Now that the explosion has taken place at Amchitka, and there has, apparently, been no escape of radioactivity, and certainly no earthquake or tidal wave, we do not find those who opposed having the test take place breathing any grateful signs of relief.

Strangely enough, although the test proved completely safe so far as all their special fears were concerned, they are still against having had the test

complete candor.

They fall back, now, on the claim tha t might have been a near thing, that there might have been a tidal wave, or earthquake, and that the Atomic Energy Commission didn't really take as much precaution as it might have.

In short, they resent the test Amehitka just about as much, now it has been a success, as they would have resented it if it had proved some kind of horrible failure.

They probably consider nuclear experimental success even more dangerous for civilization than any dramatic

But the events since January 1 should make the public realise that TV adversample of nuclear test failure. If this is the way they really feel, one can at least concede them a big chance of being right. Some kind of disaster at Amchitka might conceivably have sobered the whole world, for a moment or two. But success at Amchitka seems, in the aftermath, a reassuring thing which

keeps the whole world heading down the nuclear armaments race track, as if that, too, had somehow been guaranteed to be harmless.

There was cace a time, when the nuclear threat was new, when it seemed possible that mankind might pause and consider and try to decide what to do about it. Now, for some time, it has seemed that we are going to continue heading toward that eventual nuclear rendezvous as if everything were quite all right, just as something which may have been totally wrong proved quite all right at Amchitka.

In the main, we subscribe to the senti ments the Waterbury Republican voiced the other day when it asked: "Hallo ween, Who Needs It?" It is a holiday which has lost most of

its original spirit, which creates much more real fear than fancied frolic, and which requires an inordinate amount of adult headache to preserve the illusion of fun for the young.

But there is, after all, somebody who needs it.

The pumpkin grower needs it. Every year, he produces mountains and mountains of pumpkins of the coarse field variety for which, in these days when cows and pigs are vanishing from the landscape, there is no sensible use except that of being centered in displays or being hollowed out to make jack-o'

We never know who grows pumpking but we do know that, every year, twice as many appear at the roadsides as even the Halloween economy needs. We assume, since the same great quantity appears every year, that somebody finds their growth profitable. Accordingly, this chapter in the society for preservation of traditional New England rural enterprise casts one vote for the continuance of some form of Halloween until either one of two things happens - another market is found for the pumpkins - or the artificial pumpkin makes its way on the market, to be sold in bargain conjunction with, and stored with, the artificial Christmas tree.
