

Nothing in all Connecticut's history as the Land of Steady Habits has done so steady as its abrupt decision, in the last session of the Legis'ature, under the leadership of an otherwise conservatively-inclined Governor, to go in for all kinds of legalized gambling.

As we approach the supposedly enticing day when we will all be able to orighten our humdrum existences with the state-blessed investigation of the possibilities of getting something for nothing, we find ourselves pretty much confused about what we consider good or bad, moral or immoral, Will it, for nstance, be good if so many people who can't afford it gamble so heavily that the state has an easier time paying off its deficits?

Quite obviously, it is going to be a new kind of day for Connecticut, and how we are all going to face into it is a matter for individual and for organizational and institutional con-

In such a situation, it would be preamptuous for anyone to try to prescribe rules and standards for others. But it should still be permitted to have

#### All The Glass Houses

We doubt that anybody officially involved in foreign policy either in the United States or in India has been so gifted as to see themselves as the others might be seeing them. It looks, in fact, as if it might be a

rather classic case of pot and kettle. The terms Indian politicians might have used, any time over the past five years, to give their appraisal of American conduct in Vietnam, might very well be the very same terms which would express the current United States condemnation of India's behavior in Bengal.

There is a further supposition which looks valid. It is that India, describing the United States operation in Vietnam, would not see the faintest reason for admitting that its own operation in East Pakistan has been something similar. And it is that the United States, condemning India for what it has been doing in East Pakistan, does not admit the

slightest similarity between that situation and its own situation in Vietnam. There is a beautifully convenient one way vision which comes to the aid of

statesmen who might otherwise be subject to the confusions of principle and Thus, we have no hesitancy at all in

believing that the very fine, honorable and intelligent gentleman who is our Secretary of State, William P. Rogers, could issue his warning to the United Nations, over the weekend,-his warning being that it had better prove its capacity to bring peace in India if it were to justify its own existence-without experiencing the alightest em-barrassment of a thought that perhaps the inability of the United Nations to get India to submit to its jurisdiction in East Pakistan resulted, in some part, from

the previous refusal of the United States to submit its own role in Vietnam to the judgment of the world organization. We all live in glass houses, but not, as our conduct keeps revealing, in that one big glass house down on the East River.

#### One Gift Survives

We hope the war between India and Pakistan ends before we have any further opportunity to notice one great convenience it offers our own news and television coverage.

The convenience is that the statesmen can explain their claims and the generals can expound their tactics and their victories in perfect English, so that no translation is necessary, and so, in fact, that the language from the war we hear on television is even more clearly enunciated than it might be if it were coming from some of our own co-And this is, of all the influences the

British Empire once thought it was bringing benevolently to bear on this great burden of a sub-continent, at least one influence which has lasted through a quarter century of freedom The people of the sub-continent have forgotten how to live together; they have forgotten and trampled on their own mutual interest; they have washed British democracy right out of their living; but they still educate themselves to speak the British language so that, even when they have to conduct a war against one another, they can do it in a common tongue.

"You are forgetting something when you ask that question," Cosell said. "You are forgetting that I am a trained lawyer - that I took courses in journalism and communications and that people are my main interest.

"I have been trained to interrogate, which is why my interviews are so good. Journalism has never been a popularity contest and sports broadcasting shouldn't be either. I am doing the best job of anybody in the business. I have it made with minority groups and educated people. They love me.

"I have strong opinions, so I provoke mixed emotions. But I am being noticed and I am being listened to. Yet I think I might someday like to leave sports and come a full-time actor. "Even now my career is beginning to take new forms. Woody Allen asked me

to appear with him in "Bananas" and I did. Someday I hope to have my own talk show out of sports. I am appearing with Dean Martin shortly and there is a very good chance I will play a detective soon in a Hollywood movie. And get this; Don Rickles wants me." 'I never wanted to be a lawyer in the
