

Bonding Priorities

A month ago Manchester's Board of Directors undertook to determine for Manchester voters what bonding proposals those voters should be called on to decide at the Nov. 3 election. In some respects the results of decisions were puzzling immediately after the directors acted. Since then a separate source of puzzlement has arisen.

A \$1,996,000 proposal for improvements to schools won unanimous approval. The directors accepted the need

On other proposals there was considerable division of opinion, partly along party lines but not entirely.

One of the plans that failed was a bond issue of \$1.1 million (reduced from \$2 million) for improvements to the town's water system. The improvements involved were among those suggested in a report by Griswold Engineering which made an extensive study of the water problem and concluded there is a certain degree of urgency in making improvements, although there is no imminent catastrophe.

the water item before the voters now, some apparently thought it should wait until April and some felt the improvements should be financed from current

Since then the directors have voted to raise the water rates, and the April referendum or complete "pay-as-yougo" appear to be options at the moment.

The directors at that meeting a month ago decided to put before the voters a \$3,605,000 question about the construction and reconstruction of roads, the largest of the bond issues before them. The need to replace bad roads with good ones and avoid recurring and often fruitless naintenance has been made clear.

People ride along roads. They can readily see - and feel - when a road has been improved. Nobody notices an approvement in water supply or distribution as long as an adequate gush of water comes out of the faucet in his home. Almost everyone in town needs to use roads; many in Manchester do not use the services of the town's water system at all, although it is obvious that the existence of and the adequacy of a publicly-owned water supply is an advantage to everyone.

These differences in the two problems constitute reasons why as a matter of good politics and maybe good public service, the road question should take perference over the water improve-

(The near-crisis over water supply for the Cheney complex was a bit unnerving, nevertheless.)

It could be argued, too, that it is less practical to undertake road work under 'pay-as-you-go' than it is to handle water improvements that way.

Despite all those considerations, the proportions are puzzling. The scoreboard appears to read: Roads, \$3.6 million -Water, nothing.

Wouldn't some kind of split in that \$3.6 million have been justified? If the town is going to pay to borrow money, a start on the water work would be

In any event, other possibilities are open and in the coming months the water mprovement proposals must not be allowed to lapse because of lack of ap-

The other source of puzzlement in the

bond matter was the existance on the agenda of a question that is rather minor in financial terms. It involved a \$136,000 expenditure for improvements to Robertson Park. It was rejected unanimous-

It did not seem to fit into the idea of what should be paid for by bonding. In fact it almst seems to have been put before the directors as something to re-

It became apparent in retrospect that the chief proponents of the plan to improve Robertson Park did not themselves, see the proposal as one which should be financed by bonding. The members of the Park and Recreation Commission had in mind, instead, working it up into a five-year program and asking the directors to accept it as a capital improvements budget item.

The commission chairman is now t find out how the alternate financing plan

The outcome in not serious, of course. The plan can still be considered on its merits and, if approved, financed by whatever means is best. But it does seem as though townspeople who want to keep themselves informed and make intelligent decisions should be spared any unnecessary confusion.

PUBLIC SAFETY

An examination of improving public safety in the United States begins with an understanding of what police do, what they shouldn't do, and the kinds of in creased costs and wasted energies that are involved in the pursuit of defending, not the people, but a public morality that has come down to us over the years. A single statistic will make the point:

one out of every three arrests in America is for drunkenness, at a cost of \$100 million dollars for police time, court appearances and correctional procedures In Washington, D.C., during a nine month period, it was found that a special strike force organized to combat seriou crime, made 44 per cent of its arrests for drunkenness. And it hardly needs to be emphasized that such arrests neither cure nor prevent drunkenness, nor make any contribution to helping chronic

Probably the best concise precis of the whole problem is a recently published book, "The Honest Politician's Guide to Crime Control." Its foremost recommendation is that the number of crimes be reduced so that police can concentrate on what is important. The authors, Norval Morris and Gordon Hawkins both with impressive criminologist credentials, urge that drunkenness be removed as a crime, that gambling not be prevented by criminal law, that abortions be legalized, that the possession of drugs no longer be a crime (but that the behavior between consenting adults be permitted, and that juvenil courts retain jurisdiction over only those activities which would be criminal if the child was an adult. While some states have adopted some of these concepts in general, states have been unwilling to apply the valid test to all their laws, i.e., does a given form of action hurt anyone

Obviously, drunkenness would have to be treated as a medical problem, gamoling could either become the function of ernment-run lotteries, or a tax could paid by those operating such events, portion would be elected by the parents, and sex laws would be changed, as to a large degree they have been changed in Connecticut. The second part of crime solution involves not only a realization of what is pappening but also how to prevent it. Taken together, as Morris and Hawkins say, Murder's involving spouse killing spouse, parent killing child, other family illings, romantic triangles and other over's quarrels, and arguments among those previously acquainted with one an other account for about 80 per cent of all homicides in America." The second im portant figure is that 65 per cent of all illings are by use of a gun, whereas in England, where handguns especially are difficult to get, the homicide rate is seven or eight times lower. There is werwhelming evidence that handgun legislation, reducing ownership of such weapons to pistol clubs and policemen. and the registration of all firearms, would dramatically reduce the murder rate in the country. The handgun is the main weapon of the vicious impulse, and nfortunately too many people have such

Because only three per cent of knife assaults in the country are fatal, and only 1.7 of physical attacks, by hands fists, and feet are fatal, the dramatic aurvival rates could be attained, despite the murderous intent of the attacker with proper gun control. And because of he science of ballistics, it would be most difficult for murderers to escape detection if the marks made by their gun bar-

rels were instantly available to police.

While solutions to crime depend on other factors as well, which will be discussed in a third editorial tomorrow, we seek today to make only two points. It is hard to change human nature and hence we are wasting our time, and supporting organized crime by making such thing as gambling profitable (because it is illegal). Second, crime and vicious intent is endemic in the population, and hence just as making safer cars lowers the automobile death rate, so removing the means to murder would reduce the serious crimes that injure people, or kill them, either as the result of uncontrolled passion —the major cause of death —or because of criminal intent. - MIDDLE-
