



This cener-of-mass, at a considerable listance from the sun's center, influenced by the positions of the planets, especially the large ones. This provides a sit-uation in which planetary dynamics can play a critical

The positions of the planets with respect to the sun is belived to be the mechanism by which sunspots are born and it is believed that circulating electric currents in the uppe convective layers of the sun are triggered by the motion of hot, ionized gases due to heat convection below the surafce. These convective currents may be a consequence of variations within the convective envelope

tidal actions of the major currents. Dr. Paul D. Jose, in 1965, showed that the rate of change of the angular momentum (or what we might loosely call spin energy) of the sun about the center-of-mass of the solar system exhibits a 178.7 year mean periodicity which can be reasonably correlated with sunspot activity. As a point of fact the sunspot curve also has a special long-time period
