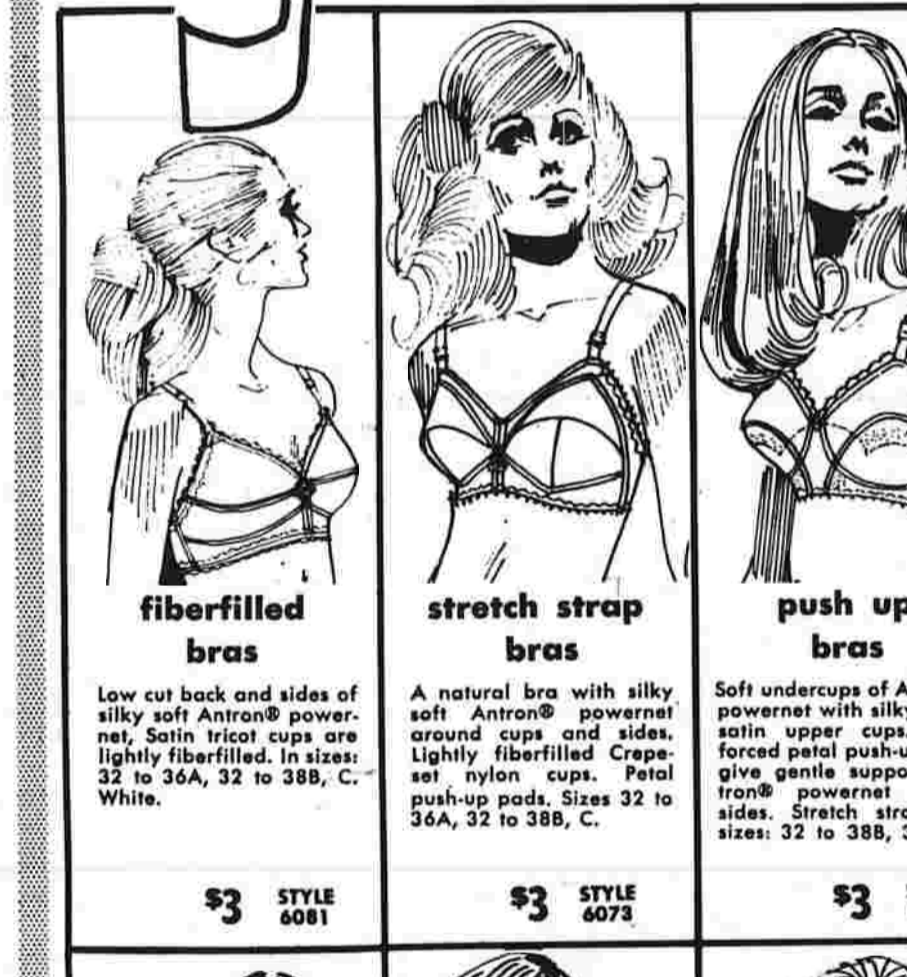

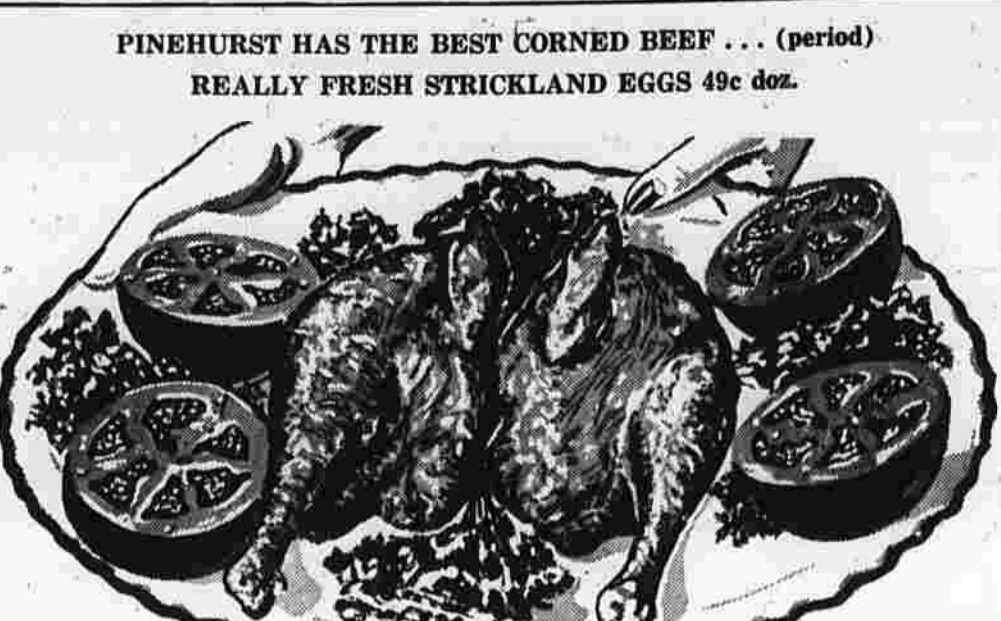

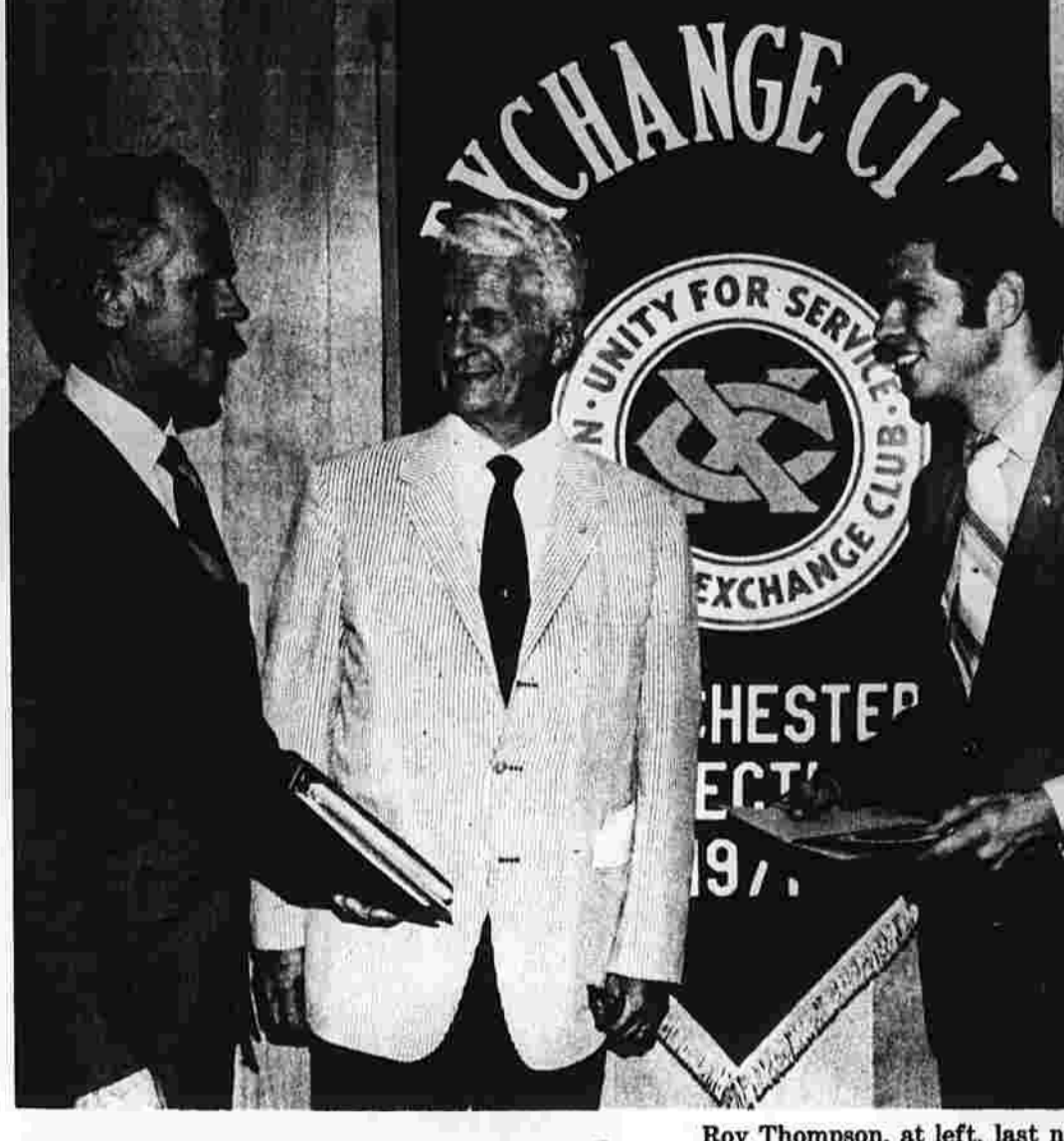

"Alaska's economy is in many respects tied closer to Japan than to the continental United States," says a recent report from the Alaska Department of Economic Development.

Japanese capital investment in Alaska is estimated to exceed \$200 million—more than the total Japanese investment in the other 49 states, says the report.
