PERISHABLE FOOD: "Perishable Food" shall mean any food or beverage other than (a) toods which are in hermetically sealed containers processed by heat to prevent spoilage, or

POTENTIALLY HAZARDOUS FOOD: "Potentially hazardous foor" shall mean any perishable food or beverage which consists in whole or in part of milk or milk products, eggs, meat, fish, shellfish, poultry, or other ingredients capable of supporting rapid and progressive growth of micro-organisms
