Educational Utopia l another comprehensive study o education in the United States has come

orward and with it a general condemna-Learning is fun, it says, but schools are a horrible bore at best, an effective nteaching device at worst. The theme is now familiar, having been the cry for many years of the severest critics of the

education system. This study is a three-and-a-half-year effort commissioned by the Carnegie Corporation and carried out under Charles E. Silberman, a non-educator who has been familiar with teaching and

The report pulls no punches. It says,

"Our preoccupations with the urban crisis must not be permitted to blind us to the important, if less urgent, defects of public schools everywhere. In good measure, the defects and failures of the slum schools are but an exaggerated version of what's wrong with all schools. To be sure, the schools in middle class neighborhoods seem to do a better job of teaching the basic skills of literacy and computation, hence their students are better equipped to earn a living. But this "success" is due far less to the schools themselves than to what has been called "the hidden curriculum of the mid-

dle-class home." On the subject of training to earn a living the report says:

Education should prepare people not just to earn a living but to live a life- a creative, humane, and sensitive life. This means that a school must provide a liberal, humanizing education. And the purpose of liberal education must be, and indeed always has been, to educate educators - to turn out men and women who are capable of educating their families, their friends, their communities, and most importantly, themselves."

Thus the objectives of many reformers, whose approach is lauded in the report, are linked with some of the most traditional thought in education.

What the report recommends as a cure for the grim, joyless, atmosphere of the classroom is, generally speaking, the child-oriented, individualized instruction of an informal classroom in which the rigid lesson plan and its rigid

time schedule are abandoned. In this setup, problems of discipline and order would be fewer. "It is not the children who are disruptive,' says the report, "it is the formal class-

room that is disruptive - of childhood Freed from the overburdening problems of maintaining order, the teacher is free to teach each pupil, or rather to help each one learn, and learn to learn.

Thus far the recommendations follow the familiar ones of the most articulate recent reformers. They depart from those of certain reformers, however, in Adults would not abdicate the respon-

sibility for setting subject matter. "Some things are more important than others and adults have to make conscious choices about which is which," and guide children accordingly, Mr. Silberman concludes.

The danger of oversimplifying a report that took so long to develop and which runs to more than 500 pages is great. The book will be published Oct. 15. Everyone seriously interested in education will want to read it.

Meanwhile it may be profitable for some parents to dwell a while on the main points of the report.

Suppose, too, that the informal approaches suggested in the report would ndeed breathe life into learning. Most parents will realize that a spontaneous family discussion on some matter of intellectual interest is more rewarding to everyone involved than tutoring a child in his homework assignment, even given a knowledge of the subject and sound pedagogical instincts.
