Just after Nixon had entered the Hilton Hotel, Agostinelli seized a Viet Cong flag from the grasp of a demonstrator, threw it to the ground and stomped on it. We all understand the importance of the right of dissent, but it is difficult for a patriotic American to tolerate the flag of a nation that is guilty of killing over 40,000 American soldiers.
