There were 30 seats to be filled. Candidates for these seats were organized into slates of 10 each. There were 16 slates in all running, with three slates to be selected.

That was the procedure. The three slates elected included a slate of anti-government Buddhists, and two Roman Catholic slates, one considered definitely pro-government, the oth-

Buddhists may represent a change in their own political policy more than any change in the view of the electorate. They have, in the past, boycotted the elections, as a kind of protest against the way in which the country's Catholic minority, with only 10 per cent of the population, have been holding almost monopolistic control of the Saigon gov-

ernment. This time the Buddhists decid ed to run, and their victory brings a new factor of opposition inside the government itself. The new election of 20 antigovernment Senators need hot, however, disturb the government's basic control of the Senate, in matters where such control is important. There do not seem to be many such matters; the Senate in Saigon seems to have been born with some of that powerlessness the Senate in Washington fears it is beginning to ac-

ate elections seems to have caused considerable excitement in Saigon. And it should be welcome in this country, too, as a sign of instinctive political life in a country we hope to be protecting for its own chance at governing itself. Our natural instinct is to guess that

lections in such countries still so far from ever caring very much about a mode of government called democracy are really elections that have been rigged one way or another. Indeed, some suspicious people in Saigon think we Americans may have rigged this one, in order to introduce some pliability into the Saigon government's attitude toward peace negotiations.

It does not seem a result anybody could have rigged or arranged. It may contribute something to the pliability of the Thieu government.
