Mr. Nixon And The Commentators President Nixon, using language and intensity of expression and feeling which almost belied his own assertion, said the other night that he could "understand" the fact that television commentators, night after night, kept drumming away on their theory that the "incursions" into Cambodia and Laos were more likely to widen and prolong the war than they were to achieve the objectives he himself, the President, continued to claim

The impression was that, other than some unpleasant theory that the television commentators were pathologically out to get him and everything he does, the President didn't really "understand" the behavior of the commentators. Do any of us, for that matter, really "understand" the logic of someone we think to be totally wrong and mistaken, and perhaps wilfully biased in the bargain?

Anyway, the President, admitting that the argument could not be finally settled during his press conference, asserted his own judgment that the operation in Cambodia had been successful in reducing American casualties in the war and in making it possible for the withdrawal of American troops from Vietnam to take place on, and perhaps ahead of, sched-

success, in disproof of all the pessimistic judgments all the television commentators made on it last spring and summer, and, the President went on, he is confident that Laos will produce the same

Thus the President, and it is appropriate to note that he is not the only American who has probably noticed that the television commentators - along, with that matter, many of the nation's editorial pages - have almost seemed to insist on sandbagging the President day after day and night after night with not merely their fears, but their judgments, that the invasions of Cambodia and Laos are more likely to lock us into continuing and wider Asian involvement than they are to ease our way out of that involvement.

But although the almost pathological persistence of the commentators can be noticed, that, in itself, does not win the argument for the President.

There is a weakness, a perhaps unbalanced, impulsive and compulsive weakness on his side of the argument,

His weakness is that he talks of Cambodia as if it were a closed and finished ncident, with all the auditing necessary to evaluate it already complete and

The possibility which either disturbs or fascinates the commentators is the possibility that the story in Cambodia is not yet finished, and that we do not yet begin to have any surety that we are near the end of the chain of events. and reactions which may have been set off by the two invasion moves.

There is, as yet, no real answer to the question of whether or not the invasions into Cambodia and Laos are going to lead to more war, or to less war. For the moment, the choice for Americans seems rather limited, to go along with the President, with worried hope that things are going to turn out, in the end, as well as he thinks they have turned out already. It would be a pleasure, and a national gain, to have the nervous fears of the commentators - or their pathological unwillingness to admit that Mr. Nixon could be right - rebuked and discredited.

When sunspots are most numerous, solar storms or "flares" are also most numerous. Flares, in turn, should provide some clues as to the presence of other planetary

NEW YORK (AP) - The United States Court of Appeals here has upheld but modified a lower court injunction against a Connecticut school board rule which required prior approval by school officials of material distributed on school property. The court noted that "reasonable and fair" standards for prior review might be instituted that would not violate constitu

tional freedoms. The case involved an unoff cial school paper at Rippowan High School in Stamford, Conwhere in November, 1969, a poli cy requiring prior approval of the contents of the paper by the school administration was laid down. A Connecticut judge en joined the rule.

In a 14-page decision the ap peals court ruled: "We cannot not deny that Connecticut has authority to minimize or elim nate influences that would dilut or disrupt the effectiveness of the educational process." # 'Tried and True' Season Ahead

### Revolution Is Theme Of Long Series

"The American Revolution: 1770-1783," a major new CBS News project chronicling the origins of the American Revolution, will be broadcast on the CBS Television Network, it was announced today by Richard S. Salant, president of CBS News.

The series is in celebration of the United States' bicentennial, and will be broadcast from time to time throughout the next six years. Each broadcast will feature a conversation between CBS News national correspondent Eric Sevareid and key figures in the birth of American independence — the first to be portrayed by Acade-my Award-winning actor Peter Untinov.

In the first episode, "A Conversation With Lord North," to be broadcast April 6, Ustinov will portray King George III's Prime Minister Frederick Lord North, the pivotal figure in the decision to resist colonial efforts at independence.

Ustinov, as Lord North, will be "interviewed" by Sevareld at Wroxton Abbey, the North ancestral home not far from Stratford-on-Avon.

Sevareid, in contemporary dress, questions Lord North as he might have done from the vantage point of an American

journalist of the year 1770. It is anticipated that at least two programs in this series will be broadcast each year through 1976. The first two, to be pre-sented this year, will be spon-sored by the Ford Motor Company.

Sevareid interviews Lord North about many of the issues that agitated the colonists and pushed them to the verge of revolution — among them the Boston "massacre," the American claim of lack of representation in Parliament, the tax imposed on tea and the crucial Declaratory Act, the chief politi. cal factor in the ultimate out-break of hostilities.

By JERRY BUCK AP Television-Radio Writer NEW YORK (AP) - Wedged in by the prime-time cutback, the economy, and the loss of cigarette revenue, television is most likely to stick with the tried and true next season.

Situation comedy, action-adventure and tongue-in-cheek shows in the style of "I Spy" and "The Man From U.N.C.L.E." will get top consideration as the networks trim 3½ hours a week from their schedules. The cut was ordered by the Federal Communications Commission to create more diversity in programming.

In a normal year the fall lineups for the three networks would be out by now.

But this is not a normal year and each network is trying to outwait the others. Counterprogramming—the inexact science of putting the oppositions' schedule weaknesses to advantage-will be more important than ever this year,

Some of next year's shows are already known, because of commitments to movie stars. The others will come from original movies now being aired and the remainder from pilots being viewed in executive suites,

ABC signed Shirley MacLaine for a situation comedy and Tony Curtis and Roger Moore, who play an American wheeler-dealer and an English peer in "The Friendly Persuaders."

Dick Van Dyke returns to CBS in a comedy about a TV talk show host. Glenn Ford will star in a contemporary Western called "Cade's County."

James Garner, formerly Bret Mayerick in the "Mayerick" series, will be on NBC in "Ni-chols," a comedy-drama set in the Southwest in 1915. James Stewart makes his television debut in a comedy about a college professor with a son and a

grandson the same age.

Just about any made-for-television movie can be construed as a pilot. Among those for NBC are four detective movies-"Sarge," in which George Kennedy plays a detective who becomes a priest; "Ransom For a Dead Man," in which Peter Falk plays a police detective "Colombo;" "Banyon," a 1930s-style private eye star-ring Robert Forster; and "Ellery Queen," a revival of the detective classic with Peter Lawford.
