Actually the garden pepper is capsicum frutescens while the true pepper is piper nigrum. Wherever voyagers touched the American tropics during the 16th century, they found peppers in many forms. Of the many weelstless known to us today. varieties known to us today, all had been found by the begin-

ning of the 17th century. The Spaniards called hot peppers chili (from the country Chile). Mild or sweet peppers are called pimenta or pimiento in Spain. When we talk about dimientos in the U.S., we mean a bright red sweet pepper, the kind you find in the center of green olives.
Paprika is made from the

pods of a cultivated pepper plant. After seeding, the pods are dried and then powdered. Tabasco sauce is made from the tabasco pepper. Cayenne, another red hot pepper, takes its name from a coastal city in French Guiana, South America.





Even if it meant not obtaining income increases already scheduled or bargained for or contracted for, we could still, each of us, visualize ourselves, inside our own economic experience, achieving a state of being very well off if only we could be sure that prices were going to stay the same, for the future.

Unfortunately for the smooth success of the new Nixon economic game plan, perhaps unfortunately for us all, we do not content ourselves with asking that single question and abiding by its honest
