cedure for an execution. "When the time arrives," said this conducted, "a state-appointed executioner, whom nobody knows, will push a rubber-handled level forward, sending 2,000 volts through the condemned man.

"After three seconds, the voltage is decreased to 500 volts for 57 seconds, built up rapidly again to 2,000 volts, dropped again to 500 volts, then shot up again to 2,000 volts. When it is all over, in less than three minutes, a physician declares the prisoner dead."

As we quote this, we do so with a feeling that this is something many Americans no longer want any part of not even to the extent of paying the tot which provides the electric current necessary for the execution process. And it also seems to us that the actual

Those of us who hope, along with New York Times editorial on the subject that "the hangman, the electric chair, and the gas chamber have no place in a civilized society" are, it might as well be admitted, reduced to wishing that the Supreme Court would do for us what we have not been able to do for ourselves in our own democratic

But perhaps the prospect of a mass execution of hundreds of death cell inhabitants will help turn enough stomachs, and votes, to prolong the present most mortal moratorium and build more will toward making it permanent.

Don't bother to look now, because the process doesn't really require your participation or approval, but we are in process of removing the horns from the head of Premier Chou Enlai, erstwhile brutal dictator behind the bamboo cur-

We are being given extended accounts of how happy he is at meeting "an old friend" who turns out to be a Canadian diplomat who just happens to be inside China at this point in diplomatic time. The news is beginning to sprout daily samples of his geniality and his humor. He is, it appears, a most democratic kind of fellow. Further, we have it on the authority of ping pong players that he is intelligent, and extremely well in-

It all makes us wonder how world society has managed to get along, for the past 20 years, without such a scintillating, personable, agreeable fellow.

The answer, of course, is that this fellow was just born yesterday. What we have had, during the past 20 years, was a figure much different, but equally unreal — the cold, callous, mysterious, brutal, ideology-consumed, imperialistminded human monster of the younger and hence more feared Red dictator-

If we hadn't been so willing to accept the image of the monster we wouldn't be doing quite so much silly gushing, now, over the discovery that the Chinese leader has eyes that twinkle intelligently and cheeks that crease into a smile and a tongue that can produce, at will, a gracious, courteous remark. But it is a standing part of our own

behavior as human beings that we are not always willing to concede that other people are also basically human beings. during which anyone who attributed any of the normal human qualities to the Chinese leader would have been branded a traitor or fellow traveler just 49 there may now lie ahead a period in which anyone who refuses to concede the sociability of that same Chinese leader is likely to be branded as reactionary obstructionist.














The Tufts-Delta Health Center of Mound Bayou, Miss., above, is a pioneer in a new kind of community health care. It has served as a model for similar centers, funded by the Office of Economic Opportunity, which have sprung up in both rural and urban areas across the country to provide comprehensive health care to those most in need of it: the sick who are also poor.

The concept of health at these centers has been expanded to the environment—which creates many of man's ills. With com-munity involvement, they have brought not only medicine to the sick, but also social change and the improved amenities which

The Mound Bayou center serves a 500-square-mile area in northern Bolivar County, with a population of 14,000, mostly blacks, whose median family income is \$900 a year per family. The center opened in 1965 in a church parsonage, and in 1968 moved into a modern \$800,000 facility in the middle of what was once a cotton field, at the edge of Mound Bayou. In an average month there are 2,500 patient visits, and nursing staff make 1,200 visits to

homes to care for the sick.
