The Clifford peace package is made up in part of public statements by North Vietnamese delegates to the peace talks at Paris, and of less authoritative speculation, based on unspecified conersations Mr. Clifford claims to have had with unnamed sources.

What Mr. Clifford offers is, first, what the delegate at Paris offered, an agreement to talk about the release of American prisoners as soon as Washington sets a date for American military withdrawal from Vietnam. Then Mr. Clifford goes beyond this, to offer his own interpretation, which is that, if the United States should agree to end American involvenent in Vietnam by Dec. 31, then Hanol yould be found granting the release of the American prisoners within 30 days

ticement nobody else has yet offered. He thinks North Vietnam would agree such developments, not to molest the ieparture of American troops, even afer their number had dwindled to such an extent that they might be considered easy targets.

ignificantly, the Clifford speculations, coming along with the approach o significant votes in the Senate, seem to ave spurred the Nixon Administration tiself into some tardy admission that there may be something worth in vestigating in what the North Vietnamese delegates have been saying at Paris. It is almost as if we were entering a race to see which would get America out of Vietnam first, the Nixon Administration or the Clifford type of unofficial negotiation.

Unfortunately, it is not easy or sensible to rejoice over such a race toward American withdrawal, even though its basic direction may be what most Americans now want.

Mr. Clifford, for his part, does not offer any assurance of North Vietnam's good and peaceful conduct after the American military force shall have been removed from Vietnam.

And President Nixon, for his part, has never offered any greater assurance than his hope that, at such a time, the military forces of South Vietnam would be strong enough and steady enough and

efficient enough to give at least equal battle to the Victorng and the North That is not an assurance anybody really takes very seriously. Ask most of us

what we would expect the military odds to be once the Americans really get out, and we would probably confess that we would expect the Vietcong and the North Vietnamese to be able to win a necticut's taxpayers. And so it goes. rather speedy military victory.

The point of all this is that, whether it is the Clifford timetable, or the Nixon timetable, neither withdrawal plan is good enough. It is not, and cannot be, merely a question of getting America out of Vietnam. It is, and it has to be,

a question of getting some international guarantee and supervision of peace for what we Americans will leave behind To do that, we are going to have to negotiate, not just about American withdrawal, not just about the release of American prisoners, but about what is

the withdrawal and that release. The proper prelude to such real negotiation would be a cease-fire, to end the killing
