



For long years, it has been apparen that the decisive votes in any election were in the middle, right and left of center. The intense growth of the suburbs has greatly reinforced these centris tendencies. The 1970 census is expected to show that 35 percent of all Americans live in the suburbs of metropolitan areas. More of them live in the suburbs than in the central cities. In the great in-

The decisive political role of the sub urbs might indeed increase emotional divisions between the suburbs and the central cities. But the well-being of the two cannot really be separated. Many of the suburbanites are economically bound to the core areas. They work there, draw responsibility by fleeing to the suburbs. And in any case, they will be swiftly followed by the upward-moving elements from the central cities. So it always has been in the intensely mobile American

The suburbs are certainly centrist. Their dwellers have a perceived stake in the country and the system, in stability in the status quo. They own a piece of their own homes. They are middle class Once they were believed to be predominantly Republican. Recent voting results in some areas shake this conclusion. Suburbs are increasingly fluid in political allegiance.

to be elected in the face of the hostility suburban moderates. Any Southern strategy which sacrificed the centrism of the suburbs would fall. It is highly improbable that any Republican could be elected president without carrying a certain number of industrial states, such as Pennsylvania, Ohio, or Illinois.

The so-called backlash against various pressures, notably the thrust of blacks, would only get a certain distance in the suburbs, moved as they are by caution, moderation, and a degree of social liber-

Moreover, the suburbs are responsive to antiwar feeling. It is their children who are active on campuses, who seek to take part in the political process, who do cool to old-fashioned machine politics. They respond to the "new politics" of cleancut candidates, unaffiliated with bosses and entrenched organirations, projecting attractive, issueriented television campaigns.

The suburbs are responsive to the need for law and order, but they also are responsive to the need for justice. There could readily come about a meeting of emotions and minds between the suburban vote and the closely related, overlapping "hard hat" or "blue shirt" vote. The line between middle-class suburbs and union-member working people is ineasingly difficult to draw. Between them, obviously, they constitute a strong majority. The working-class Americans also have a big stake in stability, tran-

### Informative 90 Seconds Pays Off

NEW YORK (AP) - What can you do in 90 seconds? For one thing, you can give children a lively and informative view of the world around them.

As every parent knows, few things on television catch the attention of children as fast as a commercial. And the commercial makers have learned to pack a lot of information into the spots.

Five times each Saturdaymorning CBS will present "In the Know," which liberally borrows techniques from the commercials for a fast-paced look at subjects ranging from glass blowing to volcanoes to windmills to space, "In the Know" premiers Sept. 12,

Producer Joel Heller picked most of the subjects himself, although there was a little consultation with his 8-year-old daugh-

The result is a series of minidocumentaries that are informative and also show the things other children are doing. Such as a program at St. Helen's Parish School in Newbury, Ohio, where the pupils ride unicycles between classes and at play.

"We got a lot of letters from a school where the teacher had heard about the series and asked her pupils to put down what they wanted to see," Heller said. "The similarity to what we picked is uncarmy.'

"In the Know" combines animation with film, and Heller said the CBS News cameramen were delighted with the assignments allowing them to be more creative than a breaking news story usually does.
