Vernon November Building Permits Up From Last Year's Total

A total of 70 building permits totaling \$1,100,000 was issued this past month by Building Inspector Francis Mc-Nulty, as opposed to just 47 permits for the same month last year. The total estimated value of all this past month's permits was \$462,638 as opposed to \$192,097 last year.

Accounting for the largest amount last month was \$150,000 for additional costs of a three-story office building. Other permits issued, and their estimated values were: six new dwellings, \$112,000; one duplex dwelling, \$22,000; one six-family apartment building, \$100,000; one addition to a car parts building, \$18,000; one free standing ground sign \$4,000; installation of gas pumps, tanks and such, \$18,800.

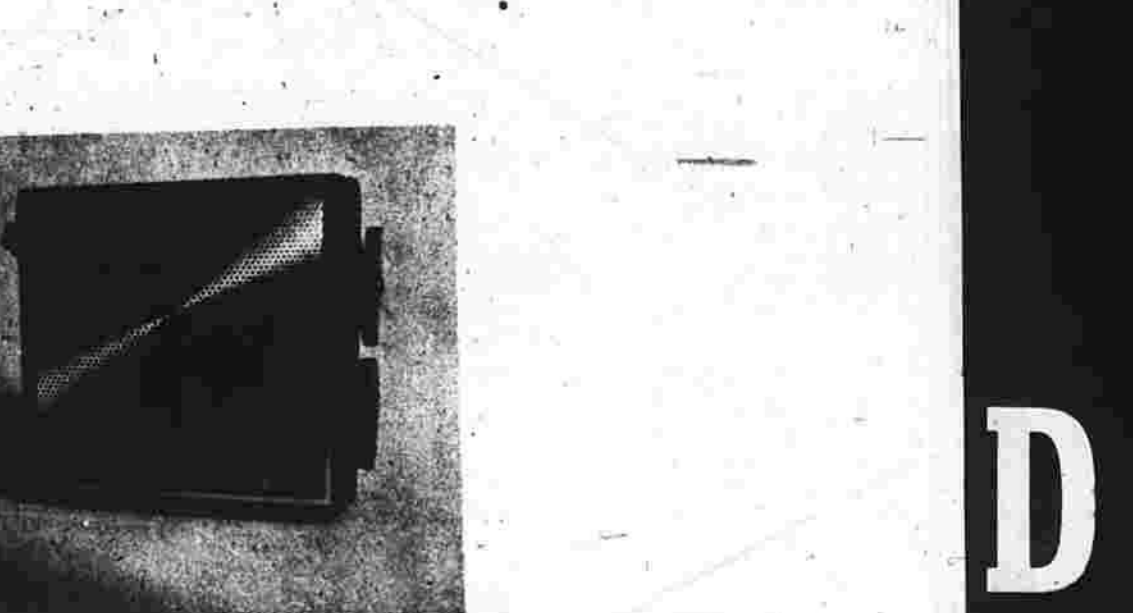

Power-Shy Britons Threaten Violence

By ROONEY PINDER

LONDON (AP) — Senior engineers today abandoned a plan to join 125,000 power plant workers in the go-slow pay battle spreading periodically throughout Britain for the fifth day.

"The public has had enough," said Harry Norton, general secretary of the Electrical Power Engineers' Association, the men who man the switches in power plant control rooms.

Norton said his union's 26,000 members will continue to work normally while pay talks continue. They had planned to join the slowdown Monday and increase the power shortage affecting British homes and industry.

Talks between management and the strikers were to resume today. But they were "talks about talks," an attempt to achieve a negotiating basis, and neither side held out hope of a quick settlement.

Milder weather this morning restricted power cuts to about one seventh of British homes and plants compared with one fifth Thursday. But the weather man predicted a cold snap tonight, threatening wider blackouts as more people turn on electric heaters.

Meanwhile, the public was getting more and more angry. Farmer Harold Ford said he sprayed it over the walls and ceiling of his house because of the "enormous inconvenience suffered."

Prime Minister Edward Heath insists that any offer above 10 per cent would stimulate inflation and it was doubtful the council would raise its offer more than 12.20. The unions are believed to want at least another 2.40.

Old Pets

PEORIA, Ill. (AP) — An Ohio veterinarian says older dogs have a 50 per cent better chance to survive surgery than was possible 10 years ago.

Dr. W. H. Craig, of Youngstown, spoke to members of the Mississippi Valley Veterinary Medical Association during a convention.

He said new developments in inhalation anesthesia are enabling him to do more operations on older pets which would have been unthinkable previously. The new anesthesia methods replace the old and very dangerous practices which depended on ether.

Craig estimates he treats about 6,000 dogs a year. He said the major problems today are congenital because more pure-bred dogs are being born.

Ships at Sea

NEW YORK (AP) — Walter Winchell is going to start writing a column again at the age of 73.

The column will appear three times a week in the new Daily Mirror, which begins publication Jan. 4.

Winchell wrote a Broadway column for 28 years for the old New York Mirror, which folded in 1968.

Robert W. Farrell, publisher of the new Mirror, announced at a news conference Thursday he had persuaded Winchell to sell his home in Phoenix and return to New York to produce the new column.

Police Corps Has Charms In Poland

By NICHOLAS LILJOS

WARSAW (AP) — An elite corps of 40 Polish police is armed with little more than whistles, winning ways and regulation moustaches. Each day the post-Polish moustache is into Warsaw's traffic to keep order.

The girls are spreading a plan to use more women in the Police Department. A recent battery of government tests indicated women could control the Polish capital's 110,000 motor vehicles "more gracefully and efficiently" than men.

"Girls cope much better with traffic incidents," says Maj. Jerzy Domanski, who commands 40 of the girls. "They are also faster at finding diplomatic solutions to problems."

Good looks figure high in selecting the girls. "They don't have to be beauty queens, but a gracious figure and an attractive face are necessary ingredients," said the head of the training school.

The young women are permitted to use any makeup or hairstyles they want, in order to look their best. They wear blue-gray uniforms with white epaulettes and wear boots.

Despite their charms, they can be tough. "You have to be firm and also know you are absolutely right with the offending motorist," says Nela Urbanska, one of the elite. "I have never yet had to argue with a driver. They usually give up fast, glad the fine isn't too high."

The standards of Polish drivers aren't very high, the girls believe. "They are not courteous to each other," one said. "I have yet to see a driver who, after making some slight infraction, is a man of a rule and disturbing another driver, would at least lift his hand in apology."

Just in case of an emergency, the girls carry small vials of tear gas. They don't carry pistols. Figures for road accidents in

decate the traffic department school certificate and know at least one foreign language. The girls are paid well, compared with the Polish average wage of 2,200 zloties or \$91 a month. Their starting salary is 2,800 zloties and they can earn up to 4,000 as officers.

"The other day I was on traffic duty when a driver noticed me," one of the girls recalled. "Starting me up and down, he crashed straight into the back of the car in front. I had to book him."

Another girl said she was on duty when this driver gets out of his car. Without any warning he holds me high up in his arms, hugging me and shouting congratulations. Then he puts me down and drives off, leaving me a bunch of carnations. I was too amazed to protest."

The girls go through 10 months of training in such matters as accident procedure, the use of radar traps and how to detect drunkenness and detect tax meters. Applicants must have a high

The Education Association of Conventry is going to challenge the Conventry Federation of Teachers in an election to determine which group will represent teachers in contract talks for the 1971-72 school year.

Some of the details were made public at last night's Board of Education meeting, at which the school board denied an EAC request that the American Arbitration Association run the election.

The executive committee of the EAC, which is affiliated with the Connecticut Education Association, was present at the session, as well as teacher representatives from three of the local schools. Also on hand was Everett Watson of the CEA.

Mrs. Dorothy Gilliam, spokesman for the EAC, presented the group's request for an outside agency to run the election. She noted that the CFT is not in agreement with the board.

In a prepared presentation for the board, Mrs. Gilliam outlined the three reasons why the EAC is seeking an outside agency. The first reason cited was legal. "The 1967 teacher representation election," Mrs. Gilliam said, "which was conducted in court and contested in court at expense and inconvenience to all parties concerned, including the Board of Education."

"This first attempt at this election was declared invalid in compliance with state statutes. Therefore, we request that the American Arbitration Association conduct the election because of the great expense of their experience with legal procedures and their reputed success in conducting elections of all types."

Cost Second Factor Cost was the second factor cited, with Mrs. Gilliam noting, "The EAC wishes to avoid a recurrence of the previous situation, and in particular, to keep all costs of the election at a minimum to the Board of Education and the Conventry; consequently, we recommend the American Arbitration Association."

"This organization has quoted the EAC that the cost of conducting the election is of a comparable size never exceeded \$200. This figure would compare favorably with the previous election's legal costs to the Board of Education, which exceeded \$500."

Acceptability was the third reason for the request. "The American Arbitration Association has conducted 88 per cent of Connecticut elections," Mrs. Gilliam said. "This agency is recognized, qualified, respected, and offers the assurance of impartiality and satisfaction to all parties."

Some of the details were made public at last night's Board of Education meeting, at which the school board denied an EAC request that the American Arbitration Association run the election.

The executive committee of the EAC, which is affiliated with the Connecticut Education Association, was present at the session, as well as teacher representatives from three of the local schools. Also on hand was Everett Watson of the CEA.

Mrs. Dorothy Gilliam, spokesman for the EAC, presented the group's request for an outside agency to run the election. She noted that the CFT is not in agreement with the board.

In a prepared presentation for the board, Mrs. Gilliam outlined the three reasons why the EAC is seeking an outside agency. The first reason cited was legal. "The 1967 teacher representation election," Mrs. Gilliam said, "which was conducted in court and contested in court at expense and inconvenience to all parties concerned, including the Board of Education."

"This first attempt at this election was declared invalid in compliance with state statutes. Therefore, we request that the American Arbitration Association conduct the election because of the great expense of their experience with legal procedures and their reputed success in conducting elections of all types."

Cost Second Factor Cost was the second factor cited, with Mrs. Gilliam noting, "The EAC wishes to avoid a recurrence of the previous situation, and in particular, to keep all costs of the election at a minimum to the Board of Education and the Conventry; consequently, we recommend the American Arbitration Association."

"This organization has quoted the EAC that the cost of conducting the election is of a comparable size never exceeded \$200. This figure would compare favorably with the previous election's legal costs to the Board of Education, which exceeded \$500."

Acceptability was the third reason for the request. "The American Arbitration Association has conducted 88 per cent of Connecticut elections," Mrs. Gilliam said. "This agency is recognized, qualified, respected, and offers the assurance of impartiality and satisfaction to all parties."

Teachers Forfeit Strike Salaries At West Haven

WEST HAVEN (AP) — Public school teachers who struck West Haven schools this fall have ended a three-month-old dispute with the school board by agreeing to give up any claim to their salaries for the 11 days they were on strike.

The teachers, members of the American Federation of Teachers, AFL-CIO, voted 207-118 Wednesday to reject a proposal submitted to the school board by their union, which would have forfeited eight days' pay and extended the school year by one day.

Under the union's proposal, which was put forth last week, the teachers also would have given up two days of personal leave. After the vote to reject their union's proposal, the teachers voted to accept wage deductions for the 11 days.

"I'm happy with it," Ralph DeMatteo, local union president, said of the action. He said he felt that making up the entire 11 days rather than the one day proposed would have been more beneficial to the children. School Board Chairman James A. Nugent called the teachers' action "a very strange and unusual behavior. It's hard to understand why they acted in this way."

"But, there is no question that the board is agreeable to what they have done," Nugent said adding that it would save the school system about \$75,000.

The new contract for the 1970-71 school year was expected to be signed this week. Nugent said the West Haven board hoped to begin talks on the following year's contract about Jan. 10.

Residents Voice Opposition To Realignment of Rt. 275

About 40 residents of Coventry and Mansfield turned out at a public hearing Thursday night, the feeling that the funds would be better spent in devising a system of mass transportation for the area. The main objections cited were possible air and water pollution (to Eagleville Lake and the Willimantic River) and the feeling that the funds should be better spent in devising a system of mass transportation for the area.

Also, representatives for some 85 petitioners noted that they are concerned about the possibility that Rt. 275 will eventually be cut through the south end of Coventry as a hook-up with the new Interstate Route 84, which is in late planning and early construction stages now.

State officials indicated that the plan to carry Rt. 275 down to the new road (it now stops at Rt. 31 in Coventry) has more or less been scrapped for the time being.

The principal reason for the realignment is to eliminate the hazard of two bridges now in existence, one over the Willimantic River, and one under the Central Vermont Railroad.

The proposed corridor location would start about 1200 feet southwest of Old Eagleville Rd. and would gradually swing to the south of existing Rt. 275 across Old Eagleville Rd. It then may have to cross the hillside, cross the river and the town, Bureau of Highways, 24 full.

13 Die, 34 Hurt In Rail Wreck In Portugal

LIBBON (AP) — At least 13 persons were killed and 34 injured in a train collision near Lisbon early today. A suburban train traveling at 60 miles an hour ran into another train which had stopped. Two cars were destroyed.

The spokesman for the railroad company, Elicardoso, said train bound for Oporto "had slowed down or stopped for unknown reasons" near the town of Sacaven, north of Lisbon. A suburban train running in the same direction, only a few minutes behind, rammed into its back.

"As the driver of the second train was among the dead, we cannot give any explanation for the accident at this stage," he said.

Witnesses said the second train went past a stop signal. They estimated its speed at impact at 60 miles an hour. A railway foreman who joined rescue workers who helped about 800 passengers from the wreckage said he believed the train driver "only realized another train was in front of him a few seconds before the crash and he had practically no time to use the brakes."

Two Men Sought In Gun Slaying Of Obstetrician

PROVIDENCE (AP) — Authorities said Thursday they have "a solid lead" in the search for two men sought in the killing of Dr. Charles Potter, but that no suspect is in custody.

Harry Goldstein, public safety commissioner, said police are searching for a specific suspect in the slaying of the 62-year-old Providence obstetrician and gynecologist who was shot to death in the parking lot of Lying-In Hospital Thursday morning.

Goldstein said numerous persons say two men fled from the parking lot after the shooting, and that they were brought to the police station to view police file photographs.

Capt. Vincent J. O'Connell, detective commander who is heading the investigation, said all detectives were kept on duty Thursday night. He said they canvassed the neighborhoods near the hospital and were seeking additional persons who may have seen the men.

Police said Potter was killed by one shot in the chest shortly after leaving his car in the parking lot, and that the assailants may have been seeking drugs.

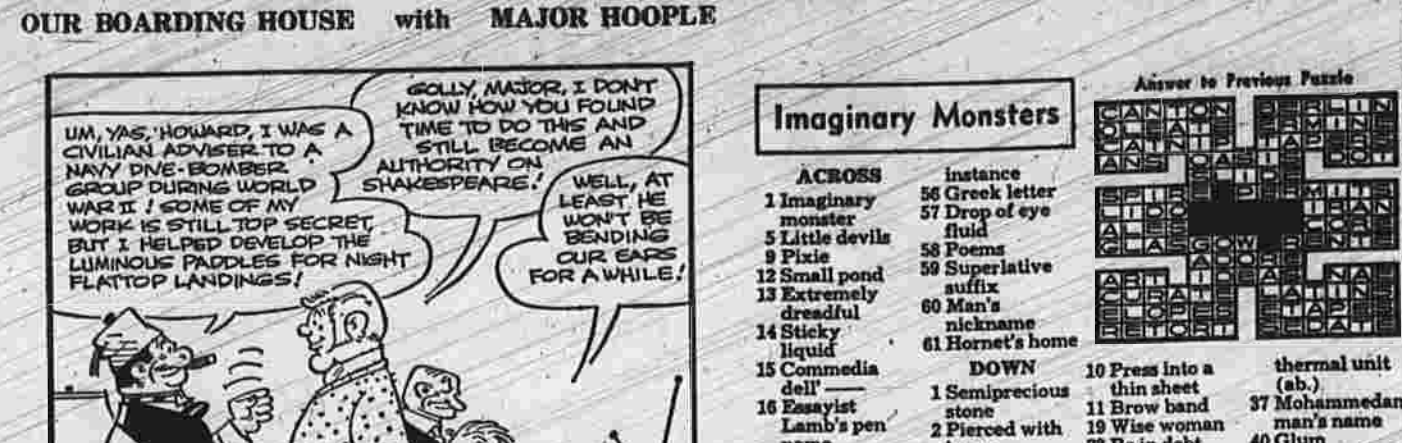

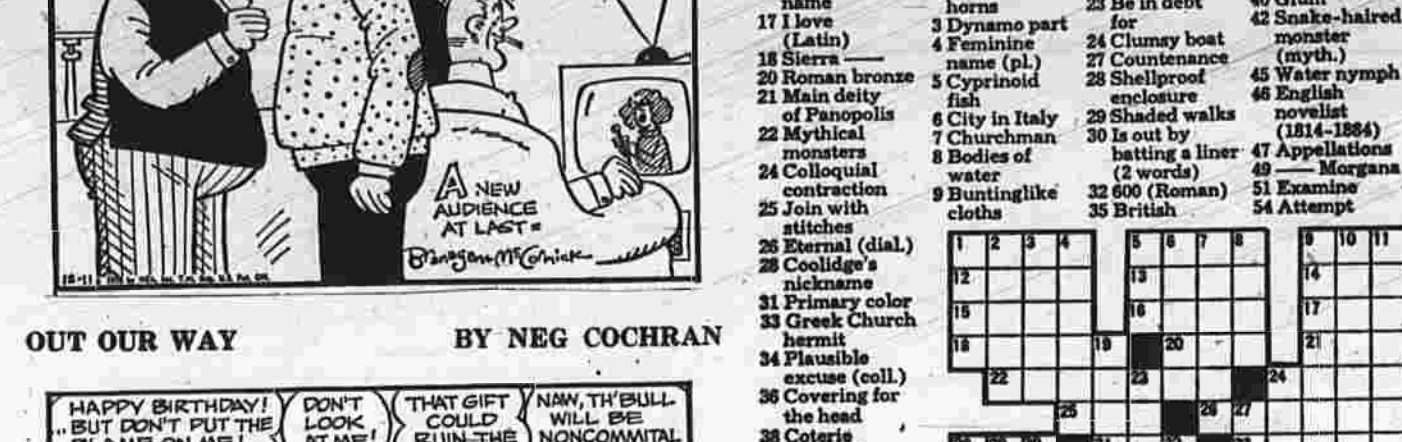

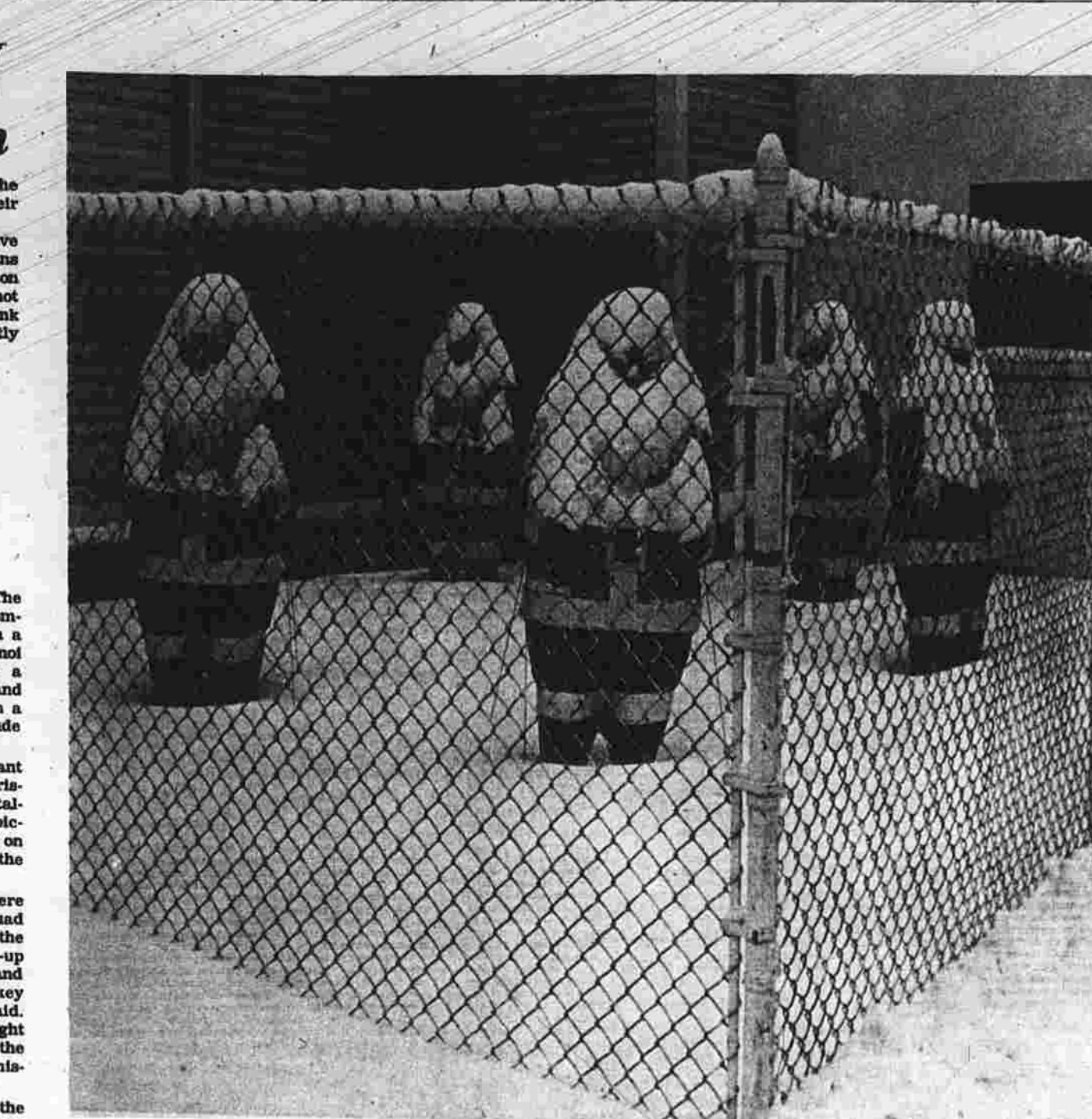
