the modern priest does not have this community with those to whom he must speak."

Defenders of clerical garb insist it provides a tangible symbol of faith in an increasingly secular world. But critics say it also can be a mark of special privilege and sanctification that detaches from a man's real humanity.

In the sanctuary, priests still adhere to the prescribed vestments. But in other activities, such as academic functions, theological conferences and social gatherings, some are apt to show up in slacks.

The pattern varies, in different dioceses, according to policies of bishops and priests. While the more variable garb nowadays sometimes brings complaints from the Evangelical Union, the "tradition" of Roman collar and dark suit in this country actually is less than a century old.

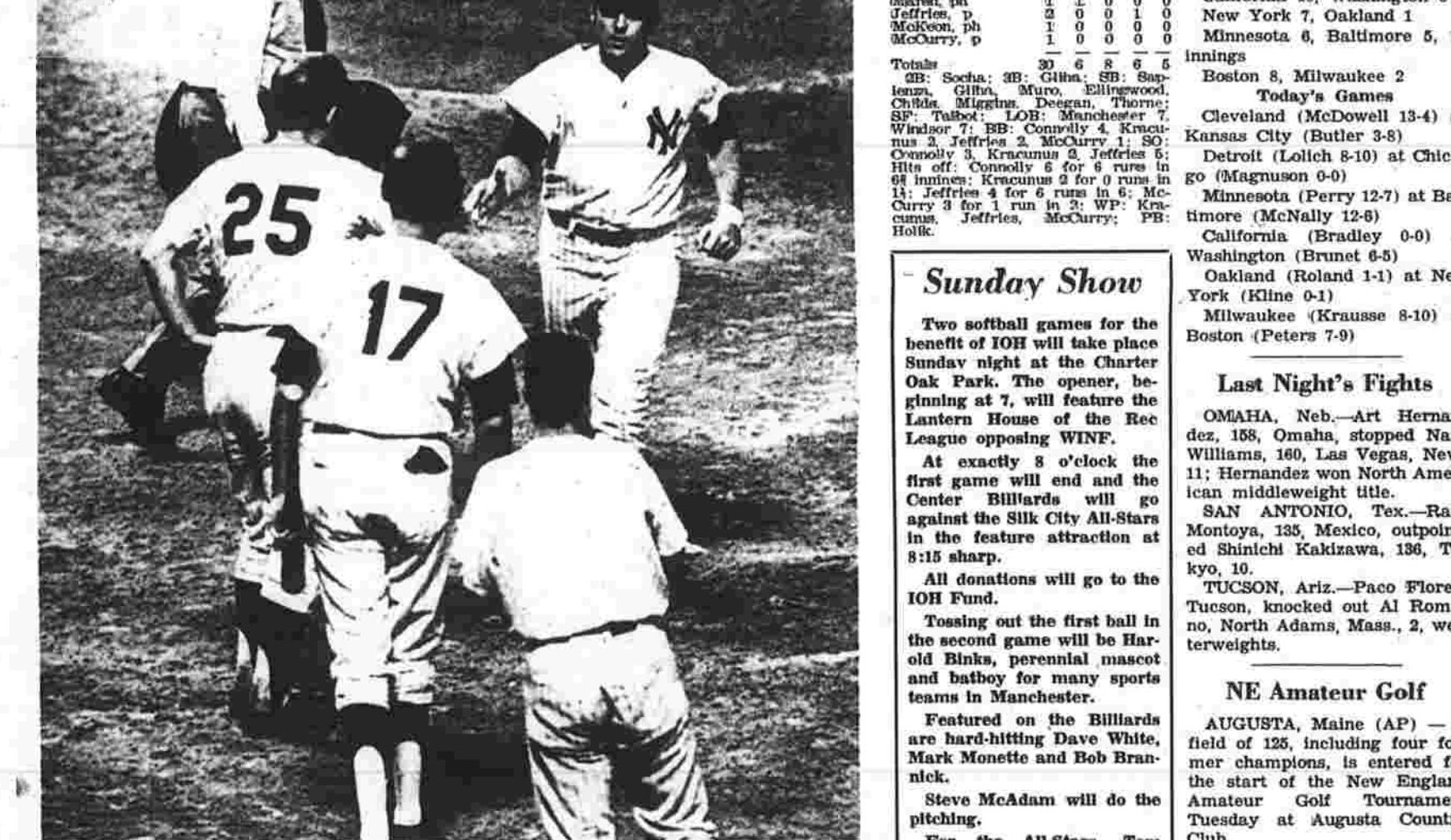

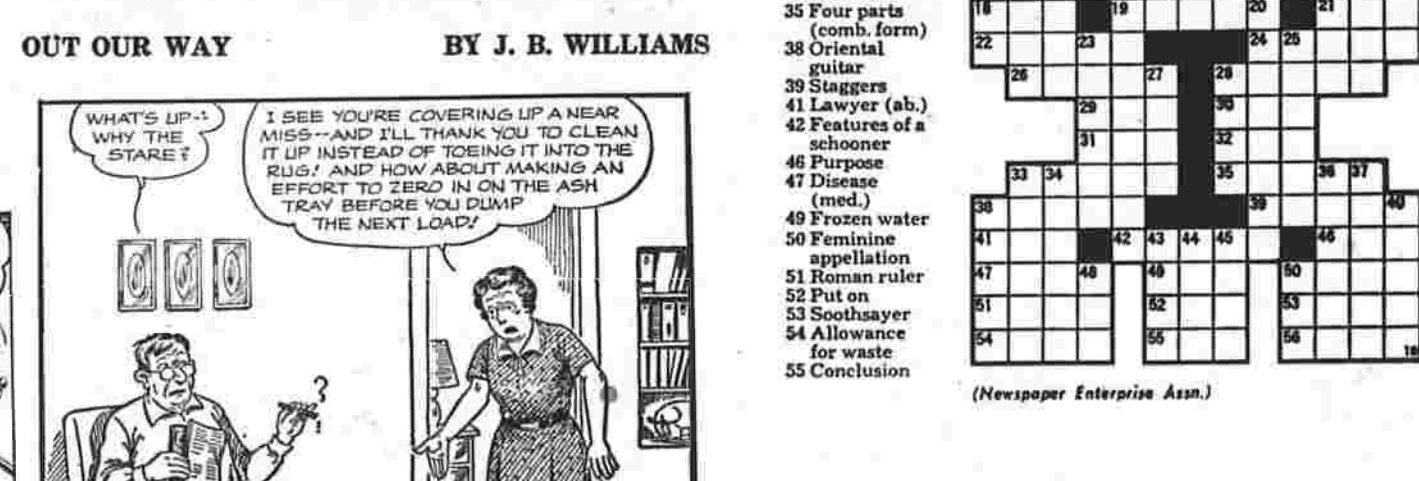

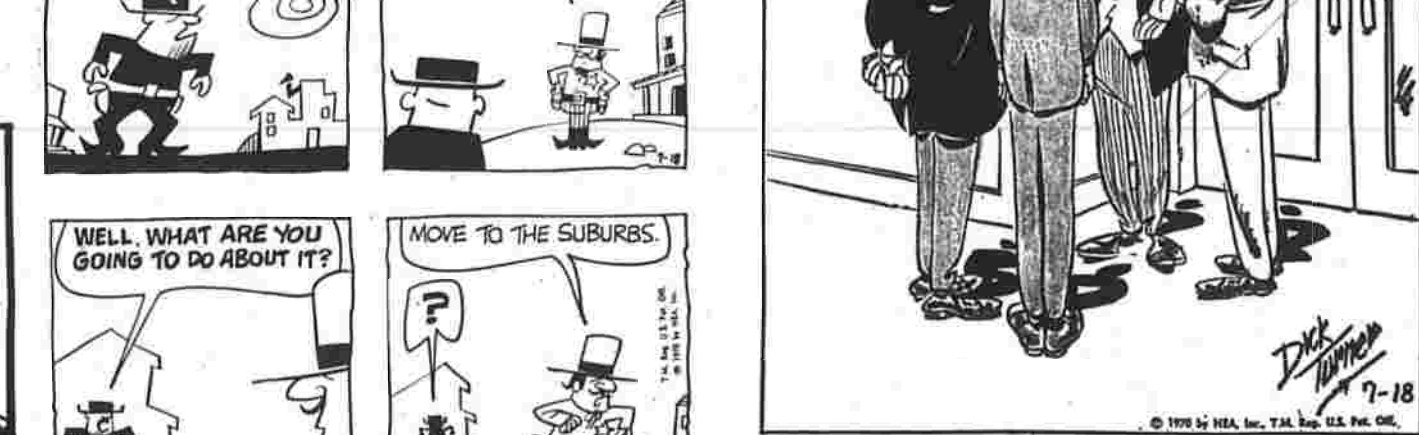

**Through the Catskills**

**See the Sleepy Gateway**

Has anyone not heard of the Catskills? The Catskills, discovered by the Dutch and noted for their rustic, natural beauty, might still be a closed area, unknown and unappreciated to anyone outside its ranges, but for Washington Irving who immortalized a fictional character known as Rip Van Winkle. Time was when a traveler from Connecticut chose to go to the White Mountains of New Hampshire, or the Green Mountains of Vermont.

But with the advent of improved highways and advertising, and perhaps an increasing desire among many to see where Rip slept for 20 years, there has been a growing number of Connecticut license plates observed during the past decade.

... the direction of the Catskills

It is my pleasure to introduce to you from time to time some of the less publicized attractions which may appear as sufficient reason for a day's journey, or more, in the direction of the Catskills.

By the way of introduction — how did they get their name? A popular theory is that the name is of Dutch origin. Early explorers found the mountains to be largely inhabited by wild cats and the bay lynx. The Dutch word for cat is "katt." The Dutch word for creek, or stream, is "kill." There are many of these mountain streams, and so the name Katskills, or Kauterskills, or Catskills has become indelible on maps.

Not to be ignored, however, is another theory which recognizes a Jacob Cats, an early Dutch poet whose name and fame can be found in libraries today. He was a chief magistrate and finally appointed to the Keeper of the Great Seal of Holland. With countless creeks in the mountainous region bordering the Hudson River to be named, it is conceivable that the Dutch poet was so honored as to have one named for him; thus, Cats' Kill, which name spread throughout the mountains.

Of the two theories, most people prefer the first. For the hiker, camper, sight seer, or casual tourist, there is a wealth of inexpensive, often free, pleasure within a few hours of Manchester.

For the easiest and most scenic route to the gateway of the Catskills, which is the Rip Van Winkle Bridge at Hudson, follow Rt. 44 out of Hartford through Avon and Winsted. At Canaan, turn north on Rt. 7. Just past "The Meadows" outside Sheffield, Mass. (This is a good sized roadside refreshment stand that serves succulent Texas wieners) turn left onto connector road to Rt. 23.

Antique hounds will have a hard time getting through Egremont, Mass. Shops vie with one another on either side of the road before and beyond the village limits.

At Claverack, N.Y., you'll have only a short ride to the bridge. This would also be the best route to the Catskill Game Farm.

... take along a picnic lunch

For the travelers who are making a one-day trip and plan to take a picnic lunch, I would suggest, for something different, the delightful area constructed for this purpose under the Rip Van Winkle Bridge at the west

end. Turn off just past the toll booth. You can see it if you look to the left as you cross the bridge. Freshly painted picnic tables and lounge chairs under shade trees make a pleasant place to relax. You may see one of the many foreign freighters which travel the river as far north as Albany. Or a yacht, or speed boat. No need to fear for the kiddies falling in — there's a sturdy wire fence. In succeeding articles, I'll tell you about "Olana," a castle built by Frederick Church, a famous artist of the Hudson River school; about the Bronx house in Coxsack, of great interest to those curious about the early Dutch settlers; of a replica of a Ukrainian church and a Greek church patterned after the Parthenon; of hiking trails with views that defy descriptions, and occasionally, of an eating place worthy of special mention.

**Strike Averted At Daily News**

NEW YORK (AP) — A tentative agreement on wage increases has averted a strike threatened by mailers at the Daily News. Labor mediator Theodore W. Kheel announced the tentative settlement Friday, minutes after a 5 p.m. strike deadline set by members of the New York Mailers Union No. 6.

"We have reached an agreement in principle that meets the needs of the mailers and it's not on a percentage concept," said George McDonald, president of the union.

Details of the settlement were not immediately announced. The mailers had sought a wage increase equal in cash to those achieved by the New York Typo-

graphical Union No. 6 earlier this year. The printers currently receive about \$17 more a week than the mailers.

Eight other unions have yet to reach contract settlements with the city's four major daily newspapers.

The New York Times had said it would shutdown too, if the News were struck. Kheel had indicated the strike might have spread to the other members of the New York Publishers Association—the Post and the Long Island Press.

The printers received salary increases of \$76.99 over a three-year contract period, or 41.69 per cent above current rates.

The mailers now receive \$167.67 a week for day work. The percentage increase would have meant about \$7 less in weekly increases.

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The founder of Operation Moral Up grade says the 9,000-member national organization is going out of business because of weariness and discouragement.

Marion Newkirk, the wife of a retired broadcasting executive, sent out a final bulletin Friday to members of 43 states.

She said the organization was founded 10 years ago with 16 members to oppose "filth and scum"—especially in movies.

Mrs. Newkirk said this year's Academy Awards were a bit too annoying and killed the hope that "good people of the industry" would "rise in righteous wrath against those who were using this medium for profit."

## Mini-Midi Battle Leaves TV Out on a Limb

NEW YORK (AP) — The hemline revolution, still in progress, has created some special problems for the women in television, now making programs that will not be seen by the public for three to nine months.

Fashion arbiters have decreed that skirts must fall to mid-calf, a point beyond which even the most modified mini can be lengthened. Many women are protesting.

But the TV star who is betting that the new mid-calf look will prevail—and who loses the bet—could wind up in the nation's

living rooms next December resembling the heroine of a World War II flick. And if the forces of change prevail, the glamorous creature still showing thigh or even knee is likely to look as dated as a Stutz Bearcat.

That is the dilemma. It would appear on the basis of an informal survey that television stars are as divided on the ultimate outcome as housewives.

It seems, however, that the midi, in general, is being resisted while the modified mini—reaching the knee or vicinity—is next season's most popular length, for TV purposes, anyway.

Here is what some stars say

they will be wearing on their shows next season.

Doris Day—"I'm sticking to two or three inches above the knee as I did last season. No midis. Floor length for dress up and maxicoats."

Elizabeth Montgomery of "Bewitched"—"my dresses will definitely not be midi and they will be above the knee. Unless, of course, there is a special script situation."

Lucille Ball—"I'll continue to wear skirts just a shade above the knee. No midis. Pants for home and lots of suits."

Carol Burnett—"Lower hemlines, but no midis, I hate them. Hems to the knee or maybe a

little longer. Also lots of dress-up pants and floor length glam-or gowns."

Florence Henderson of "The Brady Bunch"—"certainly no midis. When you are five feet eight and over, yes. When you are five feet four, no, no, no. I hold to the modified mini."

The midi has some friends in high places, however.

Diahann Carroll of "Julia"—"I'll be wearing midis on an occasional date. Personally, I like them but only for casual wear and only when they are cut on the bias and are clingy and feminine. I like midi coats with boots—feet are not the most attractive part of the anat-

omy and I don't think spindly ankles sticking out below a long costume is attractive."

Mario Thomas of "That Girl"—"I'll be wearing several hemlines—seven inches from the floor, 15 inches from the floor. I'll wear some minis, too—very high with over-the-knee boots. I think anything goes in a time of change."

Dinah Shore, returning to television with a day-time show, seems to be the only star with unqualified enthusiasm for the midi look.

"I have some midi dresses and I happen to like them. And, like them or not, men are going to have to get used to them."

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — If you think the situation comedies are becoming less funny, you are partially right.

Only a few of the new comedies premiering in the fall can be classified as pure escapism. Like the trend in drama, many are searching for relevancy and are sacrificing some of the laughs.

Nowhere is this more true than in the return of Andy Griffith, who plays the headmaster of a private school in his new CBS show, "Headmaster."

Aaron Ruben, who created the show and is the producer, admits that as recently as last year Andy probably would have returned in a format similar to his old show, which continues as "Mayberry, R.F.D."

"Andy and I felt we'd done

that show 10 years ago," he said. "We didn't want to duplicate it. And with what's happened in the past 10 years we felt we would be remiss if we didn't talk about it."

"We'd always done comedy drama before, but the drama consisted of the husband forgetting his wedding anniversary. Now it's a kid ready to kill himself."

During a rehearsal for an outdoor scene at the school, Andy expressed a similar view. "I wouldn't want to go back and do the same thing. Certain things are still applicable. The way we play the comedy is in the same low key."

Ruben said, "We decided on the educational arena because that's where the turmoil and action is and we wanted to really talk about it and not pussyfoot around, not create stories in the old situation comedy mold."

The first script Ruben wrote for the show is about a well intentioned, but misguided father who drives his son to the limit of suicide by trying to get him into a major college. "The father pushed the kid and he just

couldn't make it," he said.

He showed the script to Robert D. Wood, president of the CBS television network, and got a go-ahead for a series. "I told him, look, we want to do other stories on the drug scene, sex education, student militancy, a scholarship black student with guilt feelings about abandoning his community."

Ruben, who said he does not think he could have done the show without ABC's "Room 222" clearing the way, said Wood "was willing to go along with us. This is a somewhat new show—but we're not discovering America."

Asked if the criticism of "Gomer Pyle," which he created, had something to do with his wanting to do a show more in tune with the times, Ruben said, "I'm sure that would have something to do with it. That was escapism. I'm not putting down what I did in the past, but, listen, I'm just as much to blame for not doing meaningful, relevant shows. We could have tried this 10 years ago. It might not have been accepted, but we could have tried."

### TOURNEY WINNER

William Demarest, the crusty Uncle Charley of "My Three Sons" on the CBS Television Network, recently won the president's cup in a golf tournament at the Canyon Country Club in Palm Springs, Calif. He and Mrs. Demarest also finished second in the annual Guys and Dolls tournament there. The Demarest home faces the 13th hole of the course, but Demarest, who at 78 has more years than the course has par strokes, says it's not unlucky.
