### Will Food Make Peace?

been pleasantly willing to buy the appropriateness of a Nobel Prize for Peace to an agricultural scientist who was responsible for new crop strains which vastly increased humanity's capacity to feed itself.

The New York Times, commenting on the award to Dr. Norman E. Borlaug, acknowledged "the vital role of food in the world's search for peace." "Dr. Borlaug, as the prime mover in

the 'green revolution,' " said the chairman of the Norwegian prize committee, "has made it possible for the developing countries to break away from hunger and poverty."

"The world's population problem," said Dr. Borlaug himself, during a visit to Norway last summer, "is a monster which, unless tamed, will one day wipe from the earth's surface."

The connection between food peace rests on the supposition that hungry people are politically unstable and aggression-minded, which helps deliver them into the schemes of violent leaderthat well-fed populations, having no sharp pangs in their stomachs and no envious need to reach out and plunder other wealthier regions, are safely disposed toward peace and immune to the potential leadership of adventurous war-

We are no longer as certain of any such connection as we might have been in earlier days.

Now we are not sure that the instinct toward violence is not a virus which is just as strong in the privileged as in the underprivileged, in the well-fed as in the hungry, in the people who have everything as much as in the people who have next to nothing.

We tend, instead, toward admission of the possibility that the causes of violence, and the causes of war, may lie in human instinct and in human ideas rather than in territorial or material

It may be in the realm of feeling, hought and idea that our diet needs to have some miracle wrought.

Dr. Borlaug deserves recognition for his brilliant work. We hope it does promote the possibility of peace.

### The Failure Of Success

The travails of the nation's most successful magazines continue. At the moment, one of our most famous is trying frantically to reduce itself in size and circulation, and the owner of another isengaged in a process of selling off almost everything else he owns in the hope of being able to keep his pet giant publishing. And, over the past few years, other magazines which, to put it ironically, had grown so big and successful they had somehow lost the ability to operate profitably, have either disappeared from the scene or embarked upon arbitrary changes which may or may not be keeping them alive.

These failure-through-too-much-success stories are difficult to understand, and even more difficult to accept, for they go counter to the normal course of the

American dream.
