





The walkout of "longline" employes continued today in five Connecticut towns. Representatives of the Communications Workers of America and the company met all day Tuesday and into the evening a company spokesman reported. He said negotiations would re-sume this afternoon in New York

On Tuesday morning, only four of the 112 day-shift long-line workers reported to their at AT&T facilities in Haven, Durham, Hartford, Cheshire and New London. Their walkout that began Monday was a show of sympathy for six employes suspended Friday when they failed to report for

work. The two-day suspensions were scheduled to begin Monday, a company spokesman said. On that day only a handful of the 125 nonmanagement long-line workers in the five towns showed up.

The strikers' job, maintaining the long-distance, private-line and overseas networks, is being done by management personnel
