### Three Years at Paris

When, three years ago, the three-way peace talks opened in Paris, the predictions of those observers who thought they might go on forever without ever making any kind of visible progress seemed unduly pessimistic.

Some of us would have been quite willing to bet, then, that the Paris talks would have to come up with something, long before this third anniversary of the beginning of the talks could be reached. It seemed, then, that by the mere act of agreeing to hold talks both sides had

Surely, it seemed in the spring of 1958, with the election of a new President coming up, American policy would have the pliability to help create a set-

All such hopes and expectations have been disappointed. The talks have gone on for three years without producing as if both sides were still toying with the idea of altering that original tacit concession of stalemate which brought them to Paris in the first place.

In place of diplomatic movement at Paris, the one clear thing that has been happening, at the initiative of the new American President, has been the steady withdrawal of American manpower from the war. This is being presented to us as if it were a solution to the war. Praiseworthy as it is, however, it offers only an end to American casualties in the war. Perhaps, beyond that, it can, by the way it establishes South Vietnam's own military strength, also help bring about the arrival of a de facto peace

But, looking hard at the central picture, it is difficult to believe that we can ever make a satisfactory exit from Vietnam by just leaving Vietnam, and when we honestly ask ourselves what it is going to take to give us such an exit with honor and without self-recrimination afterward we have to answer that it would take a negotiated settlement which would establish terms and international enforcement procedures for a cessation of all fighting, by no matter whom, in

And that realization points us straight back to that hitherto fruitless bargaining table at Paris. It says that, sooner or later, we must be willing to make peace, not just by extricating ourselves from the mess in Vietnam, but by taking our part and our responsibility in a settlement which will give the people of Vietnam their chance, too, to escape prolongation of their tragedy. It seems to us that neither President Nixon, with his own program for disengagement, nor the reckless peace doves in Congress, who act as if we could get out scot free any moment we choose, have been looking into our own involvement and obligations deeply enough. We may still have to do the one thing we least like to do, and the one thing neither side has yet done at Paris - negotiate.
