Senate Hears Proposal To Fight Cancer

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Edward M. Kennedy yesterday proposed the federal government set up an agency to direct an all-out fight against cancer.

The Massachusetts Democrat introduced a bill in the Senate to establish a National Cancer Authority, an independent agency whose task will be to develop as rapidly as possible a comprehensive nationwide program for the conquest of cancer.

The legislation would provide \$200 million to the agency in its first year of operation—\$100 million year 1972 and \$100 million for the second year. Funding the third year would be at the \$200 million level.

Poising out that cancer in 1969 killed 346,000 Americans and is expected to kill 400,000 in 1977 and 500,000 in 1990.

Kennedy's proposed legislation is identical to recommendations made by the National Panel on Consultants on the National Cancer and to a bill proposed by Sen. Ralph Yarborough, D-Tex., during the past session.
