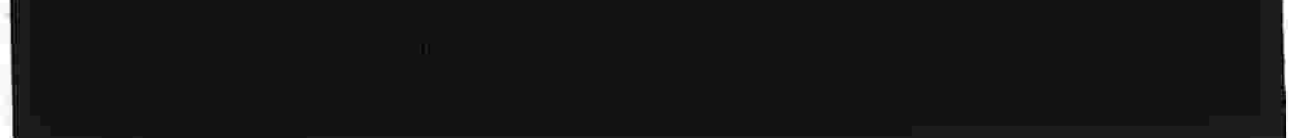

## Six-Cent Stamp Misprint Found, Collector Hopes

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Stamp collector Clifford Cunningham, a double amputee, bought some six-cent stamps a while back just to use for letters—but as he unrolled them he discovered that the perforations were in the wrong place and the colors were a bit odd.

Instead of being perforated at the edge, the 100 stamps have perforations holes that run through the center, the stripes in the American flag design contain a blue tint instead of the traditional red color, and there is a blue tint on the background which is supposed to be white.

Cunningham, 58, said he withheld news of his six-cent stamp until the new eight-cent stamps were introduced so that the government would be less likely to print more like them and destroy the value of his stamps.

The value of Cunningham's stamps may only be about \$500, said the AAS Stamp Appraisers of Los Angeles, whose spokesman said he had looked at the stamps. He said the blue tint was common but that the perforations were abnormal.

A stamp dealer said the value could only be determined "by more time, and that a key word would be whether others turn up."

Cunningham, who lost both his legs in a series of operations some years ago, said the Government Printing Office in Washington, D.C., told him it knew of no other stamps like these.

The philatelic information department of the Post Office in Los Angeles confirmed to a reporter that the stamps were valuable. A spokesman declined to estimate their possible value.

## Extortion Plot Ends in Arrest On Highway Lot

FAIRFIELD (AP) — Two West Haven men were arrested Tuesday by FBI agents in connection with an alleged plot to extort \$50,000 from an unidentified Connecticut businessman by claiming he was wanted for testimony in a dangerous New York gambling investigation.

Federal lawyers claimed before U.S. Commissioner Thomas F. Parker in Hartford that Leonard J. Sande, 56, also known as "Lumpy," was accused of the extortion. The two men are accused of using the U.S. mails between New Jersey and Connecticut to make their victim think he was wanted as a witness in a southern New York federal gambling investigation.

The government claimed Sande was identified only by a false U.S. District Court subpoena was used to convince the victim, who was wealthy and elderly, that he was being ordered to testify in New York.

False newspaper clippings imitating the branch of palatial homes the victim owned were also allegedly had been sent to the victim by government agents.

Parker set bond for each defendant at \$10,000.

What is the correct procedure for the dummy when his partner asks him whether to play the king or the jack when the ace and queen are both missing? It's completely improper to look at an opponent's hand, and then give your partner a signal. Besides, there are times when you want your partner to guess wrong, strange as that may seem.

North dealer.  
Opening lead — Two of Clubs.  
When the hand was played, the declarer in a recent time match the declarer and the early play were the same at both tables.

Declarer took the ace of diamonds and returned a club. South would ruff a club and then lead a spade to the king. When West refused the trick, each declarer led a heart toward dummy.

What do you say?  
Answer: Bid two clubs or two hearts. Dummy's trump would show heart support at your next turn. The hand is too strong for a raise to two hearts, but not strong enough for a jump to three hearts.

It was explained that Amerbel has refused to pay the town a total bill of \$14,600 for sewer user charges for four years starting in 1968. The bill includes an interest charge of \$1,400.

The reason Amerbel gave for not paying the bill is a July 1969 agreement reached with the town allowing the town to sue Amerbel over its property in return for waiving the charges for laying a sewer. There was no user charge at that time and the town's position is that it was only the latter charge which was waived.

Amerbel contends that the agreement included all sewer charges as well but agreed to pay the bill minus the interest on the condition that if the firm should raise the issue in the future, the town will not use the fact of this payment as a defense. Another condition of payment is that the town will continue along its present course of action in planning to build a treatment plant to take care of the treatment of dyes.

The presentation took place at a retirement dinner for Mrs. Wolcott last night at Coney's Restaurant attended by past Board members of the town.

It was decided to accept the proposal after deleting the reference to removing dyes as it was not certain that it was so stressed that with federal funding for any new construction there will be special assessments to industries which are causing the problems that are being solved.

Since the town has been ordered by the state to improve treatment, it is considering using this process in a new plant which would cost \$4 or \$5 million.

Two Schools To Shift To Ungraded System

By MARGARET HAYDEN (Herald Reporter) — A different approach to learning will be used next fall at Nathan Hale and Green Schools with all students except those in the pre-primary grades. The staffs of both schools are working toward the implementation of an ungraded system called Individually Guided Education (IGE), which was developed by the University of Wisconsin Research and Development Center for Cognitive Learning. Louis D. Saloom, Nathan Hale principal, said IGE will offer many options for ways of learning. "There is no one way of learning," he said, "We're restructuring the curriculum to allow each child to move at his own pace. About 100 students of a three-year age span will be in an area about the size of four classrooms and will be grouped by skills. Structural changes are being made in the Nathan Hale School for the system. A team of professional educators, instructional secretaries and teacher aides will work in each area. The system will use team teaching and make better use of teacher talents and skills than the traditional classroom situation. Saloom said. Students will be diagnostically tested in the fall for placement in learning groups of various sizes and subjects. Last week the staffs completed a series of three orientation programs which demonstrated through films, slides, demonstrations and discussion many educational methods. Children will be taught to use slides, films, tapes and records. Teachers will help the children select the media which would be most beneficial for the student to master a particular skill. As soon as a student masters a skill he will move on to the next instead of waiting for the rest of the class as sometimes happens in a regular classroom. Saloom is optimistically looking forward to the multiunit school organization starting in September. "It is getting down to education in its purest form," he said, "and the children will have a greater opportunity for success."

# Welfare Reforms, Security Boosts In House Victory

WASHINGTON (AP) — Welfare reform, including the first and taxes, would go up in future federally guaranteed minimum years to keep pace with living family income, has won House approval along with harvesting adjustment feature, payroll tax, and other provisions of the massive legislative package, touching in one way or another the lives of most Americans, now goes to the Senate where its fate won't be decided until at least late this year.

The House Tuesday turned back, 234 to 187 an unconservative-liberal coalition's attempt to eliminate the bill's welfare section. Then the measure was passed unchanged, 288 to 132.

The winners, like the losers, represented an extraordinary combination: President Nixon's emissaries working closely with Democratic leaders.

After the vote, Nixon issued a statement through the White House urging prompt Senate action on the bill he said is designed to "build people up, rather than pull them down."

He said it "offers the nation at least a way out of the present welfare morass" through strong work requirement and work incentives and benefits "for workers whose earnings are inadequate to support their families."

The national income standard builds up "levels of opportunity for our most valued asset—our children," the President said, "while the Social Security portion strikes a blow against poverty for the elderly."

The bill would sweep away the present state welfare system, with its 44 different sets of benefit levels, eligibility rules and procedures, and substitute a federally administered plan.

It would assure a minimum annual income of \$2,400 for a family of four and include the working poor, possibly adding as many as 10 million persons to the current 15 million welfare recipients.

States could supplement the federal payments—many already pay more—but would not be required to do so.

Welfare reform would cost the federal government an estimated \$2.4 billion and save states \$1.8 billion at present support levels.

The Social Security provisions would boost benefits for more than 27 million recipients and Saturday with clearing Sunday-like payroll taxes, although persons still working would receive even greater benefits at retirement.

A 5 per cent across-the-board benefit increase would be effective.

## State Rolls
