By BOB THOMAS HoLLYWOOD (AP) -What's this-the movie studios suing the networks?
At firśt blush, it doesn't make sense. After all, the television networks are good customers of the film companles. All of them sell their ofd movies to televi sion, and most stadios
Yet last week seven of the biggest movie firms in the counagainst CBS and ABC on antitrust grounds.
The federal court suit sought or stop the two networks fro vesting in television entertainment and feature film pro grams. The crux of the issue ap pears to be that CBS and ABC have entered the field or making eature mover for to television.

Significantly, NBC was not a efendant. Except for nit ment in Boo hope NBE has not entered the feature film market.
"CBS and ABC are moving movies which will compete with the major companies $11 m$ in the television market," sald an nduatry source. ing from themselves.
"The government wouldn't let the film companies do that. Most of them owned theater chains in which they showed their own movies. But the Jus tice Departmentes divorce their theatera. So why should the networks be allowed to make and show their own films?
The networks deny that they are monopolistic in making feature films. Cas claimed the suit was "apparentiy an attemp period of economic distress.
Both networks have denied that they got into feature film malding for the purpose of supplying themselves with future programming. Their avowed panies and sell films to theater nt a time when product was in short supply.
Theater owners welcomed the move. The production compa nies did not. They tried to nudg networks on antitrust charges The government decifned Hence the civil suit, which ask for treble damages of an unspecified amount.
