



Why Be So Stupid Forever?

In a sort of valedictory press conference the other day. General Lewis W. Walt, who is retiring in February, said his farewell to the Marines he commanded for two years in Vietnam, and his farewell to that war in Vietnam.

His farewell to the war itself consisted of might-have-beens. He regrets, now that he himself didn't appraise the guerrilla character of the war more accurately when he first went out. He regrets that the military didn't analyse the war better, both for its own strategy and for its information to the people back home. He regrets that the news media, which advanced so much in their coverage of this war, could not cover the kind of fighting - as of night - when the American fighting man was up against odds and performing heroically against bomb the ports of North Vietnam, and thus shut off some of the supplies which reached it by sea. He thinks that we might have shortened the war and frustrated the enemy's propagand scheme of influencing Americans at home into creating pressure for an American withdrawal.

In all of this General Walt is, obviously enough, the professional military man trying to rationalize and in a dignified way alibi what has happened in one

It is instinctively trying to deal with the danger that this particular war in Vietnam may wind up giving all war a

This fear - the fear that Vietnam may turn out to be the first war in history which has really discredited the institution of war in the minds and feelings of men everywhere - the fear that not only United States but war itself may be the big loser - is something that has to be lying close below the surface of the military mind. It has to be remember ed, incidentally, that the professional military were never the ones who wanted to go into Vietnam in the first place. Most of them knew and proclaimed in advance that this would be the wrong kind of war in the wrong kind of place. The crucial decisions for this war came academic minds who saw a chance to show how hard-boiled and practical they could be in the business of handling

The intellectuals who fathered this war have long since abandoned it, and some of them have even denounced it, and they have left the headache and the blame for the professional soldiers to

These professional soldiers, naturally enough, have an instinct to refurbish the extent of conceding that they can probably choose which wars to fight better than the academic braintrusters

In the main, though, one has to hope that it may be the whole institution of war which suffers a loss in prestige a loss so great that the day may come when no population, anywhere, will tolerate its use as an instrument of na-

It will be battery powered, with each of its four wheels driven by its own electric motor. It will be able to turn in less than 11 feet. It will have a healthy maximum speed of something just under 10 miles

Possibly, when the Lunokhod and the Lunar Rover have both been demonstrat ed some marriage of the more desirable features in both, perhaps the Russian use of solar power with the greater creature comfort of the American design, will give us what we have so long been waiting for - the quiet, pollutionless, safety- guaranteed get-about-vehicle for our routine transportation needs down

Perhaps whoever, if anybody, still owns the trademark on that once promising American automobile, the "Moon," will agree to its use when the moon-buggy gets ready for mass produc-
