Avoiding That "Nightmare"

The President last night announced an increased rate of troop withdrawal which was only a slight increase in rate, and considerably less than the Washington rumor factories had been predicting. Beyond the news of what the rate of roop withdrawal was going to be between now and December, the President offered nothing that was new or

The President was on the air, then, not to make announcements of policy, but to make a defense of existing policy.

For the first and the main point of his defense, he banked on the big irrefutable fact which he has at his side - the fact that he has continually and progressively reduced the amount of American milltary manpower in Vietnam.

Even those who question his motives, and his capacity to reach his own announced policy goals, find themselves muted when they confront the elemental fact that this President is taking American forces out of the combat zones instead of sending more in.

For the second, part of his defense last night, President Nixon reached out, in a moving passage about the sorrows of being a war-time President, for the sympathetic emotional support of his fel-

These were the strong, effective points of his appearance.

The minds and hearts of his countrymen did not find it easy to join him in his proclamation that Vietnamization had now proved a success. On that point, almost everyone else is still conceding that the real tests of that theory still lie

On another point, many of the President's hearers found themselves wanting to know and go beyond the statement of his own Vietnam goals he relterated last night - to get every American soldier out of Vietnam, but to do it in a way which would give the South Vietnamese a chance to defend themselves. To end the war otherwise. the President truthfully said, would be to "plunge from the anguish of war into a nightmare of recrimination." Here the President was exhibiting the

right kind of sensitivity, but not carrying it far enough. We Americans are going to have our

nightmare of recrimination if we leave any kind of war still going on, still claiming Asian lives, after we ourselves step out of the fighting. For, although the President last night claimed that we have been fighting in Vietnam "only for the right of people far away to choose the kind of government they want," we know very well, we Americans, that we have also been fighting for the kind of government we ourselves would choose to have these people have on this strategic place on the power politics map.

Neither Mr. Nixon, with his grim intention to press on with his promise of ending American involvement by those dove-critics, with their demand that we simply cut out now, without any regard to what happens next, face up to the most difficult and yet truly mandatory obligation of all, which is to negotiate an end to the whole war rather than merely try to extricate ourselves from it.

We would all rather have him pulling troops out than putting them in. We can all credit the moving sincerity with which he addresses himself to his hopes for peace. He deserves our support rather than our attack. But we must, if we are to be realistic, hope for him one additional proportion of courage and vision - that he can see and try to act on the necessity of leaving not merely

a non-American war in Vietnam, which is by now a moral impossibility anyway. but peace for the people with whom we have been involved in this war.

Campaign Tokyo Style Appeal to the voter's senses rather than waste time aiming at his intelligence — that seems to be the technique being employed in the election campaign now in progress in Tokyo.

That city is about to elect itself a new governor. One candidate happens to be much more liberal than the other, but neither candidate seems to be willing to rest his case on the anything so dull as a mere discussion of the issues.

Instead, the main thrust of each can didate's effort is being directed into what is being called a "feeling campaign," called that because the object is to entice the voter through appeals to his

There is a heavy employment of colors designed to catch the eye of the voter. More attention is paid to campaign music than to party platforms. Buxom beauties display their charms in way which suggests that life with their candidate in office would be an earthly

Beyond this, it is conceded that one of the most important factors in the campaign is the way the women of Tokyo seem to think that one of the candidates has a very "sincere" face.

As we read of this election campaign in far-off Japan, and see the nature of the campaign being reported as if it were news, we find ourselves wondering if what is not being reported from Japan, as a sort of novelty, has not already become standard form for cam paigning here in the United States.

Give us pleasing colors, the vibrant music, the seductive curve, and the face women like to trust, and what do we need with issues in any American

Vietnam: The Real Winners

The next time the Kremlin passes out Hero Medals it might save a few for the American politicians who think we are strengthening U.S. Security by beating up on little countries in Southeast Asia. At their most coherent, the architects of this policy argue that we have to save South Vietnam to dissuade China from unleashing the awesome military power that, after huffing and puffing for 20 years, can't even cross 2,300 yards of water to Nationalist-held Quemoy Island. incinerate our cities before tomorrow's breakfast if they are crazy enough to try - and who says they aren't ? But we have chosen to gut our armed forces against an imaginary danger while the only country that can really hurt us gets stronger and stronger. Consider: velopment has held around \$7 billion annually, while we have thrown away \$105 billion on killing Viet Cong. That's like spotting the Russians 15 years in the



The prospect of sending these forces for the first time in a generation against enemy soldiers who also have jets, helicopters, and shoes must be dispiriting to anyone this side of the Iron Curtain. The financial damage that the war has done to our armed forces may be made up for when the war is ended. But their il strength must finally lie in the spirit of their men, the quality of the commanders, and the support they get from

It may take years to restore the damage that the war has inflicted on those vital qualities. Whether we win, lose, or n Vietnam, the Russians will be the real winners. - THE NATIONAL

It imposed a 1 per cent tax on earnings up to \$3,000. The first benefit pay-ments were to be made in 1942. But even before the first benefits flowed Congress liberalized he system, providing for pay ments to aged wives, widow and children of deceased workers, and moving the first paypayment that year was \$22.10 a nonth for an individual. Recipients totaled 113,000.

By 1970, there were 26,230,000 eneficiaries. The average individual monthly payment now is \$131. A 65-year-old wife gets, in addition, 50 per cent of her husband's basic benefit. Successive changes have exended the coverage of the system, taking in many farm em-

ployes, domestics, self-em-ployed professionals such as doctors, clergymen, employes of nonprofit organizations and, on an optional basis, employes of state and local governments. Now the system embraces nearly 94.5 million workers, more than 9 out of 10 jobs in the country. The only large groups omitted are federal employes, who have their own retirement and health system, and some state and local government workers, similarly covered. Of the persons reaching 65 in 1971, 93 per cent are eligible to receive cash benefits from Social Security. Besides, broadening the cov-

erage, Congress repeatedly raised benefits—and taxes. In addition, it created whole new components of the system. Thus in 1956 retirement for the first ime was provided for workers disabled before reaching pen-sion age. And in 1965, after years of argument, Medicare, the plan under which Social Security pays much of the health care expenses of elderly retirees, came into being. The family insurance factor of
