





Rolls-Royce Moral Or Metal?



It may be that Prime Minister Heath's moral would still have proved operative even if, in its urge to win an American contract from Lockheed away from General Electric or Pratt & Whitney, Rolls-Royce had not gambled that carbon fiber would produce a new lightweight fan blade which would also be strong enough to deal with the occasional carcass of Perhaps, if the carbon fiber had prov-

ed practical, and no switch back to titanium had proved necessary, after great waste of time and expense, Rolls-Royce would today be fulfilling its Lockheed contract and prospering in it. Prime Minister Heath, however, deals

in no such engineering specifics. He, shocker, posits fundamentals which might have made the specific success or failure on any one contract unimportant and indecisive. Prime Minister Heath, for his part, found deeper trouble, and he found it not only within the engineering error or the too eager salesmanship of Rolls-Royce management.

"Management," began the British Prime Minister in his mournful funeral that it can go on indefinitely running a business in conditions that don't pay.



"Governments," the Prime Minist went on, "must rid themselves of the illusion that you can find the way to prosperity by pouring out the taxpayers' money in perpetual subsidies for uneconomic ventures.

"All of us," he concluded, "must rid ourselves of the illusion that we can buy our way out of the problems of today by mortgaging the future. It seems the easy way out - but we know now it is the fatal way."

Prime Minister Heath is notorious for a Puritanical instinct which considers hard work a virtue, easy gain sinful, and always expects that a price must be paid for everything. We don't know anywhere in the world where such a philosophy is really practiced, any more, but we don't know any place in the world which can consider its economic problems solvable,

Still, if those carbon fiber blades had proved a little bit tougher, or those stray birds a little more tender, or if the great British firm had never reached so recklessly at all for that big American contract, then the Rolls-Royce purr might still seem smooth and ineffably prestigious, and Prime Minister Heath's day of dour reckoning have been post-

Cahill's Complaint

It is ironic that Governor William T Cahill of New Jersey was, the other day, merely seeking something so limited as one more tunnel under the Hudson River -a tunnel which would itself become part of the same kind of life of which he was complaining.

His complaint was, indeed, broader

than any mere single transportation project or cure, and broader than any single state or junction of two states.
