The "Isolationists" Are Not Vice President Agnew, in some of his nterviews abroad, like President Nixon in some of his domestic comments, professes to live in fear of a resumption of something he calls "isolationism" in

tors, too - have succeeded, lately in orrowing the term "isolationist" from its true meaning and applying it in a pecial meaning all their own.

In its true meaning, "isolationist describes the position of somebody who wants the United States to retire from the world into its own shell, declining international obligations, associations and responsibilities. Lately, however, this term has been

applied indiscriminately to everybody and anybody who disagrees with the way the United States conducts itself abroad, or who objects to some of the apparent purposes of its conduct abroad.

We don't doubt that there are some Americans who, in despair over the direction and the possible futility of some of our policies abroad, have an emotional tendency to try to have us wash our hands of the world and retire into some snug fortress America all our own, heads into.

But the great majority of American who win the title of isolationist because they disagree with the methods and objectives their country is employing in some instances in the world today are not isolationists at all, but the nation's true internationalists.

They believe America must be in the world, but as its number one citizen, not its number one policeman.

They believe in the inevitability and the potentiality of an international system of law and order such as that represented by the Charter of the United Nations, and they therefore believe in the surrender of some of their own nationalistic sovereignty, not in retiring to try to build a new high wait around it. They believe that America and its acts

should be answerable to all mankind, and should not be considered privileged to immunity inside any concept of policy which some secret consultation of American leaders might decide to be vital to the "national interest" or the "national

Most of those being termed isolationists in this present phase of history are those who want to take America into the world in what they feel to be the right way, not retire from it. The President, the Vice President, and some commentators have been lecturing the wrong people for the wrong reasons and, incidentally, delivering to us all a coy invitation to look upon themselves as our truest internationalists!

The President Bets Big We can think of one entirely non-economic reason for having some respect for President Nixon's latest decision on the economic front.

It was a decision not to reach for any more inflationary-type stimulus for the 'sconomy in an effort to speed an improvement in the nation's employment,

There was a period, immediately after tepublican reverses in the elections last lovember, when President Nixon almost openly embraced the theories of those economists who think that the way to get out of a recession is to spend our way out of it.

Since then, both inflation statistics and ployment statistics have continued matisfactory, both slowing their wrongdirection movement, but seither yet beginning any clear move in the right di-

Recently, the President has been reiving, and has now rejected, considerable advice that he should open the inflationary valves a little wider and run the risk that inflation would climb still more in order to obtain a quicker turn upward in the employment statistics. The reason we cite today for respecting the President's decision is not economic, but political.

We don't think there is much doubt in the President's mind, or in the mind of any political analyst, that it is going to be the economic state of the nation which is the dominant factor in the 1972 presidential election.

When, therefore, President Nixon decides on a certain economic policy in July of 1971, it is his own political life and death which he is putting on the line. For us, it is a matter of prices and jobs. For him it is a matter of his own job and power. Add it all up either way, and he is risking at least as much for himself as he risks for the rest of us. One thing we know for sure: he doesn't want to lose and he doesn't intend to

There is no guarantee that this makes him a wise economist.

All we hope is that, no matter what the political results may be, inflation begins at least to hold still, and employ ment begins to inch upward, as, apparently. President Nixon is convinced they have already begun to do.
