

It's going to happen sooner or later, so why not go down in history as the first President to break the ridiculous barrier that has made this an all-male preserve? Neither the President nor his dministration have endeared themselves to women's organizations. In fact last month they drew the wrath of women's liberation groups when the Secretary of State and the President jokingly dismissed Gloria Steinem as "One of Henry Kissingers old girl friends.'
