The Threat To Re-Escalate

From Secretary of Defense Laird comes the most direct admission yet that the United States may resume the bombing of North Vietnam if it feels that the North Vietnamese are not negotiating in good faith at Paris.

From debate on the Senate floor has come the admission, even by those backing the provision which would pretend to forbid the use of American troops in Cambodia, that the President would still have the authority to undertake "precautionary actions" such as sending our troops into Cambodia to wipe out some potential threat to American troops back in South Vietnam.

committee on the same proposal for restricting the President's use of our troops there came, the other day,- the introduction of an amendment which would specifically authorize the President to order American troops into Cambodia, Laos or Thailand in action or actions "designed to promote the safe and orderly withdrawal or disengagement of U. The other eaction was one of relief that we had, at least, whatever might happen at Paris, given up the idea that we were going to bring the war to a conclusion by the open-ended and unlimited use of force for reprisal and punishment.

The only real decision in such an openended war has always had to lie not in Hanol, but in Peking or Moscow, both of whom, could, as has been demonstrated actually by their diplomacy so far, live with something of a stalemate in Vietnam, but neither of whom could realistically be counted upon to look the other way while we imposed anything like a total defeat on Hanoi:
