Reformers of Prison System Confront Centuries of Neglect

Editor's note: The following report, concluding a three-part series, examines the movement toward prison reform and its major obstacles: Parsimony, apathy and two centuries neglect.)

was noticed a few days after Tropical Storm Doria, you may have blamed the storm. State Forester Harry McKusick, whose home is in Coventry says the storm is not the cause of the colon change. Individual trees, or branches, that have changed color in the middle of September are giving a signal that they have been under stress of some sort, however. It may be insect damage. It may be the result of highway salt thrown off the road when winter snow was plowed. It may be the belated effect of drought during the dry summers that we had for several years, not including the current season. Maples have shallow roots and if they grow on rocky ledges, they suffered during those years from lack of water. Mr. McKusick thinks that fall foliage color generally will not be early this year, but more likely will be late. Where trees were defoliated by insects and then put out new leaves, the foliage will need additional time to reach maturity.





Jusice Harlan Retires The Supreme Court has lost another

of its pillars. Associate Justice John Marshall Har-

lan, like his recently retired colleague Justice Hugo L. Black, considered himself a strict constructionist. The two men rarely constructed the Constitution in the same way. The pity in losing the services of Justice Harlan is that he was almost the ideal Justice for the "Nixon Court."

The President said last night that in choosing replacements he was primarily concerned with the matter of "judicial philosophy." Justice Harlan has been politically conservative, a strict constructionist who believed that social problems should be rectified through the political process, not through the courts. The President has pledged to change the "judicial philosophy" represented by the Warren Court, and Justice Harlan was a substantive dissenter to that Court.

While Justice Black's kind of strict construction led him to support individual rights, Justice Harlan tended to defend government institutions and large corporations. Justice Black had been a great dissenter when first appointed by President Roosevelt, and then found himself in the majority in the Warren Court. ustice Harlan's dissents from the Warren Court will undoubtedly serve as guidelines for the Nixon Court as it swings away from liberal interpretations of the Bill of Rights. Unlike his colleague, Harlan will not have the satisfaction of seeing his dissents become woven into majority opinions while a member of the Court.

The double resignations of Black and Harlan bring into sharp focus the interesting interplay of liberal vs. conservative politics and strict vs loose construction which makes the Supreme Court so interesting, and at times complex. Of these four variables, Harian fitted the Nixon preference for strict construction and conservative politics, and his loss will not change the voting of the Court appreciably.

There are two marking aspects of Justice Harlan's career on the Supreme Court which distinguish him. He was a man of substance and stature. And he was a craftsman. Harlan's opinions are respected by students of the Court as scholarly and carefully written. He was truly a lawyer's judge and a man who commanded respect for himself and for the Court.

The President will not appoint a man of markedly different judicial outlook than Justice Harlan. He should choose a nominee whose respect for the Constitution and for his own opinions are high and whose depth and breadth of vision are commensurate with this position. Hopefully the President feels secure enough not to insuit the Court and the nation with another onslaught of mediocrity as in the Carswell nomination. If he does, the country and Senate should . be prepared to be as strident and demanding as before.

Replacing Justic Harian will be a considerable challenge.

Muskie Pulls A Moynihan

Senator Edmund S. Muskie's "not now" comment may turn into the version of former Presidential Advisor Daniel Patrick Moynihan's "benign neglect.

And Musicie learned long ago that the response to such affectionate probes has to be both politically sound and quotable. (Some newsmen even kee files so if a politician stays in the busi ess long enough he may have to be come consistent as well.) But Muskle blew it this time. His response was passable if read in its entirety, but it contained a most unquotable quote. A black candidate for vice president i "not-electable now," Muskie said.

When Pat Moynihan made such mis takes it was more understandable though he has never been forgiven Moynihan was writing a confidential memo to the President of the United States, and not all such memoes are subjected to the editor's scrutiny. Moynihan was a professor, standing in as a politician, and professors are occasionally allowed to let their guard down and be straightforward. Moynihan was an expansive Irishman with a flare for words who got too cute, and one whose job was to counsel a President. He was not a seasoned veteran and former vice presidential candidate who knows that any potential boner will be made into one. So when Movnihan wrote that the United States Government should attack poverty and lessen rhetoric, that the administration should emphasize more jobs and a guaranteed annual income for the poor and main tain a "benign neglect" of racial tensions and racial conflict by doing so, the press had a field day. One wonders why they give such naive academics the job of writing confidential memoes in the first place.

But a presidential candidate! The Muskie forces even waited until the next morning to answer the headlines with What-he-meant-to-say-was. . . What Muskie evidently meant to say was that he was running for the purpose of winning in order to attack the problems of blacks and other minorities, and that given the mood of the country, he and a black running mate might both lose. Thank goodness no one asked him a follow-up question about what he thought George McGovern reassured us of some sanity in the Democratic party by quickly announcing that he was not going to rule anybody off the ticket on the basis of race or sex.

offered himself for sacrific it was only fitting that the President should be the one to administer the coup de grace to Muskle. Standing on his sterling record in civil rights and integration, and flanked by his own Vice-President, a paragon of racial understanding and a favorite of black communities, Nixon finished off the good Senator from Maine by saying: "I think it is very important for those of us in positions of leadership not to tell a large number of people in America, whoever they are, that because of the accident of their birth they don't have a chance to go to the top.'

Obviously the only honorable thing for Musicie to do is to acknowledge defeat. But where would he go? Unlike the unquotable Moynihan, Muskie doesn't have a professorship at Harvard waiting for him. And he can't withdraw from the residential race because he hasn' entered it. He has no way out, ! and peither the press nor the President, nor his Democratic comrades are being fair.

We think Muskle should clarify his statement. He was misquoted. What he really said was that a black as vice president was "not neglectable now." And if the press doesn't stop distorting what he says, he's going to resign. And no one will have Ed Muskie to kick around

In a world beset by war, death, bombings, starvation enocide, and a disease, it would seem hat any woman could find more to cry about than the prospect of her child shar-ing a bus or a classroom with his black brother.
