





LONDON (AP) — Britain's 14,500 banks close tonight for four days to convert the country to a new kind of currency.

After 12 centuries of complicated coinage—pennies, shillings, half crowns and florins—Britain is changing its money to the decimal system, bringing it into line with dollars, yen, francs and other world currencies.

Decimal Day or Day is shoppers and cashlers arguing that there will be two prices for everything—a psickage of cigarrettes will be either aix shillings or 30 new pence, depending on which store the buyer enters. Shoppers are bound to compare the new prices with the old. In many cases this will be impossible because exact conversions can't be figured.
