MHS Changes Provide More Learning Time

George Emmerling, Manchester High School principal, says that returning students will find a number of policy, procedure, and program changes in effect, in addition to the retention of those made in the second semester last year.

The philosophy underlying most of them, he explained, is to provide more learning time and try to make more constructive use of free periods.

To accomplish the first, an effort has been made to increase the academic load of underclassmen, especially sophomores, he said; and the school day has been lengthened from six to eight periods. However, periods have been shortened from 50 to 41 minutes. School will open at 8 a.m. with dismissal at 2:15 p.m., Monday through Friday. For some years, Friday dismissal has been at 1:37 p.m.

At least three approaches will be made to use free periods more efficiently, Emmerling said: Exposure of a greater number of students to more facets of the business world and town government; placement of language teachers in language laboratories, computer personnel in computer rooms, etc. for additional instruction; and encouragement of student aide and teacher training programs with the school system.

New courses have been added in the social studies, mathematics, science, business, industrial arts, art, and music departments. All English courses will be one semester.

The Cooperative Occupational Education Program and distributive education program have been reorganized to permit doubling pupil enrollment in these work-study groups. The computer program will be expanded to involve additional students from the science, mathematics, and business departments.

A room adjacent to the library, formerly used for English classes, is being transformed into an independent study room, equipped with carrels to accommodate about 35 students. Another arts and crafts room will be created on the first floor.

Another departure is a seven-minute homeroom period after the first morning period. In the past, the homeroom period has been held at the beginning of school. As with class periods, lunch hours will be conducted in three 41-minute segments between 11:15 a.m. and 1:25 p.m. In addition, the cafeteria will be open throughout the day for snacks.

The third lunch period will be primarily for Illing Junior High School ninth graders. Because

of overlapping sessions at MHS this year, the Illing Grade 9 school day will run from 9:25 a.m. to 3:01 p.m. MHS students may have lunch in school or off the grounds. Continuing a policy instituted last year, the administration will permit senior high students to smoke outside the building during unassigned time.

Finally, portions of the exterior have taken on a new look since June. During the summer, the maintenance department painted trim around the entrances in a variety of gay colors. On the front lawn, facing E. Middle Tpke. is the gift of the Class of 1969 — a long sign against whose white background is MHS in red letters and Manchester High School spelled out in blue.

Stands Up Well

CHICAGO — Training programs have been maintained by most companies even in the current economic downturn, a survey by the Dartnell Institute of Business Research shows. Of a group of typical firms polled, 16.3 per cent indicated they were increasing their training programs while only 13.1 per cent were cutting them back. The remainder were maintaining training as is. These figures contrasted with a 47 per cent decrease in participation in outside industry meetings, conventions, seminars and workshops.

Town Adopts Joint Annuity Pension Choice

The Pension Board yesterday agreed to use a pension reduction table recommended by the board's actuary, The Martin E. Segal Co., for those people who retire from town jobs and elect a joint annuity option.

Under the plan, which is already included in the pension ordinance, a town employee could choose, three years before his retirement, to receive a reduced pension during his life time so that his wife, or any other joint annuitant, could receive the same pension payment until her death if she survives him.

John Murphy from the Segal Co. presented the complex table. If a person elects the joint annuity option, his base pension is increased slightly. This slightly increased figure is used in computing the reduced monthly payments under the joint annuity plan.

For example, a person who was to get a \$5,000 per year pension would have that figure increased to \$5,077. He would be eligible for a pension of \$418.67 per month. If he elected the joint annuity option, he would get \$299.58 per month until his death, and his joint annuitant, if she were to survive him, would get the same amount until her death.

This example assumes that

the man retires at age 65 and his wife or joint annuitant is two years younger than he is. Monthly pension payments in individual cases would be based on retirement age and age of the joint annuitant.

If a person does not choose the joint annuity option three years before he retires, he may do so at any time up until his evidence of good health.

The joint annuity plan does not increase any costs to the pension fund.

Fred Geyer, chairman of the pension board, directed Mrs. Rosalind Quish, town treasurer, to begin a program of notifying town employees of the joint annuity option when they are within three and one half years of age 65.

Geyer also directed Murphy to update the pension fund booklet for town employees. It was agreed by the board members present that the question and answer format should be used. A new booklet will be printed after Murphy has completed the revision.

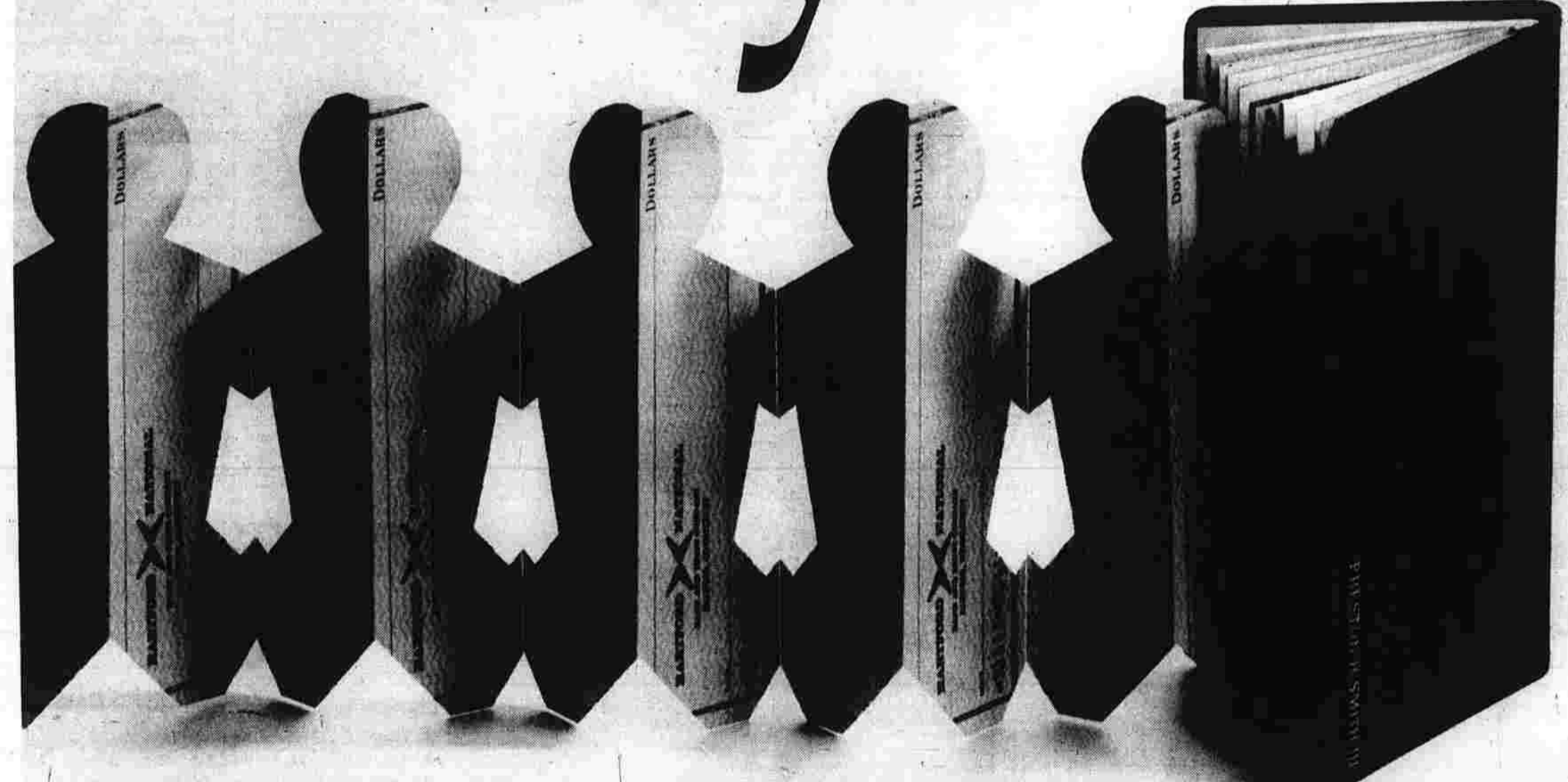
