Original I-86 Link Plans are Revived

A proposed new eight-lane expressway, Interstate 86, which will connect I-95 in Westchester to I-84 in Manchester, dislocated from the Charter Oak River at Hartford, to the Massachusetts line. The traffic situation will be further aggravated, he said, when I-84 is completed from Hartford to Providence. I-86 will provide relief, according to Deputy Commissioner George Koch, by adding another bridge over the Connecticut River. The new four-lane bridge will parallel the existing Wilbur Cross Highway to Blaisell Bridge between Westchester and Glastonbury. Interchanges from Westchester to Manchester will include connections to Rt. 2 (the state route) to Norwich expressway and at Forbes St. in East Hartford. Approximately 100 residential lots will be acquired, as well as 21.8 acres of open space land. 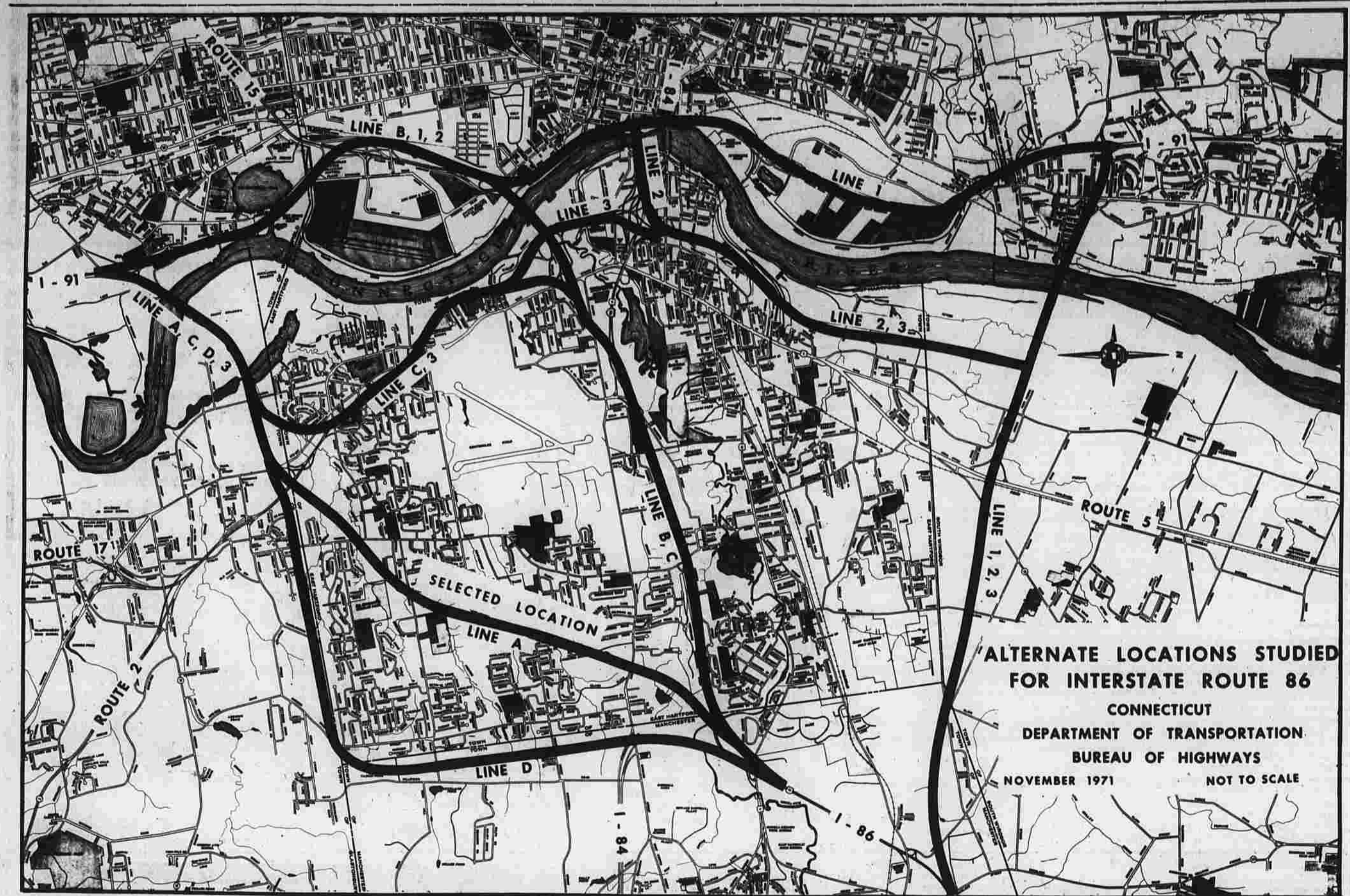

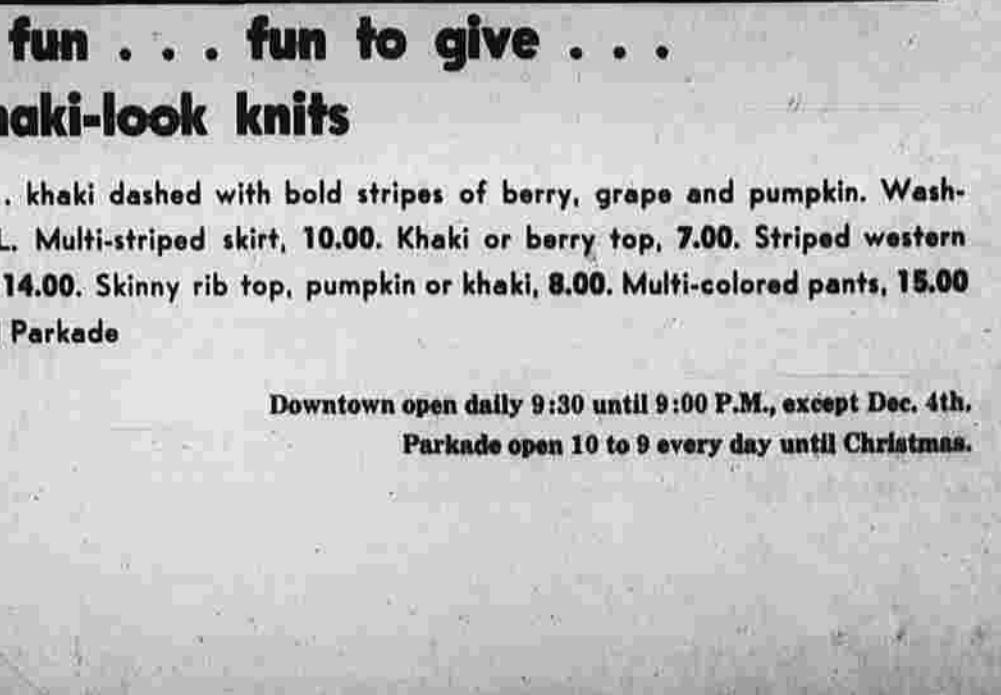

No One To Say No

Prime Minister Indira Gandhi, apparently feeling that she has Pakistan where she wants it, tells the rest of the world to mind its own business and let India and Pakistan settle their troubles by themselves.

The advantages she feels, in this situation, are lucidly explained in a Christian Science Monitor editorial reproduced on this page today. And the Monitor's hope that, in such a situation with such advantages, and such a hard-boiled talent for employing them, she will also prove reasonable and generous is a hope devoutly to be shared.

What the rest of the world faces is a situation of highest danger in which the outcome is being left to the two belligerents, and in which the warning of one of these for the rest of the world to keep hands off is an effective warning, which the rest of the world apparently accepts quite as if there had never been invented any supposed international system for trying to eliminate war from the future history of mankind.

So, while the hot, on the scene, at the moment question is that of how a lady Prime Minister is going to behave with her power politics advantage, the more fundamental and even more important question is that of how she can find and acquire, in a world which ought to know better, the power and the privilege of playing the game to the hilt.

And for the answer to that question, it is not India in particular and not Prime Minister Gandhi in person that should be put on the spot.

They are not the first who have ignored the existence of the United Nations when they knew what they wanted and thought they had the power to achieve it. They are not the first who have preferred world anarchy to world law, when they happened to feel capable of guiding the anarchy, and were afraid the law might hamper their pursuit of their own objectives.

Let's put it this way: India is merely asserting its right to behave like a big power, and none of the other big powers who are on record as having exercised this right themselves in contemporary world history, in spite of the existence of the United Nations, is in position to say an effective no to India now.

Twenty-six years ago we came out of a giant bloodbath of a jungle world looking and talking as if we had learned the necessity for putting ourselves under some restraint. Today we are all acting as if we were about to concede the necessity to head into the jungle again.

Plants Pollution Can Have

We note, with some admittedly partisan interest, that the same increase of pollution and pollution which accompanies the spread of civilization and thus endangers the lives of so many animal species in the world has now been discovered to be threatening the future of various types of green plants.

There is, in fact, an international movement under way, to spare and preserve such plants from extinction.

Our interest lies in a contrary direction.

We want to find out a way to put a few choices of our own on the list of green plants heading for extinction.

And once we discover the kind of pollution which will doom this select list of ours, we don't want any ecological dogooders coming along and figuring out ways of rescuing them.

We are for death and disappearance to multiflora, poison ivy, nettles, crab grass and brussels sprouts.

Death to multiflora, yes, because, once touted as the "living fence" of the countryside's future, it proceeds, wherever it obtains a footing, to turn all countryside into an impassable fence.

Down with poison ivy, because we can't stand the aloof, superior insolence of those fortunate souls who can touch it without harm.

Let nettles be gone from a world which no longer has the talent for taking a firm grasp of anything.

The bane of crab grass is that it requires mowing after the rest of the lawn may have succumbed peacefully to drought.

And the trouble with brussels sprouts is that somebody has to eat them.

That closes the case. Let such a selected extermination proceed.

Mrs. Gandhi's Big Moment

Those who doubted if a woman could manage the affairs of India had better keep quiet what she is doing or not Mrs. Gandhi is running the most successful and, so far, successful power-political operation since Khrushchev and the United States decided to speculate rather than operators on the big power stage.

What she wants, and seems to have every chance of getting, is an end once for all to that balance of power on the Indian subcontinent which existed since the end of British rule. That balance of power took the form of a Pakistan which occupied both northern and southern India. It was a pair of Muslim powers capable of ousting Hindu India. Mrs. Gandhi is out to break the link between the two arms of the Muslim pliers.

That link exists today in the form of three divisions of troops from West Pakistan which were flown to East Pakistan last spring in an effort to subsidize the separatist movement there. Mrs. Gandhi has turned that deployment into one of the great mistakes of the time. She has mousetrapped those three divisions between a local native guerrilla army (which she trained and armed in India) of about 100,000 men, and eight-to-10 divisions of the regular Indian Army.

The three Pakistani divisions are now being squeezed in a combined guerrilla plus Indian Army operation out of the countryside and into the main cities of East Pakistan. And India has control of the air and sea lanes which feed those cities and even the sea lanes.

If he refuses, he loses East Pakistan and his three divisions. If he accepts he still loses East Pakistan for she, not he, will be able to shape what happens next in Bengal.

The final test of Mrs. Gandhi's skill in power politics is whether she can, and will, now help Yahya Kahn get out of the trap of his own making. If she pursues her advantage too fast, hard, and openly she will force him to a desperate final throw of the military dice. And that would be very dangerous for all concerned. If she now opens the hand of magnanimity and lets the man save face, she will have what she wants — a dominant India on the subcontinent — and a unitary Pakistan which is not forever a mortal enemy of India. Meanwhile, Mrs. Gandhi has confounded what several women prophets before (Elizabeth I, Maria Theresa, Catherine the Great, and Victoria) that a woman can often outplay a man at power politics. — CHRISTIAN SCIENCE MONITOR.

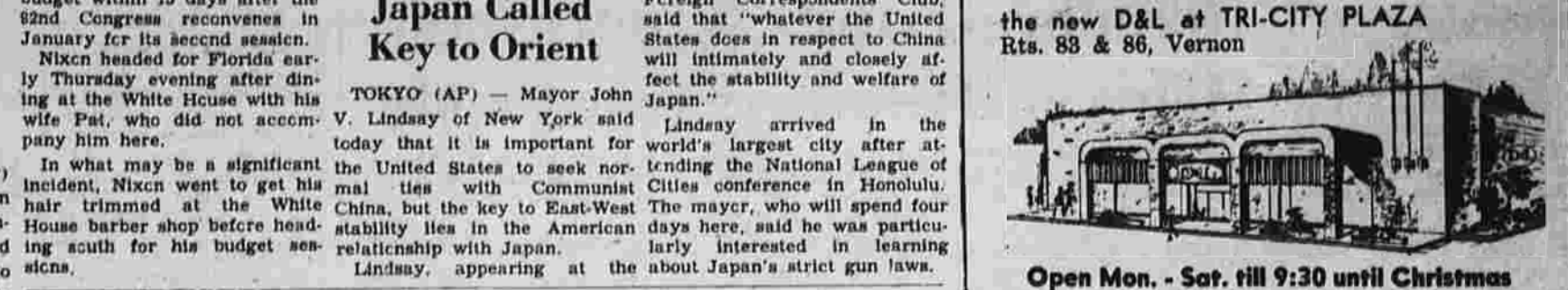

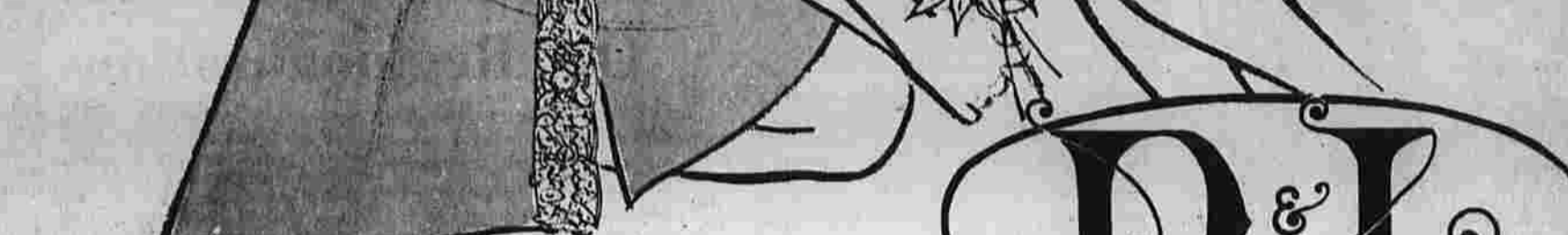

Democrats have selected incumbent Mrs. John Caglianelli for the Board of Welfare and Ronald Baker for the Economic Development Commission. The Democratic Town Committee has not yet named anyone for the Board of Health.

Constables are also to be appointed Monday night with the Democratic choices Charles Bradley, Fred Blaisdell, George Bolduc Jr. and Miss Michelle Cloutier. The GOP choices are Dolan Foster, George Favore and Matthew Sitaro.

Both town committees have named new members, with the GOP simply adding to its membership by electing Robert Keller, Mrs. K. King and Mrs. Jane Monast and Franklin King.

The Democrats have filled two vacancies by electing Fred Contessa and James Curry to the Town Committee.

Republican Paul Diehl has been endorsed by the town committee for the post of deputy sheriff, with the actual appointment to be made by Tolland County Sheriff Paul Sweney.

The GOP Town Committee, according to chairman Leonard Benjamin, is preparing for a reorganization of all committees and for this purpose all members will be contacted within the following month.

Benjamin asks that any town committee member wishing to serve on a particular committee get in touch with either him or the vice chairman, Mrs. Milton Carr.

The town committee is also preparing for the nomination and election to be held early next year. At this caucus, any registered Republican in the town may be elected to a seat on the Town Committee.

"It is the hope of the Committee," said Benjamin, "that any registered Republican who wishes to serve will come forward before the caucus and place his name on the ballot."

Nate Stands Chance To Run Nixon Drive

By SOL R. COHEN (Herald Reporter)

State Comptroller Nathan Agostinelli of Manchester stands a better than even chance to be Connecticut campaign manager for President Richard Nixon, when the latter announces his candidacy for re-election.

Agostinelli, considered the front-runner for leading the statewide Nixon organization, would say only today, "I certainly would accept the appointment if it were offered me. One of the greatest honors a man can receive is to represent the President of the United States in his home state." He declined further comment.

Reports are that Agostinelli's name has been cleared by the national Nixon organization in Washington and that he soon will be interviewed by White House representatives.

Agostinelli is no stranger to President Nixon. On Oct. 12, 1970, during the President's visit to Hartford, Agostinelli tore a national flag from the grasp of a demonstrator and stomped upon it, only minutes after Nixon had entered the Hartford Hilton Hotel. The incident was reported in newspapers coast-to-coast.

Nixon, prior to leaving the hotel, sought out Agostinelli, shook his hand and thanked him for his action. Later, he sent Agostinelli a presidential citation.

Another person being mentioned for the campaign manager post is Lewis (Chip) Drew, executive director of the GOP State Central Committee.

Agostinelli, who lives in Bloomfield, was campaign manager for Gov. Thomas Meskill last year.

He said today that he too could accept the appointment if offered. Agostinelli, 25, said that several other names were submitted to the White House by Gov. Meskill. State GOP Chairman J. Brian Gaffney and the Republican State Central Committee. He declined to reveal the names.

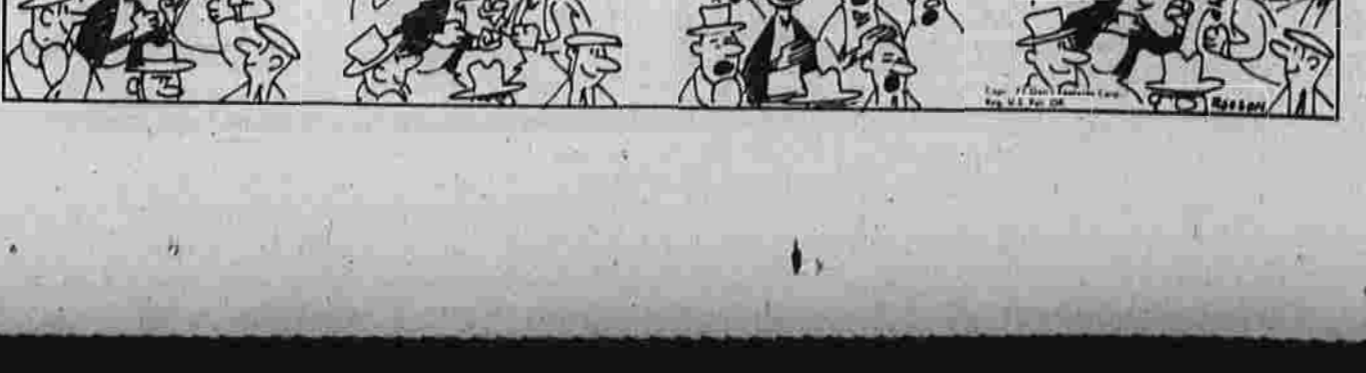
