





Scoop The Snoopers Missed Although he was obviously engaged on serious national business, one had to suspect that President Nixon, the other night, was enjoying one part of his performance tremendously.

He was, for good purposes of his own, disclosing some rather choice governmental secrets no outside sleuths or inside dissidents had been able to steal or publish before he himself got ready to divulge them.

The secrets he had to divulge - not only secret propositions made to Hanoi -were of a high and juicy order.

All the amateur and professional snoopers of the Washington scene will wonder how in the world Dr. Kissinger could have made as many as 12 secret trips to Paris when it was always obvisome policy meeting in Washington or squiring some glamorous lady to an evening in New York.

The President himself, obviously de lighting in the opportunity, divulged one angle of the secret by openly thanking President Pompidou of France for his cooperation in Dr. Kissinger's secret journeys.

But the main point was that the snoopers didn't know everything that was going on, after all, not by a long shot.
