Vice Adm. Muzaffair Hasan under whose command the navy took a severe beating in the two-week war with India, was replaced by Commodore Hafiz Ahmad.



## A New Secretary General

After the successful passage of his Council, the new Secretary General for the United Nations, Kurt Waldheim of Austria, said this:

"I have concrete and firm ideas about the office of the Secretary General and how I am going to deal with it. The United Nations has to be used as an instrument of peace." That seemingly strong and forceful

statement was accompanied, in the news, by speculative writing to the effect that Russia had been for Waldheim, all along, because Moscow has "traditionally been opposed to a strong Secretary General." Such interpretative reporting as is be-

ing done on the character of the new ingly more concerned with the smooth reservation of traditions and pro-

But, on the other hand, the new Secretary General has, on occasion, taken a stand on principle and proved obstinate and obdurate. And he has, apparently, been his own successful campaign manager in his quest of the United Nations ost he has now won — a circumstance which would not make it too surprising if, having won the post, he should set about defending and perhaps expanding its powers and prestige.

The latest change in the post of Secretary General raises the question of how

or on the development of such a world organization. Trygve Lie, the first Secretary General, was strong and positive, and incurred the enmity of Russia for being so. Dag Hammarskjold, his successor, also worked at expanding the power and prestige of the United Nations, and himself died in the course of such expanded functioning, when he was acting as a sort of commander in chief for the United Nations forces fighting what might have been defined as a civil war in the newly freed Congo.

The decline in United Nations power and prestige which followed was certainly attributable to no single cause. The fact that power and prestige had been injudiciously applied to a legalistically debatable operation in the Congo may have been one cause. And the big nations of the world were all recovering enough from the experience of World War II to begin feeling their power politics oats once again. But in such a situation, the choice of

Mr. Thant as Secretary General seemed to reflect the intention of the great powers to have in office an executive whose initiative or personal prestige they did not need to fear. They were lamentably, quite right. Secretary General Thant eventually found himself and his concept of his office on a collision course with the foreign policy interests of the United States in Vietnam - and he was bounced back flat on his back every time he tried to show the blue flag and his idea of what it stood for to

One need not question the sincerity of Kurt Waldheim's opinion that "the United Nations has to be used as an instrument of peace." It remains to be seen whether he is going to be able to bring to his office any personal weight or influence which could reverse the downward slip of the world organization, and the dwindling respect of the big powers for it,

#### Some New Approaches

In a recent spot check, the Depart-ment of Motor Vehicles discovered that one out of ten drivers that were stopped were driving without a license in force, or after a license had been revoked or suspended. This may have been an untypical result, but it does point up the idea that drivers are paying little heed

About 25 per cent of the drivers who did not have a license in force simply had not bothered to get a license, and the other 75 per cent was under suspension or revocation. Although this particular test did not turn up any, the Department of Motor Vehicles also knows that individuals are driving with phony li-censes, many of them "manufactured"

There are, in short, serious problem

in this area. Judges should realize that for many, suspension of a license is not an enforceable punishment, and hence should rely on fines to make sure that there really is a deterrent. It should also be realized that Connecticut's long adherence in the past to a system of automatic suspension has bred widespread disrespect for the law in this area, and indeed this is always what happens when police attempt to enforce a law that is not supported by the populace. Responding to this state of facts, the Motor Vehicles Commission, under its new and innovatively-minded commissioner, Robert C. Leubs, has started an prepared which seeks to persuade drunk drivers to either not drive in that condi-

tion, or have someone else drive them if they are. Those who are in the pro-gram have been offered a choice: Take the course and face a license suspension of three months, or take a year's suspen-

The program has already been tried in Arizona and results are being reported as effective. Commissioner Leuba is also known to be toying with the idea of a limited suspension program for some types of offense. Motorists would be allowed to drive to work and back from work if their license was suspended, but they could not drive for any other pur-pose. The theory behind this concept is that it might be self-enforceable, be-cause it seems more reasonable.

It is not yet clear that either the drunk driving program, or the limited suspen-sion concept (which has not yet been tried in this state) will work or not. But it seems a good idea to keep searching for solutions, especially when the draw-backs to the present systems are so well known. — MIDDLETOWN PRESS.



#### **IAUNTY SNOWMEN**

1 cup (2 sticks) butter, softened 1/2 cup sifted confectioners sugar

1 cup quick or old fashioned oats, uncooked

2 teaspoons vanilla 2 cups sifted all-purpose flour

2-2/3 cups sifted confectioners sugar 3 tablespoons milk 2-1/2 cups flaked or shredded coconut

1/2 teaspoon salt

Shape dough into balls, making eight bases about 1-1/2 inches in diameter, eight bodies 1-1/4 inches eight heads 1 inch and sixteen arms 1/2 inch. Place on cookie sheet in preheated slow oven (325°F). Bake small balls 15 to 20 minutes and larger balls 30 to 35 minutes. Cool.

#### RAINBOW SPRITZ

in a mixing bowl cream 1 cup (2 sticks) butter; gradually add 1/2 cup sugar and beat until light and fluffy. Beat in 1 agg and 1/2 teaspeen almost extract. Gradually blend in 2-1/4 cups sifted all-purpose flour. Divide dough into three parts. To one part, add red feed caler to tint to desired color. To second part, add green feed color to tint to desired color. Leave third part plain. Fill cookie press and form into desired shapes, Decorate with colored candles. Bake in preheated moderate oven (350°F.) 8 to 10 minutes. Remove to wire rack to cool. Makes about 4 dezen.

#### YULETIDE IEWELS

1 cup (2 sticks) butter Two 3-oz. pkg. cream cheese, soft teaspoon vanilla

1 cup quick or old fashloned oats, uncooked

I cup sifted all-purpose flour Best butter and cream cheese together until creamy. Blend in vanilla. Add flour to creamed mixture, mixing well. Stir in eats. Chill dough about 1 hour. Roll out on lightly floured board or canvas to 1/8-inch thickness. Cut with floured 2-inch decorative cutter. Using a smaller cutter or a sharp knife, cut a small design in center of half of cookies. Put plain cut-outs on cookie sheets. Put a dab of preserves on center of each; cover with designed cookie. Gently press down on designed cookie to seal. Bake in preheated moderate oven (350°FJ about 20 minutes or until a delicate golden brown. Makes 3-1/2 dezen.

#### FROSTY-TOP CHOCOLATE BARS

1/4 cup (1/2 stick) butter 1/2 cup firmly packed light brown suga

1/4 teaspoon salt 3/4 cup quick or old fashioned oats, uncooked

1/2 cup finely chopped dates 1 cup (6-oz. pkg.) semi-sweet chocolate pieces 1/2 cup finely chopped nuts

1/2 cup + 2 teaspoons sifted all-purpose flour

In a mixing bowl cream butter; gradually add brown sugar and beat until light and fluffy. Add egg yolk, milk and vanilla. Sift together 1/2 cup flour, baking soda and salt. Add to creamed mixture. Stir in oats. Spread evenly in buttered 8-inch square baking pan. Toss dates in 2 teaspoons flour; add to chocolate pleces and nuts. Sprinkle over dough in pan. Bake in preheated moderate oven (350°F.) 20 minutes. Beat egg white to soft peaks. Gradually beat in 1/4 cup sugar until stiff peaks form. Remove cookies from oven. Increase oven temperature to hot (400°F.). Spread softened chocolate evenly over cookie base. Spread meringue over chocolate filling. Bake 15 minutes or until meringue is lightly brown. Cool and cut into bars. Makes 2 dezes.

Place in 13x9-inch baking pan. Cover and refrigerate several hours or overnight. To heat, place in preheated slow oven (325°F.) about 1 hour or until piping hot. While meat balls are heating prepare sauce. Melt butter in saucepan over low heat. Blend in flour and salt. Quickly add milk, stirring constantly. ## Crime in Labor Best Cut Early, Lawman Testifies

A R T F O R D (AP) —

A New Jersey criminal investigator says the best time to stop labor racketeers is before they begin to operate at construction sites.

Andrew Phelan, executive director of the New Jersey Commission on Investigation, said that once a project is under way, a corrupt union has such power to delay construction and cause costs to skyrocket that a contractor almost has to pay off to keep things moving.

Phelan testified Wednesday before the legislature's State and Urban Development Committee.
