### Senate Extends Wage-Price Date

WASHINGTON (AP) — Congress is ready to renew for a year President Nixon's authority to impose price, wage and rent controls—power some Democrats contend he should be using extensively to battle inflation and unemployment.

The Senate passed 77 to 21 Monday a bill extending the authority to April 30, 1972.

The House voted March 30 for a two-year extension. But Sen. John Sparkman, D-Ala., chairman of the Senate Banking Committee, said he was advised the House now will accept the Senate version shortly.

When Congress first granted it last year, the Nixon administration opposed lodging authority in the President to fix price and wage controls.

Democrats made certain in Monday's debate that the power to impose across-the-board controls would be the President's and asked for an extension of the authority.

Sen. Robert Packwood, R-Ore., offered an amendment to provide most of the funds for programs that Congress also must mortgage.

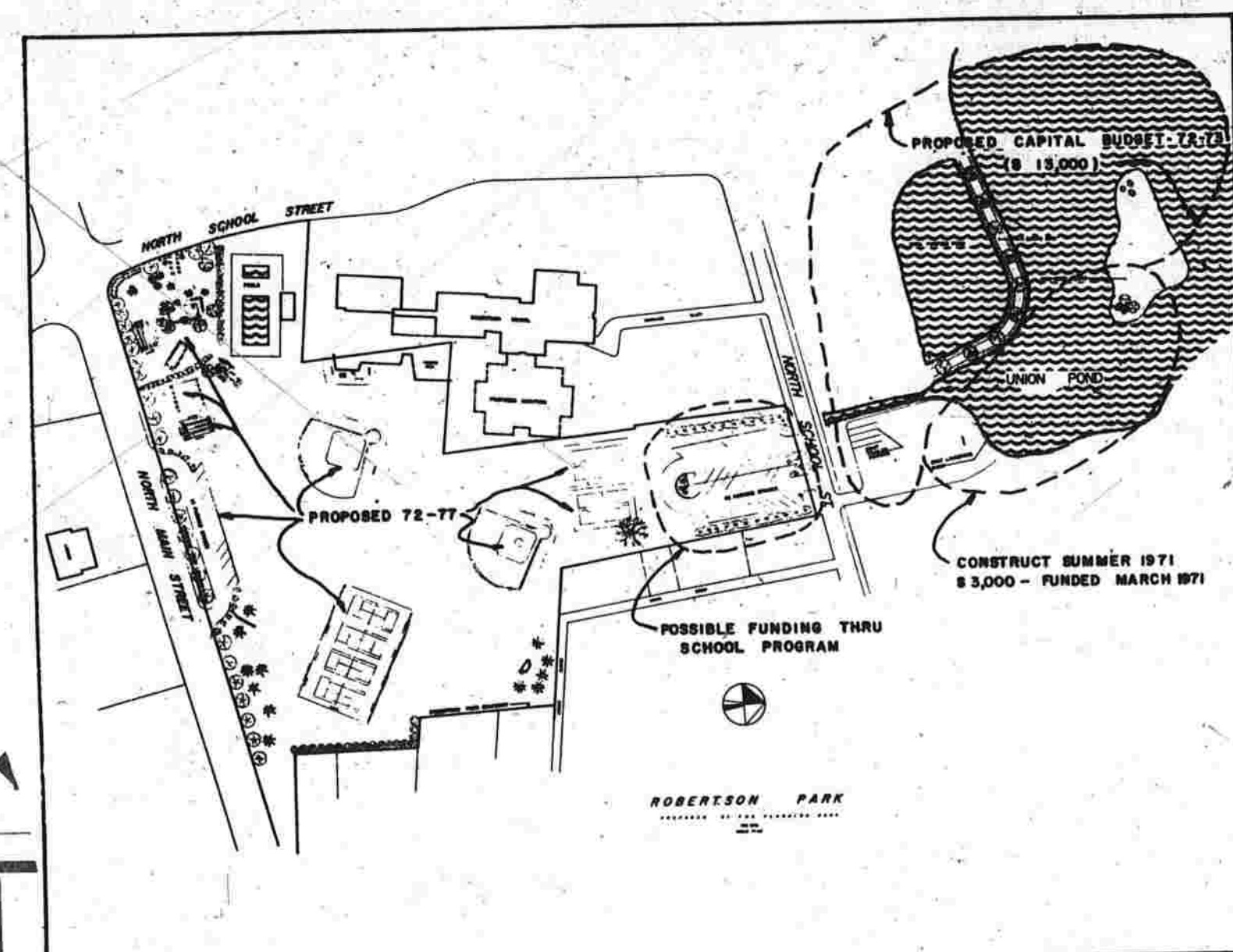

### Plan for Union Pond—Some Seek Funds for It

A \$18,000 allocation in the 1971-72 budget would allow for park development at the southern end of Union Pond as shown in this diagram, according to William O'Neill, director of public works. The Manchester Jaycees and citizens in the North End have been spearheading a campaign to have the money included in the budget which the Board of Directors will adopt tomorrow night. Proponents of the plan argue that the pond is being drained this spring anyway for repairs to the dam there so it would be a good time to do the straightening work in the park development plan, included in the park would be a boat launch-

ing area, a skating area which could be drained in the summer to be used as a play area, a causeway, and a landscaped island. The causeway and island would be made from paper fibre which lines the bottom of the pond in the southern end. The fibre would be dredged up with equipment rented with the \$18,000. The fibre has been deposited over the years from effluent dumped into the stream by Lydell and the Rogers Corp. dump effluent into the brook now, but will not when they tie into the secondary sewage treatment plant when it opens in June.

### Coventry Resignations Are Accepted By Council

The Town council acted on two resignations at its meeting last night. Road Foreman John Harty will leave his post July 1 for health reasons, and Economic Development Commission chairman John Drue is resigning from that group effective the end of this month, citing insufficient time. Harty, who was appointed road foreman in December, 1968, expressed regret for having to take the action, but said, "The strain of the past two winters makes it necessary for my health's sake to leave at this time." Drue expressed his appreciation to the Town Council and to Town Manager Dennis Moore for the cooperation he has received, and added that he felt it would be best to announce his resignation during the current budget sessions. The State Personnel Department will be contacted regarding a competitive examination to fill Harty's post. Both resignations were accepted by the council with deep regret.

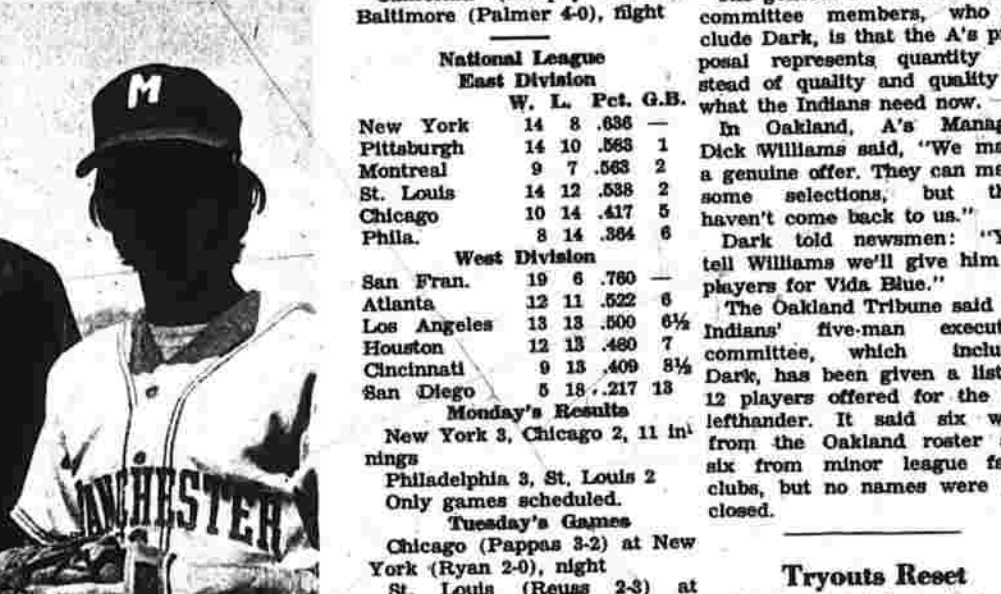
