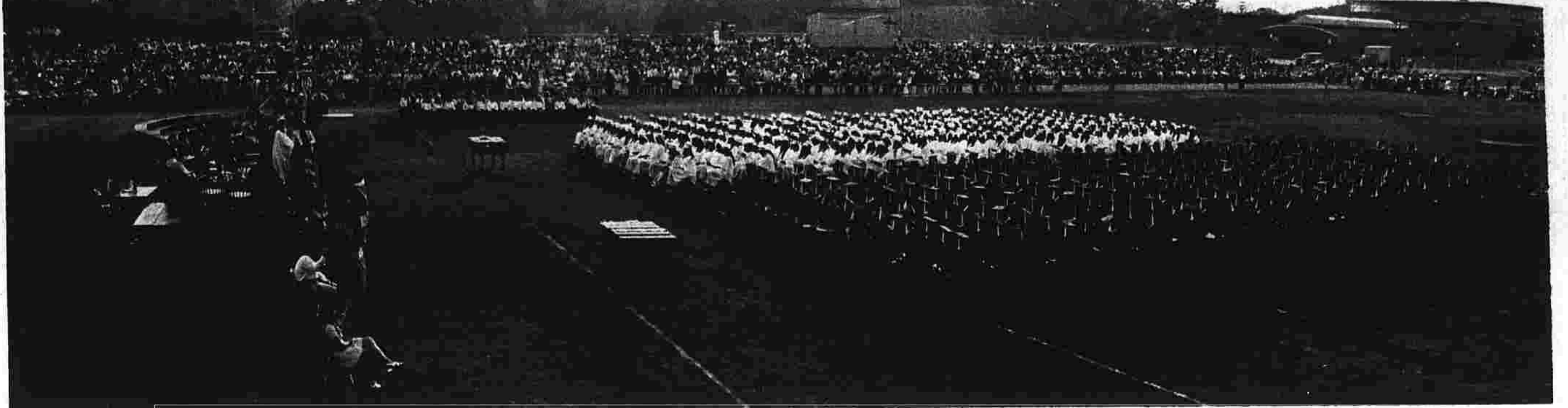

680 MHS Seniors Become Alumni In Exercises at Memorial Field



There are several expressions on graduation night, and with this group of grads it's confetti.

Simply, and happily, it did not rain, so 680 Manchester High School seniors became alumni last night at Memorial Field without the pressure of black clouds overhead that have plagued graduation ceremonies there in 9 of the past 12 years.

It was a little windy and a little hazy as the white-robed young women and the maroon-robed young men assembled promptly at 6:15 outside Clarke Arena. Few were late, and the color bearers continued down the center of the aisle.

After the singing of the National Anthem, Miss Valda stepped to the platform, raised and lowered her streamer'd baton as a signal for the graduates to sit, move or less in unison. She took a moment to greet not only the parents and friends who gathered in the bleachers and encircled the field, but also to greet the graduates.

There were smiles all around, excitement, and a bit of a blasé attitude, perhaps because the sun had shone for all the senior week activities and was not to disappoint the graduates for their final exercises together.

At about 8:30, the procession moved toward the west end of Memorial Field, and the line stretched all the way back to where the diplomas were stacked alphabetically and waiting along the east classroom wing.

The first strain from "Aida" became audible at 9:40 and about then the commencement speaker, Dr. Joseph D. Duffey of Hartford, joined the other principals in the commensation on the platform.

At the stroke of 6:45, organist Karen Krizjak sounded the opening chords of Verdi's "Triumphal March" and the 15-minute procession began. First to pass through the gothic was the Class of 1971 motto "We should live, not merely exist," embroidered in white on a red banner and supported by pillars Kim Crowley and Chelsey Balesano.

Color Bearers

In measured step behind them were the color bearers, including Student Council President Martin Mear with the national flag, Mark Mokala with the state flag and James Mastor with the school flag. All are members of the Class of 1972.

The first graduates to march down the center of the field were Miss Kathryn Valda, class president, at the head of the side line; and Jaleo Ortes,

vice president, leading the boys in "The Grading of America," of which, the graduates, arranged from smaller to taller, separated to take their seats from the outside, while the color bearers continued down the center of the aisle.

After the singing of the National Anthem, Miss Valda stepped to the platform, raised and lowered her streamer'd baton as a signal for the graduates to sit, move or less in unison. She took a moment to greet not only the parents and friends who gathered in the bleachers and encircled the field, but also to greet the graduates.

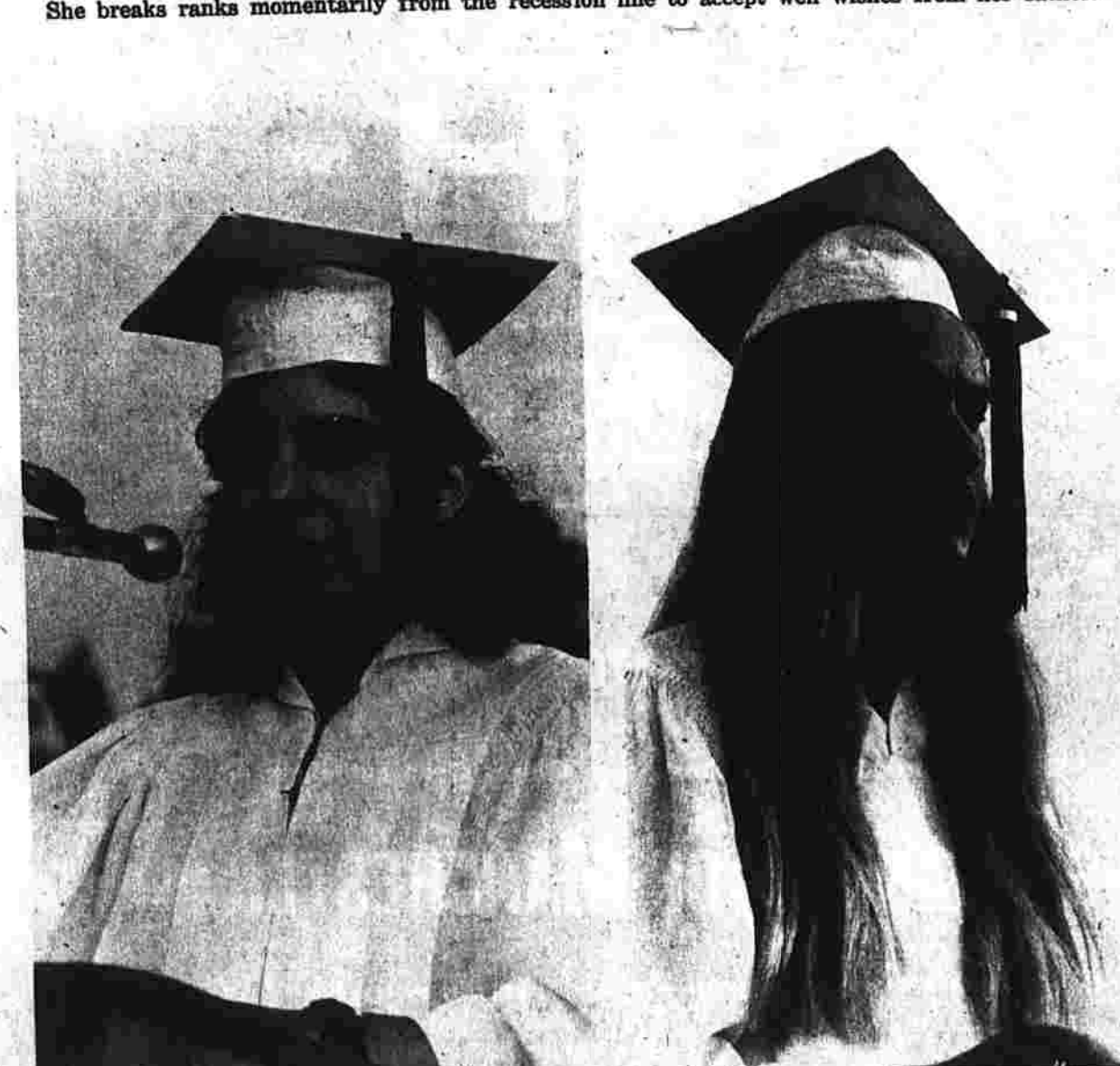

The avenue to reach a renewed awareness of nature, of other people, and of an individual's unique potential is often a painful, lonely, and frustrating one, Miss Cohen said. Two of them, she added, complex personal questions are avoided, but in doing so, we "relinquish whatever small measure of control we have over our own lives."

Miss Cohen urged the graduates to question whether the rule they play in society is the "result of the most subtle form of an all-encompassing cultural control."

Quoting Erich Fromm, she asked whether opinions are formed through self-examination and thought or whether they are imposed as those of the majority.

Concluding, the valedictorian said, "To live for the self is to live with sensitivity to the wants and needs of others of ourselves and of our brothers. It is to recognize ugliness and to work to change it, but not to let that ugliness destroy our appreciation of the beautiful in the world around us."

And it is to "discover man through knowledge, through concern and through love."

Johansson Dead at Ninety, Selectman in Mid-Twenties

Carl E. Johansson, 90, of 488 Center St., who served three terms as town selectman in the 1920's, died last night at Manchester Memorial Hospital. He was the husband of Mrs. Lillian Johansson.

Mr. Johansson was born June 18, 1880 in Goharby, Sweden. He came to Manchester in 1907, and was employed as a construction supervisor for the building of the Lincoln School. After the school was erected, he stayed here and became a contractor, building many Manchester homes.

He was elected a town selectman in 1924, 1925 and 1926. He was a director of the former Home Bank and Trust Co. at 800 Main St., where the Manchester Public Market is now located. He and his wife celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary on Memorial Day.

Mr. Johansson was employed as maintenance engineer at Manchester Memorial Hospital for 15 years before he retired at the age of 80. He was a member of Calvary Temple in Hartford.

Survivors, besides his wife, are a son, C. Frederick Johansson, 65, of 1000 Main St., and two sisters, Mrs. Esther Dahlberg of Meriden and Mrs. Charlotte Johansson of Providence, R.I.; two grandchildren, three great-grandchildren, and several nieces and nephews.
