
This could have been settled peaceful-last year if Pakistan President Yahya Khan had accepted the rules of democ-racy. In the first free election in the ountry's 24 years, East Pakistan voted overwhelmingly for the Awami League, which was committed to autonomy for the region. Yahya Kahn however is a military man, which is to say that his in-telligence could be contained in the liver of a flea. He canceled the election re-sults, arrested the head of the Awami eague (whom he later declared guilty on the day his treason trial started), and began the systematic slaughter of those East Pakistanis who objected.

The Americans, who have been giving a lot of jaw action to notions about selfstermination of nations, looked the othwanted self-determination. In fact, at the same time that Yahya Kahn's men were killing East Pakistanis by the tens of thousands, Henry Kissinger was using West Pakistan as his symbolic take-off point for his first visit to Peking. Setting aside the racism involved in the American reaction, it appears that we again felt more confortable with a strongarm military dictator than someone who won a free election, and we kept up the shipment of arms to Yahya Kahn until only a month ago. Those guns killed Ben-

But India isn't entirely clean in this natter either. It is true that the influx of 10,000,000 refugees is an intolerable bur-den. But what India has launched is the quivalent of a "protective reaction trike; the fact that it has been launched by a woman, the daughter of Nehru, and someone bearing the name Gandhi only adds to the ironies. India has to sell the proposition that a nation can protect its territorial integrity by invading the country beside her.

Even this would be cynically understandable if India had not maintained for so long a smug potision of maintained for so long a smug potision of moral superiority about the actions of the major powers. In the crunch, India responded the way the super powers respond: shoot, kill, maim, destroy, bomb, and invade. So much for placing one's faith in the Third World.
