





Running War By Press Conference was a surprise, the Washington press had the kind of press conference seasion with President Nixon it has said it has been seeking.

It was a relatively small, informal gathering, and the important thing about it was that the President himself told the correspondents to feel free to "follow up" one question with another, until they were sure they had explored a topic to their own complete satisfac-

The members of the press responded to this with some persistent enthusiasm, and, to give them credit, their questions did exhibit something more in the department of consistence and intelligence than they have exhibited on recent televised press conferences.

So yesterday they concentrated, as they have tried less successfully to do on other occasions, on the way President Nixon is running the war in Asia. President Nixon, and President Johnson before him, have been the only Presidents ever compelled to conduct their wars via press conference.

Conducting a war via press conference, as against conducting one in secret, privy councils, reduces the number of options a commander-in-chief can repersistent questioning, President Nixon had a hard time reserving any future freedom of action and policy to himself and his high advisers.

But, rather early in the proceedings, he did make a rather sweeping statement which managed to stand up through all the subsequent questioning. He was responding to the question of what limits he acknowledged in our future strategy and what he said was this: "We are not going to use ground forces

in Laos. We are not going to use advisers in Laos with the South Vietnamese forces. We are not going to use ground forces in Cambodia or advisers in Cambodia as we have previously indicated and we have no intention of course of using ground forces in North Vietnam. "I am not going to place any limita-

tion upon the use of air power except of course, to rule out a rather ridiculous suggestion that is made from time to time - I think the latest by Hans Morgenthau -that our air power might include the use of tactical nuclear

We would only suggest to the public and to Congress that, while President's proposals are debated, ome hard thought be given to the meaning of poverty — not only as a burden on ociety but as an extremely painful buren on poor people themselves


To begin with, poverty is a particularly grim kind of tyranny. A family without money or prospects is a family ef-fectively without freedom. The terrible anxiety about maintaining the barest livelihood distorts the mind. Hungry, illclothed children can evoke only sickening sorrow in their parents, an often unnanageable sorrow that leads to drunkenness, drug addiction, marital warfare, and perhaps prison.


