Circuit Court Case Backlog In Reduction

NEW HAVEN (AP) Figures released by the Con-necticut Circuit Court show a statewide reduction in the backlog of court cases from June, 1970 to June, 1971, the Con-necticut Public Expenditure Council reports. At the end of fiscal 1970, the CPEC said, 98,519 civil cases were pending. The end of fiscal 1971 had only 77,325, a 20 per cent reduction, still waiting for

final court action.

The Sixth Circuit had the longest wait for disposition of nonjury civil cases during the period, with a wait of 46 months. In that circuit, civil matters heard by a jury required an average of 36 months. The Sixth Circuit encompasses New Haven, Beth-any and Woodbridge. In contrast, the Seventh Cir-cuit, which also encompasses New Haven County commu-nities of Cheshire, Hamden,

Meriden, North Haven and Wallingford, had the fastest service. The CPEC said the Seventh Circuit had an average nine-month wait for nonjury cases and four months for those involving a jury.

During the period, 58,000 out of 68,000 dispositions were settled out of court. The longest time for such cases also was in

the Sixth Circuit, where it took an average 34 months out-ofcourt settlement."
The report also shows that 60 per cent of all civil litigation was handled by circuits encompassing only 31 per cent of the state's population. These were the Sixth Circuit; the Second Circuit, or Greater Bridgeport area; the First Circuit, of southern Fairfield County; and the 14th Circuit or Hartford.

been at the wheel continuously for 18 hours; another was ex-hausted from overwork; a third had kept going after twice almost "fading out." In each case, when the driver dozed off, be was held

able for the results. Suppose it is the passenger, not the driver, who falls asleep. Does the law frown on that too? Occasionally the passenger does have a duty to stay awake when he has some special reason to think that the driver needs watching. But as a rule he may nap at will, putting his trust in the driver to take care. In one case a woman in the back seat dozed off and slumped against the driver's seat, pushing it forward and knocking his

hands off the steering wheel. In the crash that followed, the driver was injured.

Could he collect damages from the woman on the theory that her falling asleep was an act of negligence? A court said no, beause a passenger could scarcely se expected to anticipate such a reakish accident just from fall-

LONDON (AP) — Rudolf Bing was knighted yesterday by Queen Elizabeth II and emerged shivering from Buck-ingham Palace, saying: "That place is certainly not over-heated."

The 69-year-old general manager of the New York Metropolitan Opera paused briefly outside the palace on a bright chilly day.

He proudly displayed the regalia of Knight Commander of the British Empire with its blue and gold cross worn around the neck with a rose-pink ribbon and its accompanying silver

and its accompanying silver star. Earlier Bing, who was born in Austria but holds Brit-ish citizenship, knelt before the queen who touched him on both shoulders with a ceremonial sword saying "arise, Sir Ru-

"The queen graciously spoke to me and asked if I had come over to London, from New York, especially for the in-vestiture and I told her I had," Buckingham Palace said the Knighthood was bestowed for Bing's services to British-American relations.

Bing is returning to New York today to work on a new production of Wagner's operaproduction of Wagner's opera Tristan and Isolde. Born in Vienna, Bing came to Britain in 1935. For 14 years he was general manager of the Glyndebourne Opera and from 1947 to 1949 he was also general administrator of the Edinburgh nternational Festival. 




