But there has been the definite beginning of loss of trees, during the same period, from the increase in Connecticut of tree defoliators, and the fact that one tree, the oak, seems to be the preferred host for many of the insect pests has led the Experiment Station to predict that Connecticut woodlands may wear a quite different character a few decades from now. By that time, say the Station scientists the oak may have almost disappeared from our woodlands, with our maples and birches increasing in its place There is a limit to the number of times a tree can take defoliation, and still live. Must we then, prepare to say farewell to the oak, as we have already had to lament the chestnut, as we are currently taking what may be our last few years of enjoyment out of our elms? The chestnut was famous, when we

split grain of any wood. The elm is the only tree really graceful enough for an oriole's nest, and the most difficult to split of any wood. The oak is our traditional symbol of great strength -the wood we select to place where we expect the greatest weight to be borne, or the greatest stress to be taken -and the wood men like to imitate in heart and

sinew and stalwartness. We cannot afford the loss of the elm, which had little use outside of its shade
