Dollar Unreliable Gauge For Measuring Economy

A nation. This week it is said to have reached \$1 trillion a year. Check your almanac and you will find that about 10 years ago the GNP was just a little more than half that figure, which suggests that in one decade the United States doubled its output.

It is the equivalent of printing different calibrations on their meters each year. It is illogical.

Nevertheless, we do gauge the size and vigor of the entire economy with an unreliable measure: Current dollars.

Nothing but a computer can say precisely what a current dollar is because its value changes by the minute. General make it comparable with the 1960 dollar, the 1970 dollar is worth less and less, the inevitable result of persistent inflation year after year.

Let us assume, merely to illustrate, that the 1970 GNP is closer to \$700 billion than \$1 trillion. If it is worth only 80 cents, the 1970 GNP is only \$560 billion. If it is worth only 70 cents, the 1970 GNP is only \$490 billion. If it is worth only 60 cents, the 1970 GNP is only \$420 billion. If it is worth only 50 cents, the 1970 GNP is only \$350 billion. If it is worth only 40 cents, the 1970 GNP is only \$280 billion. If it is worth only 30 cents, the 1970 GNP is only \$210 billion. If it is worth only 20 cents, the 1970 GNP is only \$140 billion. If it is worth only 10 cents, the 1970 GNP is only \$70 billion.

William O. Douglas not only proclaims his innocence of the kind of conduct which his foes had alleged was unworthy of the nation's highest court. The subcommittee even leans over in the other direction and credits Justice Douglas with an "off-bench" association with those who objected to his writing revolutionary theories or associating with characters possibly tainted in ideology or source of income.

What the subcommittee reports, as if it were a big positive message in Justice Douglas's favor, is that at least one of his off-bench activities and associations seems to have been something he undertook under the guidance and for the benefit of the Central Intelligence Agency.

Tuck Justice Douglas safely into the arms of the CIA, his support seems to have been, and you elevate him beyond all suspicion or criticism. We are, apparently, going to spread the heroic details of how Justice Douglas cooperated with the CIA during a visit to the Dominican Republic.

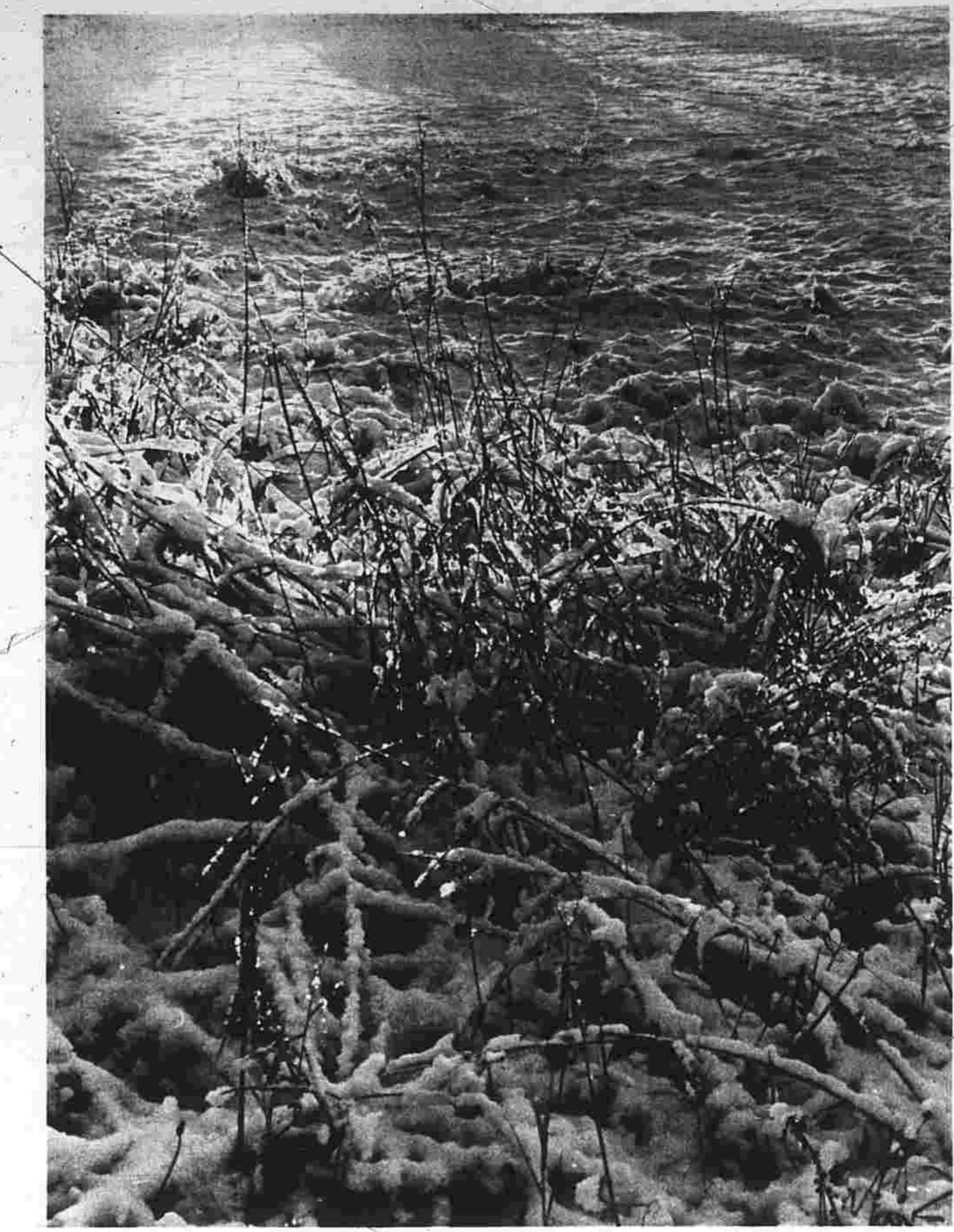

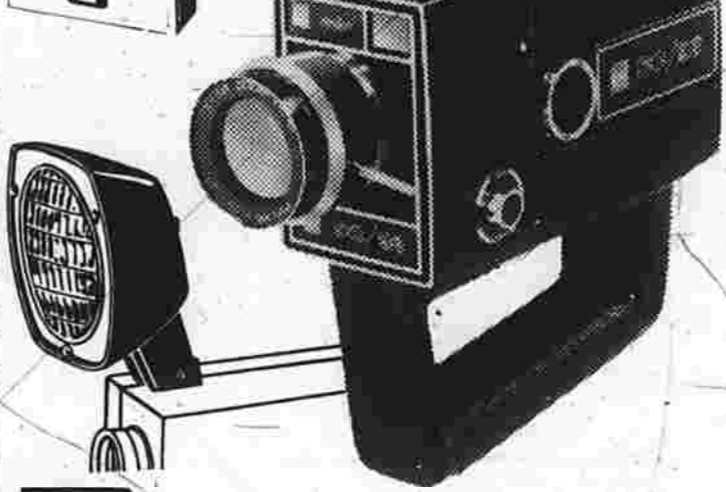

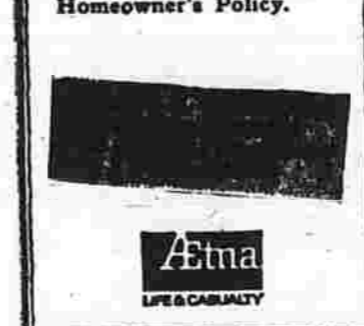

HUD Now Backs MHA In Drain Dispute

The Manchester Housing Authority has been upheld in its protest of a government ruling favoring the contractor in a long-standing dispute over the storm drain system at Mayfair Gardens.

Atty. Vincent Dianna, MHA chairman, reported at last night's meeting that the HUD Regional office of HUD reversed itself in the case after an additional review and has found that the \$20,000 cost of installing the storm drains is the responsibility of the Rocky Marciano Co., general contractor for the project.

HUD's original ruling, announced early in November after a review of data, was that the contractor had been correct in not including the cost of the storm system, listed in blueprints as "N.I.C." (Not In Contract).

The HUD letter notifying the architect, Louis J. Fire Safety Precautions Issued by Town Fire Chief

Some fire safety precautions were issued today by W. Clifford Mason, chief of the Town Fire Department.

"As we approach the Christmas season we should exercise some precautions to insure fire safety in the home and places of assembly," he said.

"The traditional Christmas tree adds something to the spirit of the season. While the Christmas tree can be an instrument of pleasure and enjoyment, it can, if not properly installed and cared for, become an instrument of destruction."

To insure a fire safe Christmas, a few simple precautions to observe are offered by Chief Mason:

1. Do not select too large a tree for the room.
2. Do not install near a door or radiator or other heating device.
3. Make sure the lights are in good order.
4. Select a fresh cut tree and install with the butt in water.
5. Dispose of the tree as soon as possible after the holiday.
6. Do not install lights on the tree. It could become electrified if the sharp points penetrate the wiring insulation. Spotlight this type of tree.
7. Artificial trees are not always fire resistant; caution should be taken when purchasing one. If you select other than an UL approved tree, spotlight it.
8. Live Christmas trees are not allowed in places of assembly, schools and other places where a number of people assemble.
9. Artificial trees in places of assembly to be spotlighted only.
10. When leaving the home or retiring for the night turn off the tree lighting.

"Caution should be observed with the Christmas wrappings, apples, cucumbers, alfalfa and sweet clover.

SANTIAGO, Chile (AP) — A furrowed brow and a Santa Claus smooching his reindeer-drawn, gift-laden sleigh onto snow-covered rooftops with a belly-shaking "ho, ho, ho" just isn't in line with the Chilean government's official view of reality this year.

Christmas in Chile falls in midsummer, as it does every where south of the equator, and the National Christmas Committee feels the traditional symbols of Santa and cotton-covered pine trees aren't relevant.

A government-sponsored yuletide festival workers from various regions of the country will personally the Christmas spirit, and evergreens will be replaced by peach and orange trees.

Cecilia Becholet de Miranda, vice president of the Christmas committee, emphasizes that the workers-and-peaches motif will apply only to government-organized Christmas events. Anybody who wants to can celebrate the holiday with Santa, evergreens and snowmen, she says.

The Christmas committee plans a huge show Sunday in Santiago's national soccer stadium. There will be smaller parties in parks and athletic fields, at a cost of \$140,000.

The committee, headed by President Salvador Allende's wife, Hortensia Busi de Allende, has as its main goal the collection of 2.3 million new toys so that no needy youngsters will lack a gift.

Santiago's department stores have decorated their windows with the usual Santa and reindeer. And the Santa Claus Association, which consists of students who dress as St. Nick and hire themselves out to organizations to earn money for coming summer vacations, foresees an other good year.

Poland Looks Less Red At Christmas

WARSAW (AP) — Christmas is a season when Poland looks less like the Communist state it is.

Roman Catholic sources predict an overwhelming majority of the 25 million Poles will attend midnight Mass in one of the country's 15,200 churches.

Shop windows are aglow with Christmas trees and colored lights. Greeting cards are also in abundance.

Polish kids are visiting their parents and grandparents in department stores—although he is officially called "Grandfather Frost."

The Polish household, long accustomed to meager food queues, apparently is in for a treat.

Shopkeepers report that the government will put out large quantities of goodies in the final Christmas week. Rare imported items for Polish eyes will be bananas, grapefruit and oranges. They will cost about a dollar per pound, very expensive when compared with the average monthly wage of \$36.

Shops have also been promised plenty of meat. The government is believed to be holding back supplies for the Christmas rush.

Two pounds of pork loin cost \$4.50. More than the average daily wage. Poultry is much cheaper. A chicken sells for about \$2.

Plenty of clothes and leather goods are available but at high prices. A man's suit takes more than a month's wages.

Christmas trees cost \$1 to \$6. Toys, one of Poland's top export items, are plentiful, but often expensive. Small electric trains in one Warsaw store sells for about quarter of a month's salary.

For the nine-course Feast of the Vigils on Christmas Eve, some families keep to tradition by laying a white tablecloth over hay, to commemorate the birth of Christ in the manger. In the countryside morsels are taken from the table and given to farm animals.

The main course is carp, a fish washed down with wine or vodka. There are also pierogi—dough stuffed with cabbage, cheese or mushrooms—potatoes, vegetables, sweets, apples, nuts, stewed fruit and soups. Meat is not eaten until Christmas Day.

After the Christmas Eve feast come caroling and the traditional Christmas Eve church service—the midnight pastoral Mass.

Bus Firm Asks City Fare Hike

HARTFORD (AP)—The Connecticut Co., Connecticut's largest municipal bus line, asked the State Public Utilities Commission Wednesday for five-cent increases on its lines in New Haven, Hartford and Stamford.

The PUC granted similar increases last month to the Connecticut Railway and Lighting Co., the state's second largest bus line, which operates in Bridgeport, New Haven and Waterbury.

If the Connecticut Co. gets its rate hikes, its basic adult fare would go up in New Haven from 30 to 35 cents. In Stamford and Hartford it would rise from 20 to 25 cents. Company officials say the prices are lower there because those cities have denser populations providing a more profitable market.

Student rates in all three divisions would rise from 20 to 25 cents as would senior citizen rates in New Haven. In Hartford and Stamford, senior citizen rates would go up from 15 to 20 cents.

The Connecticut Co. carries about 81,000 passengers each week on its lines in the New Haven area, 46,000 in the Hartford area and 6,000 in the Stamford region.

The increases would only affect a customer's first zone of travel. Beyond that first fare, additional charges would stay the same.

UConn To Raise Dining Hall Cost

HARTFORD (AP)—Prices at the University of Connecticut dining halls are going up next year.

University officials say the rise will bring prices in line with costs.

Next fall, the price for a semester of dining-hall fare will be \$86, up \$40 over this year's rate.

The increase was approved Wednesday by the UConn Board of Trustees.

This year, the dining-hall price of \$46 a semester is actually \$24 lower than the actual cost of supplying and serving the food, officials say.

Although costs have risen along with the price, the most rise per cent since the 1970-1971 academic year, however, the price will be increased by 16.6 per cent, to account for the cost increase since 1969, along with the projected cost increase between now and September.

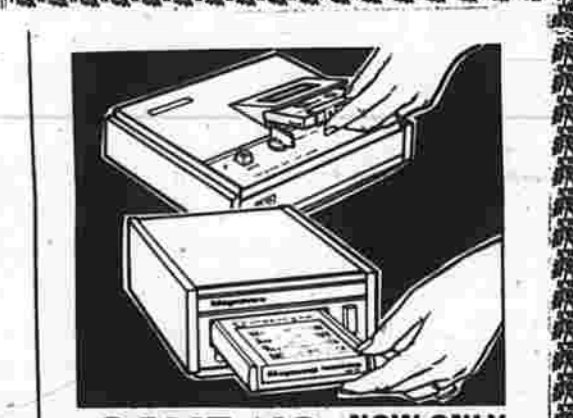

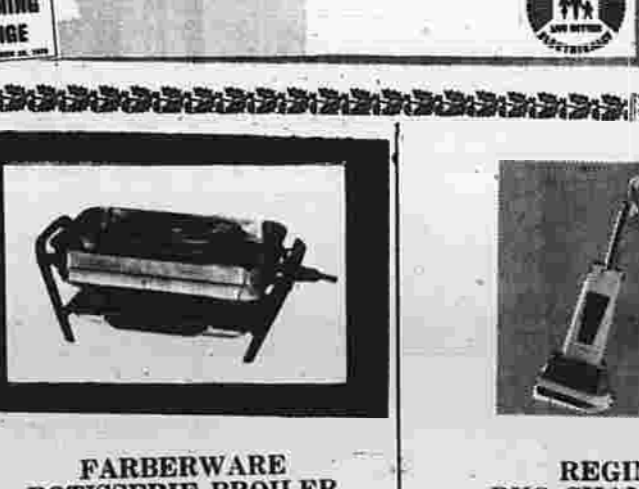
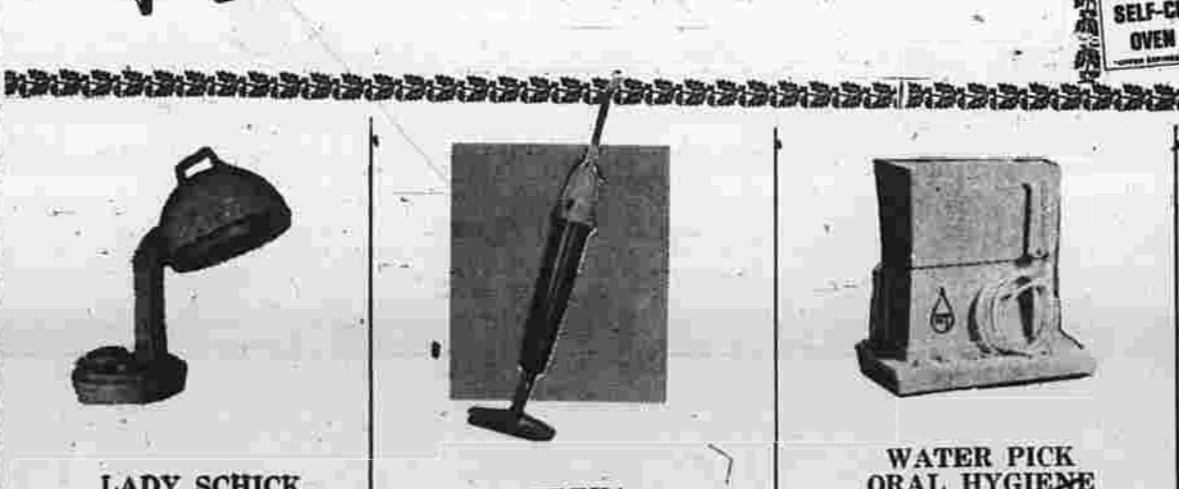
