





Such campaigns may shame or harass responsible ouples into having fewer children than they really want. But they will not reduce the birth rate of people so irresponsible that neither poverty nor lack of a

marriage licenso can dissuade them om having children they don't want. Such gimmicles may stabilize our pop-ulation. But they will do it from the top down, ensuring that a greater proportion spring of irresponsible unions and that fewer and fewer come from stable, hap-

So let's target our population control on the least responsible instead of the most responsible people in our popula-tion. Let's put the sacredness of human life back in the center of our morality and stop all those abortions. Let's allo people to have as many children as their hearts have room for, and still reduce our population. In short, let's find something to put in the water. — MICHAEL MALLOY IN THE NATIONAL OB-


