than 300 patients!

That Presence In Asia

It now appears, from the transcript of a background briefing the California White House, and its high officials in residence there, gave West Coast newspapermen the other day, that the Nixon Administration not only believes in the continued necessity of "an American presence in Asia," but also has found a new reason for it.

What made this a topic at the California White House briefing was the fact that, only a few hours before, Vice President Agnew had asserted our intention of maintaining a "presence in Asia" in language which recalled moments in which Secretary Rusk and President Johnson used to let the power politics sphere of influence cat out of the policy bag and admit that we were in Asia not to save the South Vietnamese, but to keep serving our own world interests, which were to see that the continent of Asia never united itself against us.

This is the typical language and logic of that great nation attitude which some unkind historians label imperialism. What the White House said, at this

West Coast briefing the other day, was that Vice President Agnew meant what he was saying, and was saying it for the Administration. But the White House also added some-

Our "presence" on the Asian mainland, seems especially important to our present President, the briefing said, because of his belief that a full-scale retreat by us might provoke a dramatic shift in Japan's internal politics, with unpleasant consequences for us and for others. In the President's reported anxiety, the idea is that if Japan concludes that the United States is no longer a force to be reckoned with in Asia, it may either decide to move forward to assume America's role in Asia, building up its own military machine again for the role, or it might join forces with the Communists and help them rule Asia against

Let this White House briefing, then, go down in the record as the first instance in which high American policy, after 25 years as Japan's friend, ally and protector, reverted to the business of conaldering Japan our possible rival and enemy again. Once the idea has been given one pub-

lic appearance, it can be relied upon to contribute a little poison to the way we, and Japan, and others evaluate future policy moves and decisions as we make them in the Asian area.

The high, disastrous folly of such concepts for national policies can be read in the history of the past. Speaking from the point of view of

dealism, the only safe and sane way for the United States to maintain a "presence" in Asia would be as a member of the United Nations and a supporter of United Nations programs for the enforcement of peace and the improvement of human welfare every-

The practical point is that while the idealistic thing, never having been tried, has a chance of working, the realistic approach, by which we still seek to serve our interests, has proved its results over and over again, by leading from one war to another and then to another. There may be, in the midst of so

much repetitiously doomed policy, some slow development of something different. People might, some day, refuse to pay the price.

Fickle Communities munities in the collective action sense are as fickle as individuals ever can be, and highway planners, in Connecticut and elsewhere, can be pardoned if they find the public's capacity to change its taste somewhat annoying. The other day, for instance, highway authorities held a public hearing on a proposed widening of an existing superhighway, and were greeted by a number of citizens who sounded as if they regretted ever having let the highway in question pass through their town.

Only a few years ago the main con cern of every such community seemed to be with making sure that the next superhighway to be built would come right through the particular town.

What has happened in the meantime has been partly a matter of disillusioning experience, partly a matter of the new concern with pollution. The superhighways have enhanced

some values, in a commercial sense, only by spoiling some other values, from e residential and livability point of view. They have brought noise and fumes, and even, on occasion, king-sized traffic jams such as the poor old roads of yesteryear never achieved. The result is that a community is jus

as likely to try to fight off an approach ing superhighway, today, as it was likely to campaign ardently to get it, only a few years ago. Yesterday's blessing has become, for some, today's blight. And this widespread reversal of taste has taken place so swiftly highway department planning boards couldn't possibly be expected to have adjusted to it. Again and again, offering what everybody was campaigning hard to get yesterday, the highwaymen are going to find nobody seems to want it now.

We don't see how they can really be held to blame. They would have been willing enough, we imagine, to plan superhighways that served communities without invading them, if our communities had known, then, that was what they

come, how it runs wild, how it lacks respect for its elders, how it questions society's traditional values, and so forth. Eld would do much better to ask itself how the conditions arose which either permitted or encouraged any segment of outh to act as it does. But for many that question would be too embarrassing

But let us look at the facts, ask the questions, and see what we find. Was it youth which permitted a gradual breakdown in parental authority as more and more parents thrashed witlessly about and failed to give their children the moral and intellectual guidance, the wise discipline, the practical love which the young both wish for and need? Was it youth which increasingly turned from moral and spiritual values in the rampage for material possessions? Was it youth which permitted public entertainment (television, literature, movies, the theater) to degenerate into libertinage Was it youth which failed to tackle adequately the problems of race injustice economic inequality, the environment's pollution? Was it youth which again and again went to bloody war? Was it really youth which invented permissiveness Of course, the answer to every one of those questions is a categoric nay. This does not mean that youth did not unwisely and heedlessly seize upon the opportunities for wrong and silly actions which their elders gave them. They did. But as these columns have pointed out before, young folks will ever test their elders' reactions, to see how much they

NEW DELHI (AP) — A girl from Kerala state says she worked "like a slave from morning 'til evening washing wards and patients in a mental nine months at an Italian convent, a New Delhi newspaper reported today. Anna Thomas Elakkattu told the Statesman that the Rev. Cy-riac Puthenpura promised her she would be trained in medicine

ecome a nurse but even a doc-

But "there was no teaching, no education, only this slavery of washing floors and patients in the mental hospital throughout the day," the paper quoted her as saying in an interview.

The Indian government im-pounded Father Puthenpura's passport Friday pending an investigation of charges that he and other Roman Catholic officials profited from sending 1,200 novices to European convents. The Church has denied the allegations, saying the convents paid only travel expenses for

the girls.

Miss Elakkattu at her home, a
thatched hut in a village 10 miles from Father Puthenpura's Nirmala Bhavan Seculrare In-stitue in Etturmanur, Kerala, in southwest India.

She told the newspaper she protested about her duties at the convent of the Sisters of Divine Providence Inguidonia, nea Rome, and was told that at least 800 had been paid for her.

#### Viet Veteran **Back Home** ARCADIA, Fla. (AP) - Walter Martin, the 15-year-old adventurer who twice went to

15-Year-Old

Vietnam and was twice wounded despite Army claims he never officially became a soldier, arrived early today at his home here and went to sleep.

A coconut cake and a mother with tear-reddened eyes and a spruced up hairdo waited for Martin in this southwest Florida community when he arrived, hitching the last 100 miles with a reporter. Martin, dressed in a white tee

shirt and dungarees, had arrived at Tampa International Airport at 12:35 a.m. after the long journey from Ft. Carson where his masquerade ended. The boy, whose travels began at age 12, had been charged briefly with fraud for fooling the Army but charges were dis-missed in Colorado Springs Friday afternoon.
"He's tired, has a headache and does not want to be disturbed," said a relative when Martin got to his brother's apartment here.
