"THE WAY I HEARD IT"
by John Gruber

I'm continuing with my discussion of some of the things a critic looks for and by which he judges when preparing a review. We were on singers last week, and we're still on them, so far as I'm concerned. There is a great deal to know about singing.

Please understand that I'm talking about opera singers and concert artists. The average singer who has fun in a chorus with others is not the subject of my discussion. I'm talking about high priced soloists after all, it is my job to see that the audience gets its money's worth.

In general there are two styles of singing which may be labeled for convenience as "Italian" and "German." Russian singers generally adopt the German method of voice production; French singers usually follow the Italian mode. Two singers using the two different methods will not blend, and you don't judge one by the same standards as the other.

In the early days there was a style of singing called "bel canto" which literally means "beautiful singing." Nobody knows for certain just what it was and you'll hear a lot of loose talk about it by people who never heard it. Probably it was something like excellent "crooning" in its day, which was over by 1800 or so, maybe a little later.

In the beginning, opera was the playing of the very rich, and nobility. They formed a small minority of the entire populace, and a small theater sufficed to seat the whole bunch. Such a theater still exists in Munich where it is known as the "Residenz Theater," or sometimes the "Cuvilliestheater," since it was designed by a Frenchman named Cuvillie.

It seats about 600 people and has five balconies in addition to the floor seats. These balconies are made up entirely of boxes. It is readily apparent from this description, that no listener is far from the stage. (The stage, by the way, is much larger than the auditorium.) Consequently nobody had to sing very loudly.

In addition, the orchestra were small, and were used purely for accompaniment for the most part, sounding like a fancy guitar. There was little dramatic value in the music. Orpheus was a famous aria, "I have found my Euridyce." Gluck's opera, that would be just as effective if he sang, "I have found by Euridyce." Emotion in music was not yet understood, and consequently dynamic range was limited.

Opera originated in Italy, and Italian models were copied elsewhere. Mozart, for example, wrote Italian opera to all intents and purposes. Beethoven's only opera is something else. It has some beautiful, German-sounding music, but it generally sounds like an oratorio rather than an opera in the conventional sense.

Things changed radically with Carl Maria von Weber, a cousin of Mozart's wife. Hitherto, opera plots had retold the Greek legends, for the most part. (The very first opera of which we have record was "Dafne," spelled with an "f" because the text was Italian not Greek.) Weber ushered in the "romantic" era.

With the exception of "Freischutz," his opera no longer hold the boards, but three of his overtures are still encountered in the concert hall, and they show a radical change in musical approach and in orchestra-

City negotiators continued talks with representatives of the patrolmen, firemen and sanitationmen, all of whom have been without contracts since Jan. 1. The settlements are interrelated.

Firemen and sanitationmen were struck and promptly received a new city offer of a 17.4 per cent wage increase over the previous contract. The offer would raise firemen's salaries by \$1,800 from \$10,500, and sanitationmen by \$1,711 from \$9,871.

The contract for the sanitationmen's union scored the offer as "penicillin."

Talks between the city and the Patrolmen's Benevolent Association were at an impasse. Mayor Daley, a Democrat, said he counted on an increase in state aid to the city to absorb the cost of the settlement.

Gov. Richard Ogilvie, a Republican, said that the city should discontinue certain "vest" functions and redirect the money into the school system.

LONDON (AP) — Britons rushed to meet the deadline for the new postal strike today before a nationwide postal strike which would disrupt telephone and telegraph service with the outside world.

The contract called for a 10 per cent raise in wages and a 10 per cent increase in the number of postal workers. The Post Office set a 10:30 a.m. deadline today for mailing first-class letters. Collected parcels and second class letters already has been suspended.

A government emergency committee met to discuss the possibility of calling out troops to handle the mail or letting private firms take over the mail service during the strike.

The Union of Post Office Workers scheduled a pay raise with a government minister later today in a last-minute attempt at a settlement.

Talks between the union and the Post Office broke down Friday when the union rejected a proposed 8 per cent pay increase. The union wants 10 per cent. Post Office salaries range from \$38 to \$66 a week.

If the workers go on strike, all telegraph services will be cut off, except for "life-and-death" emergency telegrams, which the union has agreed to handle. Dashed telegrams and telephone service with overseas countries will be suspended.

Train Robbery Fugitive Sought Through Britain

ST. AUGUSTINE, England (AP) — Police searched scores of hotels and rooming houses in Cornwall's holiday coast today on the tip that Great Train Robber, Ronald Biggs, was in the southwest England county.

Biggs was sentenced to 10 years in prison for his part in the \$7.3-million mail train robbery of August 1963.

He escaped in 1965 and went to Australia. He evaded a police raid in 1969 and since has been reported in several countries.

Scotland Yard said early this month that Biggs might have returned to Britain. Five days later his 10-year-old son Nicholas was killed in a car crash in Melbourne. Biggs' wife, Charmaine, and a second son, Percy, were slightly injured.

SWINDLES IMPROVED IN TOURNAMENT PLAY

Swindles are more important in tournaments than at rubber bridge. It isn't necessary to outwit the opponents out of an overkill at rubber bridge; the other players would resent the waste of time. But overtricks are the heart and soul of tournament play, and many an expert has won a championship by overtricking his opponents. Today's hand, played by Los Angeles expert Edwin Kantar, is typical.

South dealer

Both sides vulnerable

Opening lead—Five of Clubs (imagine that you are playing the South hand at three no-trump in a tournament. Your object is to win as many tricks as possible. The opening lead gives you a club trick, and you are aware of four spades, two diamonds and a heart for a total of 10 tricks. How should you lead a suit of this kind to make your contract?

Partner opens with 1-3NT (16 to 18 points), and the next play is passed. You hold: Spades, 4; Hearts, 3-7-5; Diamonds, 9-4; Clubs, A-Q-7-5-2.

What do you say?

Answer: Pass. Since you have only 7 points in high cards, the combined count can be only 26 points at most. This is very unlikely to produce a game, and there is no reason to disturb the part-score contract of 1-3NT.

Inflation's Tag Ignored In Considering Incomes

BY JOHN CUNIFF

NEW YORK (AP) — With inflation yielding almost all other problems of the nation today, here is a brief report on how Americans are dealing with this cardinal sin of economic management.

This may sound preposterous, but it was uncovered by Survey Research Center of the University of Michigan and related recently by Dr. George Katona, director of its Economic Behavior Program.

When survey respondents are asked why they are making more money than five or ten years ago, Katona says, they generally give themselves full credit and forget that inflation may have played a role.

"They commonly refer to their own efforts, to increased experience and ability, and to progress in their careers, rather than to inflation or to activities by the government or trade unions," he reports.

"Therefore, inflation is viewed as 'bad' report even by people whose income rose much more than prices advanced. Inflation detracts from the satisfaction with what is seen as well-earned money of one's labor."

Pay increases have been large, especially in construction. Last year the median hourly

an extracted from 2,819 agreements made with the Bureau of National Affairs, Inc., was 27 cents an hour, or 8.6 cents higher than 1969 agreements.

For construction, however, the median was 90.5 cents, and the increase over settlements made a year earlier was 20.2 cents. The 1967 increase continues a trend that appears to have developed in 1967, as judged by BNA figures.

A review of the recent record of wage increases for all industries shows a median of 8.9 cents in 1968, 11 cents in 1969, 18.5 in 1968 and 22.1 in 1969.

The comparable figures for construction are 17.5 cents and 19.8 cents in 1968 and 1969, respectively. In 1967 the median increase jumped to 34.9 cents, to 40.6 in 1968 and to 70.2 cents in 1969.

MOSCOW (AP) — Lunokhod 1, the Soviet moonrover, was steered back to its mother ship today in a check of its navigation system and maneuverability.

The purpose of this was to check the precision and reliability of the navigation and driving of the lunar vehicle," the Soviet news agency said.

Tass said the experiment was done "with great precision" during a regular communications session from 12:30 a.m. to 1:45 Moscow time.

Luna 17, the mother ship from which Lunokhod began its lunar travels Nov. 17, is incapable of making the eight-week moon vehicle back to earth. The Lunokhod chassis occupied the space used for rocket engines on Luna 16, the unmanned spaceship that returned from the moon in September with lunar samples.

The total distance covered so far by the lunar vehicle is 11,767 feet, the 3,983 meters, or 2.5 miles, of the 100-meter slope of 15 degrees steepness.

The moon vehicle is powered by solar batteries that are recharged by opening the top of the vehicle and exposing the batteries to the sun's rays.

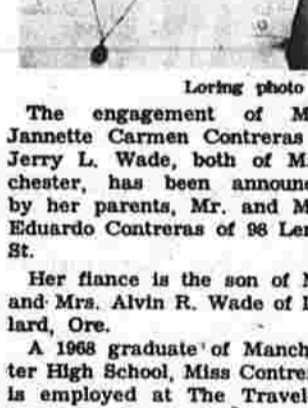

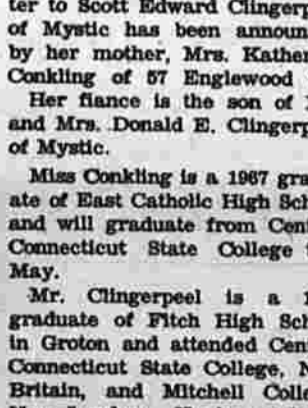

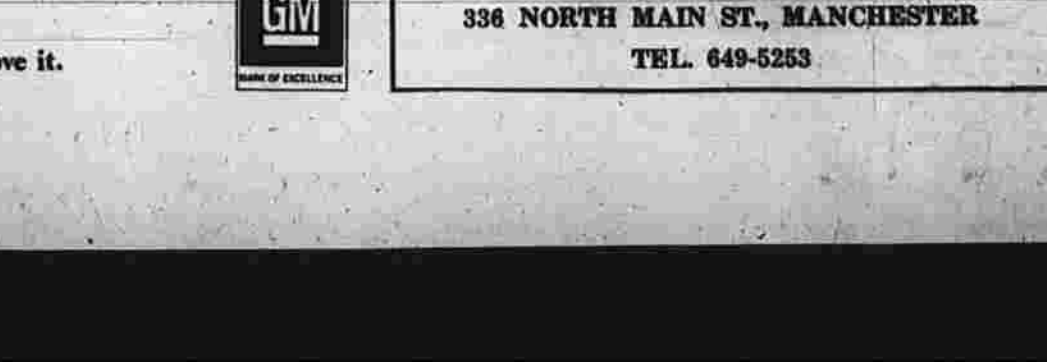

Davis, Spruce St.; two resignations, one from the Housing Authority and one from the Planning Commission; a request to expend contingency funds; appointment of Robert Romjoko as member of Planning Commission, and several reports.

Following adjournment as the town council, the men will convene as the Sewer Authority to discuss sewer assessments for Valley View Lane and Crestview Dr. and a visit to Gimpro Inc., Rotherheld, Wis. to view a sewage treatment plant.

McCoy Urges Passage Of Revenue Plan

Mayor Frank McCoy said today that he has sent telegrams to Congressmen Robert Stennis, Sen. Lowell Weicker and Sen. Abraham Ribicoff urging their support of a resolution concerning revenue sharing proposals presently before Congress.

McCoy said that the resolution was approved at the last meeting of the Connecticut Conference of Mayors. It urges the prompt passage of the revenue sharing legislation to provide ten billion dollars in revenue to the states without any curtailment of other existing programs.

McCoy said that he has long been an advocate of the revenue sharing concept, and that he referred to it at Vernon's budget hearings last year. An equitable formula whereby the states without any curtailment of other existing programs receives can go a long way toward relieving Connecticut's present financial crisis, he added.

He explained that if Congress can pass revenue sharing legislation promptly so as to enable the state government to estimate the "share" to be received, the extent of further state tax cuts can be better defined and limited.

The incident upset several parents who attended a board meeting in December at which Martucci submitted a resignation letter but was turned down by the board. At that time, Martucci assumed full responsibility for the drug letter incident, in what he called a "voluntary" resignation. His submission was a "wise decision."

Those voting against the motion to accept were members Susanne Brinard and Donald Averill. Chairman Richard Mesler recorded his views as being in favor of the motion following the vote, which saw Arthur Fort Jr., Arthur Tourman, Peter Thomas and Ruth Bennett also in favor.

More than 100 parents and students waited outside the school cafeteria, and when it was announced, reacted very quietly. Most of the youngsters returned, some in tears to the cafeteria where they heard reports from their official student representative Margaret Haun, who had been allowed to read the resignation letter.

The first half of the meeting was in fact a meeting with Miss Haun present, as well as an observer on Martucci's behalf, Ronald Pinsky, the high school principal Milton Wilde, Dr. Robert Hopkins and Martucci himself.

Aged Poor Increases To One in 4

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Senate Special Committee on Aging says one of every four Americans 65 years and over is living on a poverty-level income.

The committee, in a report on the economics of aging, said both the number and the proportion of aged poor increased between 1960 and 1969. There were approximately 4.8 million people over 65 living in poverty in 1969 - an increase of almost 200,000, the committee said.

The report said the number of under-65 persons in the poverty bracket declined by 1.2 million during the same period.

Sen. Harrison D. Williams Jr., D-N.J., the committee chairman, said in a preface to the report that Congress should vote 100 percent Social Security increase for 1971 and 20 percent for 1972 to meet "this unmet income crisis."

The Senate voted a 10 percent boost for 1971 and 20 percent for 1972 to meet "this unmet income crisis."

The committee said the aged have been hard hit by unemployment in the current economic slump and that soaring property taxes have jeopardized their finances. Many are unable to pay their taxes, and rapidly rising health costs contribute to their woes, it said.

The report recommended that serious consideration be given to using Treasury general revenues to finance part of Social Security and to expanding Medicare to cover prescription drugs for the chronically ill.

HOLLYWOOD (AP) - The unlikely winner of the movie awards season is a 71-year-old ex-actor who happens to be an honest-to-goodness Indian chief.

He is Chief Dan George, who has served as head of the Tribal-watt section of the Coastland tribe of British Columbia. He also is honorary chief of the large Squamish and Sushwap tribes.

Last month Chief George was named the best supporting actor of the year by the New York Film Critics because of his role as Old Lodge Skins in "Little Big Man." He stopped here en route to the awards ceremonies in New York Monday, Jan. 18.

"I never dreamt that I would receive such an award," said the soft-spoken chief in his suite at the Beverly Hills Hotel.

"There were so many good actors in the movie. My goodness, I never expected that I would be chosen for the honor."

Chief George came to Hollywood for the role of Old Lodge Skins, who adopts Dustin Hoffman in "Little Big Man."

How did he get along with Hoffman?

"Just fine - he calls me grandfather. That boy is a hard worker and a fine actor."

Chief George was pleased that the film showed the Indian's side of western history.

"So many pictures over the years have shown the Indians as savages who slaughtered and beat the settlers. That has an effect on children. I think it gives them hate for the Indians, especially when they attack the helpless wagon trains.

"Don't think our people were that mean."

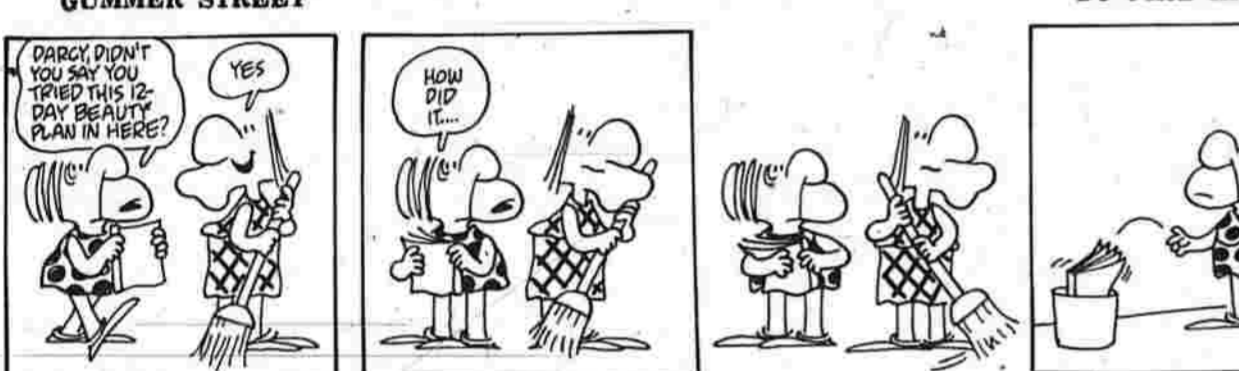

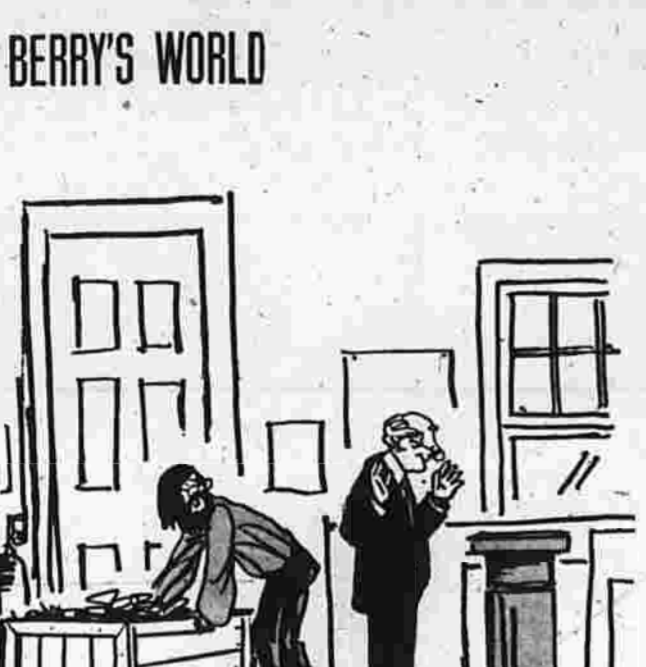
