

In The Clear

It now seems possible to hope that President Nixon's new Supreme Court nominees are going to be confirmed without any of that last minute swelling of opposition which greeted two of his previous choices. Although there are obviously liberals in the United States Senate who do not relish allowing President Nixon to put a firmer conservative stamp on the Court, they have just as obviously, by any of their protest or argument or research to date, failed to uncover any evidence that the President's two nominees, Lewis F. Powell, Jr., and William H .Rehnquist, are lacking in legal ability, or are stained by any shocking ghosts of statements or affiliations sleeping somewhere in their own past.

In such a situation, what emerges as clear and unchallenged is President Nixon's right to pick justices of his own ideological liking and persuasion, just as it was Franklin D. Roosevelt's privilege to liberalize the Court in his time. It remains legitimate for those Senators who can't swallow such conservatism under any circumstances to continue their opposition, if they must:

possess, now, any of the auxiliary ammunition which was available to them in two previous instances. In such a situation they would be forgiven, we think, even by some of their own most fervent followers, if they simply confessed and acknowledged that two great and dominant veins of political thought not only joined to found this nation out have since alternated repeatedly throughout the story of its growth and, in the main, successful operation of a democratic form of government.

It was Jefferson and Hamilton at the beginning, and it has been Jefferson and Hamilton ever since, and we don't think that any sound historian of either the liberal or the conservative school would ever care to pronounce, in retrospect, that it would have been better for us if it had been either all Jefferson or all Hamilton.

The only real limit or qualification on President Nixon's right to give the Supreme Court his kind of turn has been in the realm of the ability and personal character of his nominees. The answers for nominees Powell and Rehnquist, in that department, have been clearly positive.

If there is any ideological warning to be delivered, perhaps that ought to go back to President Nixon himself, to remind him that the high atmosphere of the Court has frequently, in the past, produced mystifying changes in the philosophical chromosomes of people appointed to it.

Membership For Formosa

That an injustice was done when the United Nations voted to deny representation to the 14,000,000 inhabitants of the island of Formosa is generally admitted. It was a cynical, ruthless decision which held, on the one hand, that it was high time the United Nations stopped excluding the hundreds of millions of people in mainland China, but which, nevertheless, on the other hand, felt no qualms about disenfranchising the much fewer

number of people on Formosa. The trouble was, of course, that the people of Formosa were not being represented in their own right, as the 14,-000,000 people of Formosa.

They were condemned to serve, instead, as the population substance in the pretext that General Chiang Kaishek was still ruler of a part of China. It was Formosa posing as China which was thrown out of the United Nations.

But the injustice in that action might be cured if, in the near future, it could come about that Formosa could apply for membership as Formosa, with a government which labeled itself For-

mosan, and did not pretend to be the legal ruler of the Chinese mainland. How one would set about creating such a circumstance we do not pretend to imagine, even in this era of somewhat lurid international plotting.

Victory In Defeat

It took political ccurage for members of the House of Representatives to vote against a proposed constitutional amendment to permit "voluntary" prayers in public schools, but those who voted against it did a service to the nation and religion as well.

By a vote of 240 to 162 the House voted for the amendment. It was lost, how-ever, since the affirmative vote was 28 less than the two-thirds majority requir ed for passage, Among those who voted against the proposal from Connecticu were Reps. Ella T .Grasso, whose Sixth District includes Southington, and Rep William R. Cotter of the First District both freshmen in the House. The other Connecticut Representatives, Giaimo, McKinney, Monagan and Steele, voted

Few subjects have provoked more controversy in recent years than the ques-tion of prayers in public schools. The supreme Court ruled out such prayers and required Bible readings as being in violation of the First and 14th Amend ments. The First Amendment states, 'Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof. . ." The ith Amendment forbids a state to infringe on the constitutional right of an

The question of school prayers is an emotional issue. Many persons with the best of motives do not see the measure for what it is, an encroachment upon freedom of religion and a breaching of the separation of church and state under which the United States has grown to

It is significant that 38 major religious denominations opposed the prayers-in-school amendment on the ground that it would lead to religious intrusion. Among those who voted against it, it was Rep. Robert F. Drinan, D., Mass., a Roman Catholic priest. Father Drinan not only voted against it, but also spoke against it in the day-long debate, saying that the imendment would create "an ersatz reigion" dictated by the government.

The public school prayer amendment is a well-intentioned proposal which, if enacted, would open the door to abuses in the name of religion. The American nation is composed of Jew and Gentile, Moslem and Buddhist; atheist and believer; all of whom are entitled by the Constitution to equal rights, privileges, and protection under the law. History past and present - not overlooking the tragic impasse in Ulster - is replete with examples of what happens when olitics and religion mix.

By rejecting a proposal to put prayers into the public schools and thereby introduce religion officially into public the House of Representatives has done the nation a distinguished service. It has reaffirmed thereby the wisdom of the Founding Fathers, and assured the right free men to worship, pray, and practice whatever religion they choose. The House, and particularly those members of the house who had the courage and ne judgment to vote against the measure, are entitled to a vote of thanks from all lovers of liberty. The defeat of the proposal was a victory for constitugovernment and the American way of life.-MERIDEN RECORD
