There seems to be no question, therefore, that we are in for an extended siege of Pyramid-building, and it is only a matter of time before the corps of engineers begins prospecting for sites. Whacky Wardrobes A Laugh-In Must

HOLLYWOOD (AP) - When the star's pants fall down or the leading lady trips on her dress, most costume designers cry. Michael Travis laughs.

Travis is the prolific designer who turns out 350 wildly colored, flamboyant-and purposely funny-costumes per week for the "Laugh-In" television

His trademark is that his clothes do get into the act.

Fondly, he recalls the show on which comedian Don Rickles, dressed as a trapeze artist, almost lost his trousers. "He kept tugging at them-it really made the scene funnier.'

"Laugh-In," the weekly variety-comedy series now in its fifth year on the air, hit it big with a format based on "blackouts," one-minute gag scenes ending with a quick, funny

Stars featured in each scene need new outfits even for quick shots. Thus, "Lahgh-In" perhaps more costumes than any running series on the air. Each segement also featurs musical production numbers which require identical fantasyoriented costumes for stars, dancers and singers.

Travis recalls one such production for which he dressed everyone as Romanian gypsies. The costumes were a real mish-mash. I rented red velvet boots that didn't fit anyone right. They kept falling down around their ankles while they danced. It was great."

The show's producer George Schlatter appraises most of Travis' work before it's seen succeeded when Schlatter gasps, 'Michael, they're so awful! They're marvelous!"

Travis, a bachelor in his 40s and a native of Detroit, drifted into theatrical designing after studying fashion design in Paris and finding costume work was more lucrative-and more fun.

"This is probably the most fun I've ever had designing clothes," says the dark-haired, mustachioed designer. "Everything is brighter and gayer than ordinary street clothes."

When he's not working on "Laugh-In," Travis designs elegant gowns for singer Dionne Warwick's night club act and period costumes for productions of the Hollywood Television Theater. He did the clothes for the award-winning "Andersonville Trial."
