



For a moment it seemed, then, that the President was about to make himself, at long last, a champion and defender and even, most crucial of all, user of the United Nations.

But the President's own next words snuffed out any such hope:

"I am not, personally (disillusioned), because I never expected it could settle all problems involving major powers but could nevertheless play a useful role in development and in peacekeeping in areas where the superpowers were not directly involved."
